## Biographies of Honorary Degree Recipients



DOCTOR OF PEDAGOGY (Pd.D.)

STANLEY J. DRAKE

*President, Drake College of Florida*

A native of New Britain, Connecticut, Mr. Drake is an alumnus of Bryant College having received his Bachelor's Degree in 1937. He also attended the University of Miami and Temple College, receiving a Master's Degree in Business Education from the latter.

He has been an instructor in King's Business College, Raleigh, North Carolina; manager of Mount Vernon Business College, Mount Vernon, Ohio; and for the past fourteen years has served Broward College of Business—now Drake College—in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, in the capacities of instructor, principal, vice president, and president. In 1961 he was honored by the Florida State Association of Business Colleges at the Southern Business Education Association Convention as "Man of the Hour."

Formerly he was District Governor for the Southeast of the American Association of Commercial Colleges. Currently he is president of the Southeastern Business College Association and director and secretary of the United Business Schools Association.

Author of a book entitled "Spelling and Vocabulary Building for Shorthand Students," he is now writing a book entitled "Opportunities in the Business World" for guidance counselors.

Mr. Drake received a commendation from the Veterans Administration as one of six Florida men who have done outstanding work in training World War II and Korean veterans. He is also the founder and first president of the Florida Christian Academy, educational chairman of the Fort Lauderdale Kiwanis Club, and has served with two professors of the University of Florida on inspection teams of the Accrediting Commission for Business Schools.

Mr. Drake married the former Virginia Allen of Shelby, North Carolina. They have three daughters, Mrs. Walter Berg, Jr., and eleven-year-old twins, Jane and Janet Drake.



DOCTOR OF EDUCATION (Ed.D.)

ROSEMARY PIERREL

*Dean of Pembroke College in Brown University*

Born in Worcester, Massachusetts, Dean Pierrel received her early education in the schools of Illinois and the Lincoln School of Providence, Rhode Island. Her A.B. and A.M. degrees were earned at Boston University, and her Ph.D. degree in experimental psychology at Brown. She was a graduate assistant and instructor at Brown before joining the faculty of Barnard College, Columbia University, as assistant professor of psychology. She was promoted to associate professor there in 1960.

Dr. Pierrel has done extensive research on auditory learning in animals and is the author of a number of papers which have been published in professional journals.

Dean Pierrel is a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Sigma XI, the American Psychological Association, the Eastern Psychological Association, the Psychonomic Society, the American Association of University Professors, the American Association for University Women and the American Association of Academic Deans.

In addition to her administrative duties as sixth dean of Pembroke, Dr. Pierrel teaches the introductory course in psychology, supervises graduate student thesis research, and continues her experimental research on the learning process in animals. This current project is supported by a grant from the United States Public Health Service.

DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS (L.H.D.)

JAMES BRITT DONOVAN

*International Attorney-At-Law, Liberator of Cuban Prisoners*

A native of New York City, Mr. Donovan was educated in its schools, graduating from Fordham University in 1937 with an A.B. degree and earned his law degree at Harvard University. Admitted to the bar of New York, the Supreme Court of the United States, the United States Court of Appeals in several circuits, he has appeared before the Court of Military Appeals among several others. He is presently engaged in private practice in New York and has acted as chief counsel in major court trials and appeals in over thirty states.

He has served in various executive capacities with the American Bar Association, the New York State Bar Association and on the International Association of Insurance Counsel. He is a fellow of the International and American Colleges of Trial Lawyers, as well as other distinguished legal societies.

His World War II service includes that of Associate General Counsel of the United States Office of Scientific Research and Development and a subsequent Commission as a line officer in the United States Navy, where he served until the end of the war as General Counsel of the Office of Strategic Services. He was designated Chief of War Crimes Intelligence of O. S. S. and in 1945 became a member of the personal staff of the late Supreme Court Justice Robert H. Jackson for prosecution of the major Axis war criminals. He retired from military service as Commander of the U. S. Naval Reserve and was awarded the Legion of Merit, Commendation Ribbon with cluster, and other awards.

Mr. Donovan was cited for "rare ability" and "self-sacrifice" by the U. S. Supreme Court in the Abel espionage case. He later arranged for the release of U-2 pilot Francis Gary Powers by Soviet Russia and U. S. student Frederick Pryor held by East Germany. For these efforts he was awarded the Distinguished Intelligence Medal by the Central Intelligence Agency. As General Counsel to the Cuban Families for Liberation of Prisoners of War, he has effected the release of 1163 Cuban prisoners and over 7000 relatives of prisoners as well as 35 Americans. He has done this without compensation.

He is a trustee of many educational institutions and art schools, and he lectures at many universities. Mr. Donovan has authored magazine articles and won many honors and awards.

Mr. Donovan married the former Mary E. McKenna in 1941. They have four children: Jane Ann, John, Mary Ellen, and Clare.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

VINCENT SORRENTINO

*Chairman of the Board and Treasurer, Uncas Manufacturing Company*

Born in Castellamare di Stabia in Italy, Mr. Sorrentino came to this country when he was fifteen years old. Beginning his career as a jeweler's apprentice in Providence, Mr. Sorrentino went into business for himself in 1911. This is the business that eventually became the Uncas Manufacturing Company. He is known as a creative jewelry designer as well as an administrative expert.

Prominent and active in many community and social organizations, he served the State as Director of the Department of Social Welfare from 1939 to 1940.

Founder and treasurer of the Aurora Civic Association, he was for more than a score of years its financial advisor. He is a past president of this organization and a permanent member of the board.

In 1952, following his active participation in a drive for funds to alleviate distress among residents of the flooded valley of the Po River, Mr. Sorrentino was honored by the Italian Government with an award which raises his rank to that of "Cavalier of the Order of Merit of the Republic of Italy."

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

MARION STEPHENSON

*Vice President, Administration, Radio Network  
National Broadcasting Company, Inc.*

The first woman vice president in the history of NBC and RCA was born in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Miss Stephenson received her public school education in Mt. Vernon, New York, graduating from A. B. Davis High School. She majored in business and economics for her Bachelor of Arts degree from Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio. Before she graduated she participated in a work-study program that included jobs with the McCall Corporation as a renewal researcher, secretarial positions in Chicago and New York, and as a community government business manager on campus. After her graduation she joined the New York Office of the Standard Oil Company.

She began working for NBC as a budget clerk in the Advertising and Production Department. During her early years with NBC, Miss Stephenson attended New York University's Graduate School of Business Administration at night, where she was awarded the Marcus Nadler key for "Excellence in Finance." She received her Master's Degree in Business Administration in 1948. The same year she was named Business Manager of NBC's Advertising and Promotion Department.

Three years later she was made General Ledger Accountant in the Controller's department and held variously such posts as Budget Supervisor of the Joint Controller's Area, Chief Budget Assistant, Assistant to the Divisional Controller, Radio Network Budget Manager, Senior Financial Operations Analyst and finally, Director of Business Affairs of NBC Radio before being elevated to her present job.

She is a member of the International Radio-Television Society and the Money Marketeers of New York University.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

EDWIN P. NEILAN

*President, Chamber of Commerce of the United States*

President and Chairman of the Board of the Bank of Delaware in Wilmington, Mr. Neilan's birthplace is Mason County, Michigan. He received his A.B. degree from Rice Institute and subsequently attended the South Texas School of Law, the American Institute of Banking in Houston and the Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University.

His career in banking began with the investment department of the Houston Bank and Trust Company and after positions of responsibility with Federal Reserve Banks in Dallas, New York, and Philadelphia, he became associated with the Bank of Delaware where he rose to be president and chairman.

Mr. Neilan's military service started as a Lieutenant, then Lieutenant Commander, in the U. S. Navy Supply Corps during 1942-46, at which time he was awarded a Commendation Ribbon.

A member of the American Bankers Association, he became vice president of the State Bank Division in 1962-63. He is a former director of the Wilmington Chapter of the American Institute of Banking and a former president of the Delaware Bankers Association.

In 1961, he was chosen as "Manager of the Year" by the Society for the Advancement of Management. He is also Chairman of the Delaware Advisory Council on Naval Affairs, 4th Naval District, and was former special consultant to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. His community contributions include the directorship, presidency and general drive chairman of the United Community Fund of Northern Delaware, General Division Chairman and former Executive Committee member of the United Negro College Fund, fiscal advisor to the Y. W. C. A., the Boy Scouts of America, and others. A member of various committees of the Delaware State Chamber of Commerce, he has also served the Chamber of Commerce of the United States in significant policy areas. In 1962 he served as Chairman of a Special Budget Committee to recommend federal budgetary improvements to President Kennedy.

He is also a member of the University of Delaware Research Foundation.

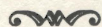

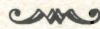
