Parents and friends, alumni and students, are cordially invited to visit Bryant College—on its campus at Hope and Benevolent Streets and Young Orchard Avenue, Providence. The College buildings, including the dormitories, will be open throughout Commencement Day for the reception of visitors.

Bryant College was founded in 1863 and is the second oldest institution of training for business in America.

In 1916, by an act of the Rhode Island Legislature, Bryant College was empowered to grant degrees, at which time its curriculum was changed to higher education for business. In the same year, the College inaugurated the two-year accelerated program of courses, giving in two years of forty-eight weeks each the equivalent number of credit hours of most fouryear academic colleges of shorter college years, and is the first educational institution, so far as is known, to have done-so.
