## Prof. Goldstein in National Spotlight for Tea Party Expertise

One of the most eclectic members of the RWU Law faculty is Jared Goldstein, as his scholarship in leading law reviews has touched on invasive species, the tradeoff between national security and the welfare of whales, the habeas corpus rights of GITMO detainees, and free exercise of religion claims.

Now Jared has jumped into the national debate swirling around the emergence of the Tea Party, appearing on panels and being quoted in the media. Focusing on the group's use of arguments based on the Constitution, Jared presented his thoughts to a group of legal luminaries at the Annual Meeting of the Association of Law Schools held in San Francisco, that included Sandy Levinson (Texas), Ilya Somin (George Mason), Nathan Persilly (Columbia) and Randy Barnett (Georgetown, who has proposed a controversial constitutional amendment that would provide a means for states to overrule federal legislation).
