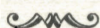

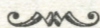

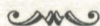

Honorary Degrees



DOCTOR OF LAWS (LL.D.)

MRS. OVETA CULP HOBBY

Secretary, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare

Mrs. Secretary Hobby was born in Killeen, Texas. She received her education in the public schools of Killeen, under private tutors and at Mary Hardin-Baylor College. As Parliamentarian in the Texas House of Representatives, she served from 1926 to 1931 and again in 1939 and 1941. It was in 1931 that she began her 20-year affiliation with the Houston Post as Research Editor. When she was appointed Chief of the Women's Interest Section of the War Department's Bureau of Public Relations in 1941, she was serving this newspaper as Assistant Editor. In 1942 Mrs. Hobby was appointed Director of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps and, in 1943, Commanding Colonel, Army of the United States and Director of the Women's Army Corps. She was released from active duty in September 1945 and returned to the Houston Post as Executive Vice-President. At the time of her appointment as Federal Security Administrator, January 21, 1953, she was Editor and Publisher of the Houston Post and Executive Director of Station KPRC-AM-FM-TV. Oveta Culp Hobby was appointed Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare and a member of President Eisenhower's cabinet on April 11, 1953.

Holder of Honorary Degrees from Baylor University, Mary-Hardin-Baylor College, the University of Chattanooga, Sam Houston State Teacher's College, Colorado Woman's College and Bard College, Mrs. Hobby was awarded honor medals for distinguished service to Journalism and in 1951 her name was added to the roster of the South's Hall of Fame for the Living. She was a member of the Board of Directors of the American Society of Newspaper Editors from 1947 to 1950. She was also on the Board of Directors of the Advertising Federation of America, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the American National Red Cross and many other National welfare organizations.

Mrs. Hobby is the author of "Mr. Chairman", a textbook on Parliamentary Law and of "Codification of State Banking Laws in Texas".



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

MRS. IVY BAKER PRIEST

Treasurer of the United States

A resident of Bountiful, Utah, Mrs. Priest was born in Kimberley, in the same state. A miner's daughter, she attended elementary schools there and was graduated from Bingham High School. She attended the University of Utah. Starting as a telephone operator, she became a supervisor, and later went into the merchandising field—at the same time teaching classes in American History and citizenship until her marriage in 1935. A member of the Republican National Committee for Utah since 1944, Mrs. Priest has been active in Republican organizations since 1932. In 1952 she was appointed assistant to the chairman of the Republican National Committee, and head of the Women's Division. A leader in public service, Mrs. Priest was President of the Utah State Women's Legislative Council, Vice-President of the Utah Safety Council and director of many other welfare groups. On November 25, 1952 she was appointed Treasurer of the United States by President Eisenhower.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

ROGER WARD BABSON

Founder and Head of the Babson Statistical Organization

A graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Dr. Babson claims Gloucester, Massachusetts as his birthplace. He is the founder of the Babson Statistical Organization and the Babson Institute, both located in Babson Park, Massachusetts. He is Chairman of the Board of Babson's Reports, Inc. As director of several prominent business organizations, he was appointed Director of General Information and Education during the World War. A candidate for President on the Prohibition ticket in 1940, Dr. Babson was also a moderator of the National Council of Christian Churches. In 1936 he was appointed a fellow of the Royal Statistical Society of London, England. He is widely known as a lecturer on statistics and economics. Among the books authored by Dr. Babson are "Business Fundamentals", "Religion and Business", "Washington and Inflation", "Looking Ahead Fifty Years", "Better Living for Less Money", "Making Good in Business", "The Fundamentals of Prosperity" and many others. Dr. Babson has been the recipient of many other Honorary Degrees by colleges and universities, religious and secular.

DOCTOR OF LAWS (LL.D.)

MORGAN B. BRAINARD

President, Aetna Life Insurance Company

Son of the Mayor of Hartford, Mr. Brainard, born in that city, attended its public high schools, then left to take his Bachelor and Law degrees at Yale University. A practicing lawyer, he was first elected Director of the Aetna Life Insurance, later Assistant Treasurer, Vice-President and in 1922 he was elected President by the directors of this company. He also serves as President of the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, The Automobile Insurance Company, and the Standard Fire Insurance Company. In 1931, he was called to Washington to advise Reconstruction Finance Company on its proposed insurance bills and in 1934 was named a member of the Insurance Advisory Committee of this organization. Among public welfare organizations, Mr. Brainard has served as a Director of the Connecticut State Prison, the National War Fund, Hartford Hospital, Watkinson Library. An active Republican he has served Hartford as Councilman, Alderman and member of the Board of Police Commissioners. He holds an honorary degree from Trinity College, is Secretary of the Class of 1900 at Yale, and a member of the Board of Trustees of Wesleyan University. Director of many important business organizations, Mr. Brainard is now Chairman of the Board of The New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

JAMES CASH PENNEY

Chairman of the Board, J. C. Penney Co., Inc.

Founder of the J. C. Penney Company, which now operates 1630 department stores in the 48 states, Mr. Penney is a native of Hamilton, Missouri. A graduate of the Hamilton High School, Mr. Penney holds Honorary Degrees in Business Administration, Commercial Science, Humane Letters and Laws. He is a noted public speaker and author of numerous articles and his autobiography, published in 1950, "Fifty Years with the Golden Rule". A cattle breeder of pure-bred herds, he is a member of the Board of Directors of the American Royal Livestock Exposition and Horse Show, Foremost Guernsey Association and other cattle clubs. In 1953, Mr. Penney was the recipient of the "Horatio Alger" Award. He is a founder of the Memorial Home Community at Penney Farms in Florida for retired ministers, full time religious workers and their wives. He is also chairman of the Board of the Allied Youth, Inc., The Laymen's Movement for a Christian World, Inc., and is a Lieutenant on the Staff of the Governor of Florida.
