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THESIS

Introduction:

Libby in Limbo is a scripted narrative podcast that follows Libby as she moves back to her small hometown, gets a job as a librarian, and learns to navigate life in a small, tight-knit community. This podcast will serve two main purposes: to create entertainment media about a library that does not promote harmful stereotypes about libraries and to create awareness and accessibility of scripted podcasts.

Media, specifically entertainment media, has fostered many stereotypes about libraries. Unfortunately, the majority of these stereotypes are wrong and tend to dissuade people from visiting libraries. Because knowledge and learning are crucial to the development of individuals and societies, libraries are vitally important. By causing people to both consciously and subconsciously believe and spread stereotypes about libraries, media causes libraries to be underutilized and neglected. Libraries provide a unique opportunity to grow and learn. However, stereotypes of libraries harmfully affect the frequency with which people patron the library.

While there are many true stereotypes of libraries, such as passports to adventure and treasure troves of knowledge, there are also many false stereotypes of libraries. Two such stereotypes are that libraries are quiet and that libraries are boring. Libraries are far from quiet. Libraries are a place to socialize and visit with the community. There may be rooms set aside for quiet work, reading, and study, but the primary hub of the library should be a place to socialize and become invested in the community. Libraries are one of the last places in America where people from every race, religion, culture, economic status, and background can gather for the same purpose: to learn. The content of a library does not change depending on the person. The same information is available to everyone for free. Because of this, libraries are a melting pot of personalities and ideas. This makes a library the perfect place to create friendships with people from many different backgrounds and to learn from each other, not just from the materials offered by the library. Another stereotype is that libraries are boring. This is a vastly believed cliche and is completely false. Libraries offer books, audiobooks, DVDs, eBooks, computer access, Wi-Fi, a multitude of educational classes, and more. All of these things are free. The library should never be considered a boring establishment.

So, if libraries are not quiet and boring then what are they? Libraries are educational. Libraries are a prime source of information for anything from researching to learning a new skill. The human brain needs to be constantly learning. The brain is like a muscle. It needs to be continuously used or it will not work as well as intended. People use gyms to strengthen their muscles. Likewise, libraries exist to strengthen the brain. If muscles are not used and exercised, they stop working altogether. The same is true for the brain. It needs to be used and exercised, and reading is a primary way of accomplishing this. Libraries are arsenals. It has often been said that the pen is mightier than a sword. Knowledge is power. Therefore, a library is the greatest arsenal one could have. From Shakespearean insults to how to survive an apocalypse, a library

can prepare one for any event. Lastly, libraries are treasure troves. They are magic portals leading to different worlds. There are no boundaries when reading. One can travel the world and not spend a penny. One can experience as much wonder as one has imagination.

Libby in Limbo is created to stymic common stereotypes and challenge preconceived ideas about libraries. Because *Libby in Limbo* a situational comedy, not all elements of the library depicted will be completely accurate to the functioning of a typical library. However, each story is based on actual events. While details may be exaggerated at times, *Libby in Limbo* stays true to the values of a library. Negative stereotypes have been intentionally avoided in the production of this podcast.

The second purpose *Libby in Limbo* will serve is to create awareness and accessibility of scripted podcasts. *Libby in Limbo* will adhere to a sit-com-style storyline. Most scripted podcasts are either drama, action, or adventure. Additionally, scripted podcasts generally have some sort of cost associated with them. There are only a very few scripted podcasts available for free.

Traditional nonfiction podcasts and scripted fictional podcasts appeal to two very different audiences, therefore traditional podcasts should not be considered a competitor for scripted podcasts. The top competitor for scripted podcasts is audiobooks. Scripted podcasts are superior to audiobooks in several respects. Scripted podcasts are, by nature, written as easy-to-consume, bite-sized segments. They are perfect for those who only have the time or the attention span for a small portion of a story. Where audiobooks have chapters that make up a larger story, scripted podcasts have episodes that make up a larger story. The difference between these two styles of storytelling is that each episode of a scripted podcast has a clear beginning, middle, and end. Each episode is its own story, as well as being part of a larger story. Chapters in an audiobook, on the other hand, do not have that same sense of completion or firm stopping place.

Moriah Hall's love of storytelling and audio production sparked the creation of this podcast. As an aspiring audio editor, Hall is excited to work on a major project like *Libby in Limbo* to demonstrate and cultivate her audio recording and editing skills. Hall's experience working in a small-town public library for four years inspired her to create a serial narrative located in a library setting. From the kitten Hall and her co-workers raised in the library to a drug bust in the magazine section, there was always something interesting going on in Hall's library. She loves both libraries and scripted podcasts and desires to share that love with others.

Literature Review:

Many scripted podcasts guided the creation of Libby in Limbo:

The Unexplained Disappearance of Mars Patel – Key Element: Dialogue

The Unexplained Disappearance of Mars Patel uses dialogue as the primary method of introducing the characters' personalities and giving listeners the backstory of the situations. The pacing of the dialogue, the unique voices of the characters, and the world-building sound effects make this podcast a great example of what a scripted podcast should look like. *Libby in Limbo* will emulate these three elements.

The Far Meridian - Key Element: Sound Design

The Far Meridian takes place in numerous different locations. The sound design does a great job of creating space in the room and demonstrating the environment around the characters. While *Libby in Limbo* will not incorporate as many settings, the sound design should still enable the listeners to visualize the room and where the characters are located in the room.

Six Minutes – Key Element: Episode Length and Music

Six Minutes is a prime example of a scripted podcast with short episodes. Not counting credits, ads, and an introduction, each episode is approximately six minutes long. Additionally, the editors do a great job creating the world with sound effects and incorporating music to add to the drama. *Libby in Limbo* will have a short run-time and use the same world-building sound effects and music techniques.

The Bright Sessions - Key Element: Dialogue

The Bright Sessions uses dialogue and conversation to drive the story. The conversations are very natural and utilize silence to evoke emotion. The unique personality of each character is also portrayed very well. *Libby in Limbo* will similarly be dialogue driven which will help carry the story.

Geek by Night – Key Element: Introduction and Exposition

The first scene in *Geek by Night* is a first-person narrative that gives the listeners a quick backstory to orient the listeners. The same technique will be used in *Libby in Limbo* to summarize a large part of Libby's backstory.

Various Sitcom TV Shows – Key Element: Humor

Libby in Limbo will be written as a sitcom. However, since there are no scripted podcasts that are primarily written as a sitcom, the closest comparisons are TV shows like *The Office, Community, Brooklyn Nine-Nine, Superstore, New Girl,* and *AP Bio.*

Methodology:

Libby in Limbo was completed in three stages: pre-production, production, and postproduction.

Pre-production began on January 17, 2023. The first step of production was creating the storyline and characters. This step required the most amount of time since it involved a lot of brainstorming, refining, and development. The second step was creating the production plan which includes all the details for the podcast such as a detailed project description, character descriptions, precedents, technical information, and distribution plans. Then the script was written. The preliminary draft was written by Moriah Hall using Celtx. Then, she sent the script to Zac Overbay, a Media and Communications student at ETSU with a talent for writing comedic scripts, to assist with adding to the humor of the show. An artist on Instagram, @kylobedrawing, was recruited to create art for the show. Lastly, casting calls were made and recording dates were scheduled.

Production began as soon as pre-production ended. *Libby in Limbo* was recorded in Warf-Pickel Hall, Audio Suite 101 on the ETSU campus. The equipment included two Shure SM7B Microphones and a Behringer X32 Compact Soundboard. Additional audio suites were available, as well as portable recording options for if the Audio Suite 101 did not function or if an actor needed the recording equipment to travel to them. Sound effects were recorded using a Zoom F6 Field Kit from ETSU's RTVF Department's Equipment Room. Techniques for media management and storage included clear labeling, ETSU's RTVF Department's Nexus server, and a Seagate Portable External Hard Drive.

Postproduction, arguably the hardest part of the podcast, was accomplished under a very intense time crunch. The first part of postproduction was the editing of the podcast. Pro Tools was the primary editing software used for Libby in Limbo. Adobe Premiere Pro was used to create the trailer for the podcast which was then posted to YouTube. *Libby in Limbo* was exported in .wav and .mp3 formats.

The second part of postproduction was publication and promotion. *Libby in Limbo* is publicly accessible on SoundCloud, Apple Podcasts, and Spotify. Rss.com was used to create an RSS feed for the podcast. *Libby in Limbo* is also posted on <u>https://libbyinlimbo.wixsite.com/home</u>. This website will create a relationship with the audience. The website includes information such as transcripts, notes, reviews, behind-the-scenes, photos, and information on how to donate to the podcast. Transcripts are especially important because they provide accessibility for deaf and hearing-impaired communities and those with auditory processing issues. An Instagram account and audio trailer were also created for advertising purposes. To build an audience and increase listeners, websites, show notes, transcripts, trailers, interviews, and social media will be used to promote the podcast's content. Canva will be the primary source of promotional material such as flyers and posts for the Instagram account and website.

Discussion:

While the first two episodes of *Libby in Limbo* may be completed, there is still much work to be done before this project is completed. The accompanying production plan includes an outline for the rest of season one and a second season. Season one consists of ten episodes, so eight more episodes will be produced. Outlines of each of these episodes exist, all that remains is to turn these outlines into a completed script, record, edit, and publish the episodes. Additionally, season two is in its first stages of pre-production. The pitch is awaiting funding which will be acquired with a focus on the promotion of *Libby in Limbo*. More posts and behind-the-scenes content will be generated and posted to both Instagram and the website. A Patreon account will also be created to support the creation of season two.

One podcast is not enough to make people aware of the harm done to libraries by misguided stereotypes. Work will be done to create a larger community of people who are aware of this issue and can spark awareness in others. *Libby in Limbo*'s following will be the best way to begin this spread of awareness. A few non-fiction episodes with real librarians will be created between season one and season two to address and discuss the negative impact that stereotypes can have on libraries and the importance of having an accurate representation of libraries in the media.

While Libby in Limbo is a show created for entertainment, it has the potential to affect communities by creating novelty around a place assumed to be boring. This will bring more people into libraries which leads to more funding which will generate communities in which knowledge is not limited to those who can afford formal education. These communities will be filled with people who are intelligent and enjoy learning. Libraries will not be ignored or overlooked. Instead, libraries will be valued and viewed as a landmark everyone should visit regularly.

Title:

Libby in Limbo

Log Line:

When Libby moves back to her hometown in Limbo, Wisconsin and gets a job as a librarian, she must learn to navigate life in a small, tight-knit community.

Short Project Description:

This show takes place in Limbo, Wisconsin, a small town in the middle of nowhere in modernday USA. Libby moved out of Limbo as soon as she could. Now, after earning an Interdisciplinary Social Science degree at New York University in New York City and failing to find a job, Libby's fiancé broke up with her. Now she has no place to live and no money, forcing her to move back in with her parents. The only job she can find is at the local public library. Limbo is as bland as a small town in Wisconsin can be. Libby despises living in Limbo, but she will soon figure out that it isn't the town itself, but the people that make Limbo special. Over the course of the season, she makes new friends, sees old friends, and adjusts to her new life. Libby realizes that life in a small town is not all bad, and there can be beauty even in things she doesn't initially like.

Long Project Description:

Characters:

Since Libby in Limbo is consumed audibly and not visually, listeners will imagine their own unique image of the characters' physical attributes. The emotional image is the only part of the characters that will be shared.

Elizabeth (Libby), 24, is a sweet girl who is a bit bitter at first, so she keeps to herself but as she gets to know her co-workers more, she loosens up and they get to see her funny and more carefree side.

Simon, 26, is a nerdy guy who is very tech-savvy. He is the media and technology librarian and very smart, almost to the point where others have a hard time relating to him. He is very nice unless you try to prove him wrong. Simon has a crush on Libby and has a love-hate relationship with Josie.

Josie, 27, is very sweet and soft-spoken. She is the children's librarian and will do anything to help anyone out. Josie loves her job and loves working with children. She has a love-hate

relationship with Simon and serves as a best friend and source of exposition for both Libby and the listener.

Willow, 36, is the library director. She will not shut up about her crystal collection, and her entire personality is based on her zodiac sign, which is Aquarius.

Agnes, 83, is an old and bitter librarian. She is always in a bad mood, against any kind of change, and always looking for a reason to be upset. She hates everyone, and everyone hates her.

Deborah (Debbie), 48, is Libby's mom. She is the voice of reason in Libby's life and an exposition device for the listener.

Episode Synopsis:

Each episode will be 10 minutes long. Each season will be 10 episodes long. Episode titles will be book titles. The podcast will be written as a sitcom, utilizing relatable emotions and reactions from the characters. The season will be mostly episodic, with each episode functioning almost as a stand-alone episode. Although, there will be some common themes and stories, as well as gradual character development and reoccurring characters throughout the season.

Episode One: Pilot: The Odyssey

The first episode opens with Libby explaining why she moved back to Limbo and got a job at the library. As Libby gets introduced to her new co-workers, so does the audience. Agnes is introduced as the season's antagonist. Also, the audience is introduced to Simon, Libby's co-worker who immediately develops a crush on Libby.

Episode Two: Cat in the Hat

While reading a book about cats during story time, Josie has all the kids meowing like cats. Suddenly, she hears a real meow. She finds a kitten outside and tries to hide it, but Libby and Simon discover the kitten. They try to hide the kitten from Agnes because if Agnes finds out, she will tell the library board. The kitten is eventually discovered, and they have to send it away. A nice family with little kids who are regulars at the library takes it home, saving it from the shelter.

Episode Three: Fahrenheit 451

A fire burns down a library in a neighboring town, so the library board mandates training for all librarians. Two firemen come to the library to train the librarians on how to use the fire extinguishers and run through the fire code. One of the firemen is Libby's high school crush, Ralph. She spends the episode flirting and not learning, which becomes a problem when a fire starts in the staff breakroom.

Episode Four: Crime and Punishment

The police station refuses to respond to any of the calls the library makes to report unruly patrons. The librarians see all the patrol cars across the street at the community center. They send Libby and Simon over as spies to see why the police are at the community center instead of responding to the librarians' calls. Libby sees a staff breakroom full of doughnuts and an officer eating one. She assumes that's why the officers are there, completely missing an arrest in the gym. Libby and Simon run into Ralph. There's miscommunication with the police, but it all gets worked out in the end.

Episode Five: Of Mice and Men

There's a mouse infestation. The librarians try everything to get rid of them. Libby is tasked with getting rid of the mice. Nothing works. Simon knows (or pretends to know) a little about mice, so Libby enlists his help. She catches feelings for him.

Episode Six: Dracula

This episode will be Halloween themed.

Episode Seven: Les Misérables

The library board is doing its yearly inspection. Everything must be up to code so there is a lot of running around, hiding things, making sure everything is ship-shape. But patrons keep making messes. Agnes doesn't follow the correct procedures because "I've been doing it this way for the past 60 years." So, Libby has to fix what Agnes does to make it up to code. They pass the inspection but only after a lot of close calls.

Episode Eight: The Old Man and the Sea

Weird things keep happening seemingly while the library is closed. Libby spends the episode trying to find out why. Turns out someone has been living in the library.

Episode Nine: The Grapes of Wrath

A patron comes in and complains about everything. She claims she returned something that she now has a \$500 fine for. She sues the library, specifically Libby who delivered the news. This episode is a lot of interviews with the staff.

Episode Ten: The Death of Ivan Ilyich

Agnes dies. The librarians plan a memorial party. Simon is about to ask Libby out when Libby's ex-boyfriend from high school shows up. He's the new history teacher at the high school, and Libby realizes she still likes him.

Season Two:

The summer reading program creates new conflicts and dynamics in a library. The new 'villain' will include Libby's ex-boyfriend. The library board will also be a threat to the library as a whole with things like county budget cuts, etc. Libby will be fighting not only for herself but for her job.

Bios of Key Crew and Talent:

Moriah Hall – Moriah is a full-time student at ETSU with a major in Media and Communications and a minor in Radio-TV-Film. She enjoys editing audio and film and being on set during production. Her dream job is to be a freelance sound editor. She would love to work on podcasts and create one of her own. Until she can pursue freelance work full-time, she is eager to work in any capacity in production or post-production in the TV/Film/Radio field.

LIBBY Oh. Sorry. No...

SIMON But now I'm invested...How did you end up working *here*?

LIBBY That's a bit of a longer story...

THEME SONG TRANSITION

INT. DEBBIE'S HOUSE - BASEMENT - DAY

Libby's mom, Debbie, knocks on Libby's bedroom door.

LIBBY

Go away!

The door opens. Debbie walks in.

DEBBIE It's time to get up, Libby!

LIBBY

I don't want to.

DEBBIE

You've been in bed for a full two weeks. It's time to get up and do something!

LIBBY I have been doing stuff.

DEBBIE

All you've done is binge the same TV show you've been watching since high school.

LIBBY

I'm almost done with the seventeenth season...

DEBBIE You need something productive to do.

LIBBY

But-

DEBBIE

Seventeen seasons is sad. They should have ended with season five.

Libby groans in recognition of her mom being right.

DEBBIE

I've been looking in the Help Wanted page in the newspaper for you and-

LIBBY

I told you, I don't want to work here. I don't even want to be here right now!

DEBBIE Well where do you want to be?

LIBBY I want to be in New York. With Alan.

DEBBIE Oh sweetie! I know it hurts.

LIBBY

Do you mom? You and dad were high school sweethearts. I bet your heart has never been broken.

DEBBIE

I've had my fair share of broken hearts. And it breaks my heart to see some boy causing you this much pain.

LIBBY

He wasn't just some boy though. He was my fiancé. We were together for all four years of college. I was going to marry him.

DEBBIE I know. I know. It'll be ok.

LIBBY But I'm here.

DEBBIE

And what are you going to do about that?

Libby groans.

DEBBIE

Ok. Well, I'll just leave your breakfast and the newspaper here. I circled a job I thought you might be interested in.

Debbie sets down the dishes.

LIBBY Not again! I'm not interested in your job searching help!

DEBBIE If you're going to live here, you're going to need a job.

LIBBY

But the only jobs you can find for me are awful!

DEBBIE That dog walking one didn't look too bad.

LIBBY I'm allergic to dogs. DEBBIE Well, what about that job as a Spanish tutor?

LIBBY I haven't spoken Spanish since I had to take it in high school.

DEBBIE Fine, then don't apply. But at least look at the listing. It's the only circled in red.

Debbie walks out of room. Libby groans, rolls over, and opens newspaper.

LIBBY (under her breath, mocking, scoffing) It's the one circled in red. Let's see what job she found this time...Wanted: Librarian. Knowledge of the alphabet required. Interpersonal skills prefered. Blah blah blah. Walk-in interviews welcome. (to herself, pondering) I guess I do need a job. And I can always quit. And who knows, it could be fun.

INT. DEBBIE'S HOUSE - KITCHEN - DAY

Libby walks upstairs and into the kitchen. Debbie is cooking breakfast.

DEBBIE Why hello there stranger! What brings you so far from your bedroom? And all dressed up too!

LIBBY I have a job interview.

DEBBIE Really? That's great sweetie! Where at?

LIBBY The library.

DEBBIE

Oh! I have some books I need to return! Can you take them for me? Also I have some books I was going to pick up too and-

LIBBY I'm already late, mom.

DEBBIE Well, at least say 'hi' to Josie for me!

LIBBY

Ok. Bye.

DEBBIE By sweetie! [door slams as Libby leaves] They grow up so fast...

INT. LIBRARY - MEETING ROOM - DAY

SFX: papers shuffling.

WILLOW

Well, your resume is quite interesting. New York University is very impressive. And you majored in Interdisciplinary Studies? What's that?

LIBBY

It's a combination of different classes with multiple concentrations. I studied a little bit of everything.

WILLOW

That's great...I'm sorry about your fiancé. We are one big family here in Limbo, so if you need anything, don't hesitate to let me know.

LIBBY

Right...Thank you? Um...how did you know about my fiancé...my ex?

WILLOW

Your mom told me. How is your mom? She hasn't been in since last week.

LIBBY She's fine... I guess she comes in here a lot. WILLOW Oh yes! She's one of our regulars! LIBBY Great... WILLOW I just have one last question for you. What's your star sign? LIBBY My what? WILLOW Your sign sign. I'm an Aquarius. LIBBY Oh. Um. I think I'm a Pisces? WILLOW Great! We'll get along just fine then. Welcome to Limbo Public Library! LIBBY I'm hired? WILLOW Of course! When can you start? LIBBY Well, I don't really have anything else going on, so I guess right now. WILLOW Perfect! Follow me. I'll introduce you

INT. LIBRARY - OFFICES - DAY

WILLOW Here is our break room. And here is Josie's office. Josie is our Children's librarian.

to the rest of the staff.

JOSIE Hi Willow! And hi Willow's friend! LIBBY

I'm Libby. Nice to meet you.

WILLOW Libby is our new assistant librarian. She's Debbie's kid.

JOSIE

Debbie? I love Debbie! She comes in all the time! How does she like that new series I recommended?

LIBBY

Um...I'm not sure...

JOSIE

No worries. I'll just ask her next time I see her. Nice to meet you, Libby! Glad to have you as part of the team!

LIBBY Glad to be here...I think.

WILLOW

Josie, can you introduce Libby to the rest of the staff? I have a meeting with the library board in a few minutes and I need to prepare. You know how they can be...

JOSIE

Say no more! Simon's office is right next to mine, so we can go say hi and-

SIMON

Did someone say my name?

JOSIE

Speak of the devil. Simon, this is Libby. Libby, Simon. Simon is our media and technology librarian.

LIBBY

Nice to meet you.

SIMON You're so pretty!

LIBBY

What?

SIMON

(clears throat) I mean...welcome! Mind if I take your picture for our social media?

LIBBY

Um...ok?

SIMON

(rambling) We only have sixteen followers between the various platforms, but I'm hoping to double those numbers by the end of the year. The first step is to create bio posts for all our staff. Oh, Agnes! There you are. I need your picture too!

AGNES

I don't want my picture plastered all over some face-gram or insta-book.

JOSIE

Actually it's...nevermind...

AGNES

You listen here new girl. You don't listen to a word these delinquents have to say. There's only one person who knows how things work around here, and that's me!

LIBBY

I'm Libby. It's nice to meet you.

AGNES

I know who you are. Your mom used to bring you in for story time. You were a biter, and you ate the books.

Two young boys run past shouting. Agnes runs after them.

AGNES Hey you! Stop running! And no yelling in the library!

SIMON That's Agnes. She's been here since the dawn of time, so Willow can't fire her without risking the wrath of the library board.

I remember her from when I was a kid. She used to scare me so much!

SIMON

She still has that affect on people. Just stay on her good side and you'll be fine.

JOSIE

Simon, can you go show Libby how to work the front desk. I have to finish preparing story time for next week. It's all about cats and -

SIMON Interesting...have fun with that. Come on, Libby.

SIMON'S VOICE FADES AND THEN COMES BACK IN A DIFFERENT SETTING

INT. LIBRARY - FRONT DESK - DAY

SIMON And that's how you do it! It's pretty simple actually.

LIBBY I think I've got it.

SIMON And if you don't remember you can always ask me for help.

LIBBY So is this what you do? Just sit at the front desk all day?

SIMON

Yeah pretty much. And hey, there's a good chance that we will have similar shifts, so we'll get to spend lots of time together.

LIBBY

Oh...cool...

AWKWARD PAUSE (whistle, awkward pause sounds)

SIMON So, what brought you to Limbo Public Library?

LIBBY

Well, it all began a few weeks ago. I had just graduated from New York University with a degree in Interdisciplinary Social Science, and I was living it up in NYC. I had an incredible job lined up at the American Museum of Natural History...

LIBBY'S VOICE FADES INTO THE THEME SONG

EPISODE TWO: CAT IN THE HAT

INT. LIBRARY - FRONT DESK - DAY

Libby is checking out books and printing the receipt.

LIBBY Your books will be due back in two weeks. Have a great day.

JOSIE Hey, Libby?

LIBBY Hi, Josie. What's in the box?

JOSIE Nothing. Hey, is that your tuna sandwich in the breakroom?

LIBBY

Yeah, why?

SFX: muffled CAT meow

LIBBY Josie? Was that a cat?

JOSIE

What?

SFX: muffled CAT meow

LIBBY That! Josie, do you have a cat in that box?

JOSIE Keep your voice down! Someone might hear you!

LIBBY

(loudly)

Simon!

SIMON

If you keep yelling like that, even Agnes will hear you...an then she'll be mad... LIBBY

I need you to take over the front desk for a minute.

SIMON Why? What's in the box?

JOSIE AND LIBBY

Nothing.

SFX: CAT meows

SIMON Did you hear that?

JOSIE Hear what?

SIMON (suspicious) What are you doing?

LIBBY Braiding eachother's hair and painting our nails. Girl stuff. I'll be back soon.

INT. LIBRARY - KITCHEN - DAY

SFX: door shutting

LIBBY Ok, Josie. What's going on. What's in the box?

JOSIE So you know how I had story-time this morning?

LIBBY

Yeah?

JOSIE Well, the theme was cats-

LIBBY What does this have to do with anything?

JOSIE If you give me a minute, I'll tell you! I had all the kids pretending to be cats so they were all meow-ing.

LIBBY I wondered what that racket was earlier. You'd think those kids had never heard a cat before.

JOSIE

(laughing)

I know, right! Anyways, after a few minutes I had the kids quiet down so we could keep reading. But someone kept meowing. It wasn't any of the kids, but we could all still hear a cat. We looked around the room for almost ten minutes and then we realized it was coming from the backdoor. So I opened it and...

LIBBY

And? And what?

SFX: box opening

JOSIE

I found this.

LIBBY

A kitten?

JOSIE I know! She's so cute!

LIBBY

Yeah, but it's a cat. We aren't supposed to have animals in the building.

JOSIE

I know. You can't tell anyone! At least not until I figure out what to do with her.

LIBBY You'd better figure it out fast. There's no way you can keep this hidden for long.

SFX: bang/knock on the door

JOSIE (whispering) What was that?

LIBBY

Shhh!

Libby opens the door and Simon falls in.

JOSIE Simon?! What are you doing?

LIBBY Where you eavesdropping?

SIMON No, I wasn't eavesdropping! I was just...uh...checking the door for...termites...

Simon knocks on the door.

SIMON See, termite free!

JOSIE What did you hear, Simon?

SIMON

Enough. And I want in. Hiding a cat from the others sounds exciting and today has been so boring.

LIBBY

There's no way we are letting you in on this.

SIMON

Why not?

LIBBY For starters, you can't keep a secret to save your life. You suck at lying.

SIMON

I do not!

LIBBY Yes, you do. Remember last Tuesday? INT. LIBRARY - OFFICES - DAY LIBBY Simon, is that the last lemon cookie? SIMON Yeah, I figured if it hadn't been eaten by now, no one wanted it. LIBBY Agnes wanted it. SIMON What? LIBBY Yeah, she called dibs earlier. Did you not see the note that said "Save for Agnes"? AGNES WHO ATE MY COOKIE! LIBBY You're in for it now...those are her favorite. AGNES Simon, did you eat that cookie? SIMON N-n-no... AGNES When I'm through with you, you'll wish you had never stepped foot in this library! And I'm calling your mother! INT. LIBRARY - KITCHEN - DAY LIBBY You suck at lying. So there is no way we can trust you to be in on this.

> SIMON Well, it's too late now. I already know. And if you don't let me help, I'll just tell Willow myself.

SFX BACK TO PRESENT

JOSIE

He has a point...

LIBBY Fine! But when he betrays us, remember I was the one who was against this.

SIMON So can I see the cat now?

SFX: CAT

SIMON

She's so cute! What are you going to do with her?

JOSIE I hate the thought of her going to a shelter. Can either of you take her?

SIMON My roommate is allergic.

JOSIE

Libby?

LIBBY

My mom doesn't allow animals in the house. She has something against pets I think.

SIMON Why can't you take her home, Josie?

JOSIE I already have three cats, and I'm technically not allowed to have more than two pets in my apartment.

SFX: CAT

SIMON Shh! You can't be that loud!

JOSIE I bet she's hungry. Libby?

LIBBY Ugh. Fine. She can have my tuna sandwich. But you guys owe me lunch. JOSIE Have you guys ever heard of Dewey?

SIMON As in the Dewey Decimal System?

JOSIE

No, Dewey as in the cat who lived in a library. Someone dropped him in the book drop one day and the librarians decided to keep him and let him live in the library.

LIBBY

No. No! We aren't keeping a kitten in the library. There's no way Willow would ever agree. And we can't keep her a secret forever.

SIMON

And if the library board ever found out, we'd be in big trouble!

JOSIE

It wouldn't be forever. Just until we found her a home. I'm sure we have a ton of patrons who would love to adopt a sweet little kitten.

SIMON

I guess keeping her here for a day or two wouldn't hurt anyone.

JOSIE

We could make toys out of the craft supplies from story-time. And we can take turns watching her during our shifts!

LIBBY

My mom is on a tuna sandwich kick, so I could bring more to feed her.

JOSIE

Perfect!
 (to the cat)
How does that sound, Beatrix?

LIBBY

Beatrix?

JOSIE Yeah, like Beatrix Potter.

SIMON

I think she should be named Chess. Like the Cheshire Cat from Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.

LIBBY

You can't name her. If you name her, then you'll get attached and never want to give her away.

JOSIE So what? Are we just supposed to call her Cat?

LIBBY Yes. And right now, Cat needs to go into hiding and we need to get back to work.

TRANSITION

INT. LIBRARY - FRONT DESK - DAY

SFX: Receipt printing

LIBBY Your books will be due back in two weeks. And are you sure you're not looking to adopt a kitten?

WOMAN

I'm sure.

LIBBY Oh. Ok then. Have a nice day!

JOSIE (whispering) Libby!

LIBBY I've been trying all day, but no one wants a kitten. JOSIE About that...Beatrix is gone.

LIBBY

Who?

JOSIE

The kitten! I know you said not to name her, but I can't just call her Cat and I love Beatrix Potter's books and-

LIBBY Did you say the kitten is MISSING?!

JOSIE Not so loud!

LIBBY (whispering) How could you let this happen?

JOSIE I turned my back for one second and when I turned back around, she was gone!

SIMON

(running up) I just checked the children's section and the teen's section. I can't find her anywhere!

AGNES CAT! CAT! THERE'S A CAT IN THE LIBRARY!

LIBBY I think we've found her.

WILLOW What is all the ruckus about?

AGNES There's a cat! I just saw it by the biographies!

JOSIE Look! There she is! SIMON I'll catch her!

SFX: Simon catching the cat dramatically.

SIMON

I got her!

JOSIE Oh Beatrix! Are you ok? You poor thing! You can't scare me like that!

SIMON Beatrix? Libby said we couldn't name her. And if we could name her, it would be Chess!

WILLOW Wait, did the three of you know about this cat?

SFX: Shuffling around and "umms"

LIBBY We didn't not know about this cat.

WILLOW

Simon? Josie?

SIMON

Ummm...

LIBBY (under her breath) Shut up shut up shut up!

SIMON

(in an outburst) Josie found it and we had to take care of her and-

AGNES I knew it! I'm reporting you all to the library board!

LIBBY You can't report us! We've done nothing wrong!

AGNES You brought an animal into a public library! I will make sure you are procicuted to the fullest extent of the law!

WILLOW

That will not be necessary. Also it's not illegal to bring an animal into a library...

AGNES But...but I'm allergic!

Agnes fake sneezes.

WILLOW

If you are having an allergic reaction, we have benadryl in the back. And if you need a ride to the hospital, I'd be happy to take you.

AGNES

I'll be fine as soon as this thing leaves.

WILLOW

The kitten will be removed from the library. And she didn't hurt anything, so, I see no reason to involve the library board.

LIBBY

What do you mean she's being removed?

JOSIE

Please don't take her to the shelter!

WILLOW

Don't worry. I overheard the Johnsons talking about how they are looking to adopt a cat. I'll give them a call.

LIBBY

The Johnsons?

JOSIE

I love the Johnsons. They have the sweetest little kids.

AGNES

Those kids are loud and messy.

WILLOW

She will be in good hands. And now, she needs to be in my hands and you all need to get back to work.

Josie, Libby, and Simon murmer goodbyes.

AGNES

Good ridance.

Agnes walks away.

SIMON

What now?

SIMON We could get back to work?

LIBBY

Nah...

JOSIE We could go find another kitten to rescue?

SIMON Yeah, sounds good to me.

LIBBY

I don't really like those tuna sandwiches anyways.
