THE GEORGE M. PARKS CHARACTER AND HIGHEST SCHOLARSHIP AWARD—Fifty dollars, to the senior completing the two-year Bachelor's Degree Course in the School of Business Administration—Accountancy and Finance. He is selected by the President of the College and certified by the Dean on the following basis: Scholastic ability and attainments; attributes of character and qualities of personality, integrity, industry, kindliness, adaptability, sympathy and fellowship; interest in college activities. A permanent trust fund was established by the late Mr. Parks to perpetuate this award.

ELIZABETH L. BURNHAM

THE CHARLES CURTIS AWARD—Presented by friends of the College, twenty-five dollars to the senior completing the One-Year Secretarial Program, who has manifested courteous conduct and cooperative spirit in personal relations, and demonstrated capacity for business leadership. Bryant College was founded in 1863 and is the second oldest institution of training for business in America.

In 1916, by an act of the Rhode Island Legislature, Bryant College was empowered to grant degrees, at which time its curriculum was changed to higher education for business. In the same year, the College inaugurated the two-year accelerated program of courses, giving in two years of forty-eight weeks each the equivalent number of credit hours of most four-year academic colleges of shorter college years, and is the first educational institution, so far as is known, to have done so.
