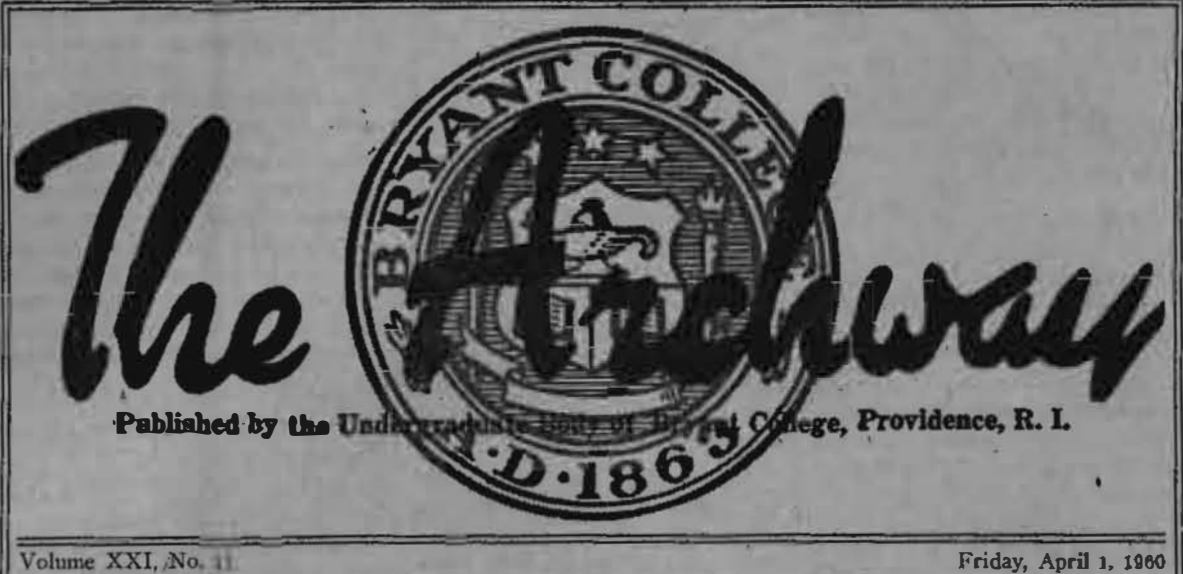

## Aid to Job Seekers Placement Bureau Will Install Reference Library for Students

On Wednesday evening, March 16, the Bryant College Marketing Club held its first meeting of the semester in the Student Union at 7 p. m. At this meeting, Dean Ann L. Corcoran, Director of Placement, announced that the Placement Bureau is currently in the process of compiling material for a Placement Reference Library which, when completed, should prove extremely helpful to both the faculty and student body.

Questionnaires have been mailed to hundreds of companies throughout the United States. Thus far, the response to the inquiries has been tremendous. Each day the Placement Office is flooded with employment applications, books, and brochures from many companies who desire prospective applicants thoroughly trained in the art of business leadership by a college which devotes itself exclusively to this field.

With the help of the Marketing Club members, all material is being cross indexed as to type of profession and individual companies. It is the ultimate goal of Dean Corcoran and the Marketing Club to have all available information placed on IBM tabular punch cards. When this is accomplished, students who desire information as to available positions, training programs, and industries in their home town area will receive it within a matter of minutes. Graduating students are urged to use the facilities currently available to them at the Placement Office. The placement personnel will be glad to help you find any information which you desire.

President Herbert Campbell outlined the Marketing Club's semester project of helping the Placement Bureau sort the material which they are currently receiving. Any student who wishes to help complete the project is urged to contact the Placement Bureau at his earliest opportunity.

Plans have also been formulated for the Marketing Club's upcoming field trip to Bostitch Incorporated, in East Greenwich, on April 13.

In addition to Dean Corcoran, two of the club's advisors were present at the meeting—Professor George W. Bates and Professor Robert L. Jarkin.

## “Education—For What?”

Have you ever asked yourself this question and wondered about the answer? Well, you are not the only one. “Education—For What?” is the theme of the Thirty-fifth Annual Spring Conference of the Eastern States Association of Professional Schools for Teachers. It was held in New York City from Thursday, March 24, through Saturday, March 26. Over eight hundred faculty members and student representatives discussed this question at length at seven panel discussions on Friday and Saturday.

Dean Lionel H. Merrier, president of the Association, presided. Bryant also had eight teachers and thirteen students taking part. The teachers who attended were Mrs. Marie G. Cote, Mrs. Audrey F. Sprague, Mrs. Philomena Castronovo, Mrs. Dorothy F. O’Connell, Mrs. Alice E. McLaughlin, Miss Diana L. Gallant, Miss Virginia L. Furtado, and Mrs. Clarissa H. Patterson. Mrs. Patterson served as faculty delegate. The students who attended were Betty Mae Choiniere, Cedia Mendes, Gretchen Arnold, Patricia Payette, Marilyn Main, Joanne Zompa, Joseph Charland, Timothy Cartwright, Anthony Celnizza, Alma Gagnon, Mary Ceccarelli, Margaret Ferreira, Geraldine Taylor. Betty Choiniere and Cedia Mendes served as summarizers on two of the panels.

Some of the topics discussed under the general theme were “Education for Money or Meaning?” of which Betty Choiniere was the summarizer; “How Will the Future Affect Education?” Cedia Mendes being the summarizer of this panel; also, “Why Are We Being Educated?”; “Who Should Determine the Morals and Ethics of the College?”

## Veterans of Special Interest in Census

The 1960 census will be of more than usual interest to veterans and their families, according to the Veterans Administration. The census-takers will visit every household beginning Friday, April 1.

This year the Census Bureau seeks the latest accurate information on the total veterans’ population figures as well as a grouping by war period.

Census takers will not ask this information on their visit to each household. Instead they will leave at every fourth household a special questionnaire for each person residing there. A box, numbered “P-35” on this questionnaire, supplies space to check off whether or not the individual is a veteran and in which war period he served.

Veterans’ organizations are joining with the VA in asking that each veteran in every fourth household, fill out the form promptly and correctly and see that it is mailed back to the designated address.

For the next decade, statistics resulting from this census will be used as an authoritative bench mark when veterans’ services or legislation come under consideration.

If it seems as though the entire Conference consisted of panel discussions, do not be misled. According to the schedule, there were sight-seeing tours conducted by students from New York University, receptions, and general sessions. Two keynote addresses were given at these general sessions by Dr. Francis H. Horn, president of the University of Rhode Island, and Dr. Lawrence G. Derthick, U. S. Commissioner of Education. Dr. Horn spoke on the theme, “Education—For What?” and Dr. Derthick discussed “The Reality of Dreams.”

The Eastern States Association is represented by more than seventy teacher-training colleges. There is a definite purpose behind the Association and this Conference. It is designed to improve the services of teacher-education institutions, to arouse a desire between students and faculty to co-operate in bringing about understanding among student groups, and to bring to the attention of the general public the significance of the work of teacher-training institutions. With the large number of teachers and students attending the Conference, Bryant will be more capable of developing the purposes behind the Eastern States Association of Professional Schools for Teachers.
