Biographies of Honorary Degree Recipients



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

BARNABY CONRAD KEENEY

President of Brown University

An historian, Dr. Keeney received the Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1936 from the University of North Carolina. He received the Master of Arts Degree in 1937 and the Doctor of Philosophy in 1939 from Harvard University. Brown awarded him the Master of Arts Degree (ad eundem) in 1949. He was born in Halfway, Oregon, and was brought up in Hartford, Connecticut.

At the completion of his graduate work, Dr. Keeney became an instructor of history at Harvard, a position he held until he entered the Army in 1942. In the fall of 1946, Dr. Keeney came to Brown as an assistant professor of history and in July of 1949 was appointed Dean of the Graduate School. He became Dean of the College in September of 1953. He was elected President of Brown University in August of 1955.

Commissioned a second lieutenant the first year he was in the Army, Dr. Keeney saw action in the battles of the Rhinelands, Ardennes, and Central Europe. He was awarded the Silver Star, the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. He was separated from the military service in 1945 with the rank of Captain.

While still in the Army, he was awarded a Guggenheim Post-Service Fellowship for further study in history. His dissertation, "Judgment by Peers," was published by the Harvard University Press. In 1950 while Dean of the Graduate School he received a grant from the Carnegie Corporation to study graduate education throughout the United States.

The Honorary Degrees of Laws, Education, Jurisprudence and Humane Letters have been bestowed upon him by several colleges and universities.

Dr. Keeney married the former Mary Critchfield of Hartford in 1941. They have three children.



DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS (L.H.D.)

CLAIBORNE PELL

United States Senator from Rhode Island

The son of Herbert Claiborne Pell, ex-Minister to Portugal and Hungary and an ex-Congressman, Senator Pell received his early education at St. George's School in Newport. He received his A.B., cum laude, from Princeton University in 1940 and has an M.A. from Columbia University. He enlisted in the United States Coast Guard in World War II, was later commissioned, and was discharged as a Lieutenant, at the War's end.

Senator Pell was a Special Assistant at the 1945 San Francisco United Nations Conference and served in the American Foreign Service and State Department for seven years. He established the American Consulate General in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia. Mr. Pell also worked abroad as a Vice President of the International Rescue Committee and served on the Hungarian border at the time of the revolution.

Decorated by several countries, including Italy, France and Portugal and the Knights of Malta for his refugee work, he is on the National Council of the United States Committee for Refugees.

Senator Pell has served as a Consultant to the Democratic National Committee and was a member of its Political Advisory Committee. A Director of the World Affairs Council of Rhode Island, Mr. Pell was also R. I. Finance Chairman of the U. S. Committee for the United Nations. He is a member of the R. I. Society of Cincinnati and attends Trinity Episcopal Church in Newport.

Mr. Pell was elected United States Senator from Rhode Island by the largest plurality in the State's history after becoming the first unendorsed candidate to win a state-wide primary.

He is married to the former Nuala O'Donnell of Newport, Rhode Island. They have two sons, Herbert and Christopher, and two daughters, Dallas and Julia.

DOCTOR OF LETTERS (Litt.D.)

WILLIAM CLEMENT GAIGE

President of Rhode Island College

A native of Warren, Pennsylvania, Dr. Gaige earned his Bachelor's Degree at Oberlin College, his Master's Degree at the University of Chicago, and his Doctor's Degree at Harvard University.

Beginning his career as a high school teacher in Quincy, Massachusetts, in 1932, Dr. Gaige subsequently was high school principal in Pembroke and Wellesley, Massachusetts. Between 1944 and 1946 he served as an officer in the United States Navy. In 1948 he became Superintendent of Schools in Claremont, California. During his career he taught graduate courses at Boston University and the Claremont Graduate School in Claremont, California. In 1952 he was inaugurated President of Rhode Island College.

A member of the New England Board of Higher Education, he is also a member of the R. I. Higher Education Assistance Corporation, the American Association of School Administrators, and the Corporation of the Providence Institution for Savings. Dr. Gaige is a Deacon of the First Unitarian Church.

He holds honorary memberships in the University Club of Providence, the Board of Directors of the R. I. World Affairs Council and Honorary Vice President of the R. I. Audubon Society. He has received Honorary Degrees in Science and Law from three colleges and universities.

Dr. Gaige is married and is the father of three children.



DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS (L.H.D.)

J. HAROLD WILLIAMS

Scout Executive Emeritus, Narragansett Council, Boy Scouts of America

Forty-three years of Mr. Williams' life have been spent as Scout Executive of the Narragansett Council, Boy Scouts of America. He retired on June 30 in his 65th year because of the Scout retirement plan. Continuing as Secretary of the Rhode Island Boy Scouts, he will undertake a country-wide speaking program for the Scout movement at the invitation of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Born in Providence, Mr. Williams was graduated from Hope High School and attended Brown University, later becoming a reporter on the *Providence Journal* from which position he took office as Scout Executive in the year 1918. He was the first Boy Scout Executive to come up through the ranks.

"Chief" Williams—as he is called—has been decorated by universities, newspapers, civic organizations and veteran groups. He has written and produced great arena shows at each of the five National Scout Jamborees and originated the spectacular candlelighting ceremony which traditionally closes these encampments of more than 50,000 scouts. He is well known in World Scouting circles, having attended the Seventh World Jamboree in Austria as program director of the American delegation. His speaking tours for the Scouting movement have taken him the length and breadth of the United States and Canada.

A member of the Permanent Deaconate and Superintendent of the Church School of the Central Congregational Church, he is a member of the Board of Managers of the Providence Art Club and a Director of the Providence Gas Company.

He has been active in the life of Brown University, the United Fund, the Providence Athenaeum, community dramatics and out-door activities.

He married the former Charlotte Booth and they have two children, James H. Williams, Jr., of La Puente, California, and Mrs. Robert A. Marsello of Warwick, and five grandchildren.

DOCTOR OF PEDAGOGY (Pd.D.)

GRACE M. GLYNN

Chief, Division of Adult Education, R. I. State Department of Education

Born and educated in Providence, Rhode Island, Miss Glynn earned her Bachelor's Degree at Pembroke College in Brown University in 1936 and her Master's Degree at Brown in 1949.

Beginning her career in education as a teacher in the Secondary Schools of Providence, she became Supervisor of the R. I. State Council of Defense in 1941. She was appointed to the R. I. Department of Education in 1943 and became Chief of Adult Education in 1958.

Her professional memberships include the National Association of Public School Adult Educators and the Adult Education Association of the U. S. Miss Glynn is National Secretary of the American Immigration and Citizenship Conference and Vice Chairman of its Committee on Education. She is the R. I. representative on the Coordinating Council of the Nine States Youth Citizenship Project.

The Alumnae Association of Pembroke College elected her its President from 1960 to 1962. She was also Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Pembroke College Fund from 1955 to 1959 and a member of the Academic Committee in 1955.

Miss Glynn was President of the Quota Club of Providence from 1956 to 1958. In 1962 she was elected a member of the Board of Directors of the United Fund. She is a member of the Public Education Committee of the American Cancer Society, R. I. Division, Inc.; is on the Boards of Directors of the International Institute of R. I. and the R. I. Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation.



DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

FELIX A. MIRANDO

President, Imperial Knife Company

Mr. Mirando arrived in this country from his native Italy in 1910, when he was fourteen years old. He became co-founder of the Imperial Knife Company in 1917. This company now plays a leading role in the cutlery industry of America.

He is a director of many business and public offices including the Industrial National Bank of Providence, the Old Colony Cooperative Bank, the Narragansett Electric Company, the Providence Washington Insurance Company, and is a member of the Special Committee for the Study of State Government Structure and Organization appointed by Governor Notte. He is also on the Advisory Commission of the R. I. Development Council and is a National Consultant to the Small Business Administration.

Civic and Community Organizations benefited by his leadership. They include the United Fund, the American Cancer Society, Federal Hill House, the World Affairs Council, Impact, R. I., Junior Achievement, Providence Chamber of Commerce, Roger Williams Hospital and Our Lady of Fatima Hospital. He serves all of these as Director. Mr. Mirando is a Vice President of the Blue Cross Hospital Service Corporation.

In 1957 he was given the National Brotherhood Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. He was made Knight of St. Gregory by Pope Pius XII, and a Knight Commander by Pope John XXIII. In 1959 Brown University recognized him with a Civic Citation for his charitable and religious enterprises.

Married to the former Aurora Di Noce, Mr. Mirando is the father of four children.

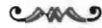
