In 1994 the Folger Shakespeare Library initiated the *Renaissance Forum Awards Evening* to recognize and encourage contributions to arts and humanities education. The second *Awards Evening* will take place here on Thursday November 2. We would be deeply honored if you were able to accept one of four Renaissance Forum Awards presented on that occasion.
