 Creation of relevant and engaging project group work and assignments through innovative pedagogy.


 Creating a sense of 'connectedness' in Film Studies (Whitby, T. & Stephen W. Anderson, 2014)



Building a Community: Assessment

In Class Dynamics

- Creating 'Real world' scenarios directly connected to the learning outcomes.
- Developing good in class dynamics, task specific and 'pressured' group work assessments.
- Assessing Film Studies students on location and under pressure.




Building a Community: Assessment

Example: Night shoot Assignme for FLM2025 'Cinematography'

•Located on University Square outside QFT

- •Multiple elements of assessment such as crowd control, actors, safety, cinematography, lighting at night and success of recorded scene.
- •Timed and with tutor scoring progress throughout, creates pressure valve
- •Directly connected to learning outcomes and industry practice



Building a Community: Assessment

Context:


- Schedule changed to Sem. 1
- •Class time 3-6pm
- Dark for 2nd half of class
- Studio based and easy access to equipment
- •Use of social media encouraged



Building a Community: Assessment

How does it build community?


- High profile location draws attention with crowds watching after 5pm
- Problem solving in a very visible and dynamic way to increase the sense of realism in their group work
- •Students can imagine working on a professional film set and get to 'demonstrate' their specialist skills in



Building a Community: Assessment

How does it build community?

- •Use of social media by students to share the experience creates legacy Getting to demonstrate specialists skills in public adds to communal experience for students
- Controlled high pressure group work helps foster greater collegial bond
- •Builds confidence and pride in own discipline and capabilities Students often debrief informally

Using Audio feedback

- To enhance the student learning experience
- To explore ways of improving feedback scores in line with university thinking
- To connect with students through technology and familiar mediums
- •To improve feedback 'take up'
