DOCTOR OF LAWS (LL.D.)

JAMES P. MITCHELL

Secretary of Labor of the United States

Prior to his appointment as Secretary of Labor, Mr. Mitchell served as Assistant Secretary of the Army in charge of manpower and reserve forces affairs. During World War II, he was the Director of the Industrial Personnel Division of the War Department where he was responsible for labor and manpower problems affecting Army contractors and the administration of nearly one million civilian employees of the Army Service Forces. During the war, he served as a member of the National Building Trades Stabilization Board and also as an alternate for the Under Secretary of War on the War Manpower Commission. In 1948, he was a member of the personnel advisory board of the Hoover Commission and in that same year, at the request of the U. S. Army, he went to Germany to study the military government's civilian employment program. In 1950, he was called upon again by the U. S. Army, this time to study and report on combat pay problems.

He has served as personnel relations advisor, Director of Industrial Relations and operating Vice President for several large industrial concerns. He was appointed to his present Cabinet post as Secretary of Labor on October 9, 1953.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE (D.Sc.)

GEORGE SPERI SPERTI

Director, Institutum Divi Thomae Foundation

Scientist, inventor, Research and Education Director of the Institutum Divi Thomae of Cincinnati, Ohio, and Palm Beach, Florida, Dr. Sperti was born in Covington, Kentucky. A graduate of the University of Cincinnati, he was awarded Honorary Degrees by the Universities of Dayton and Duquesne. A fellow and research assistant at the University of Cincinnati, he was co-founder of their Basic Science Research Laboratories and subsequently a Rockefeller Foundation Fellow. He was Principal Consultant for the War Production Board in 1942 and the Smaller War Plants Corporation.

Dr., Sperti was one of six Americans appointed to the Pontifical Academy of Science by Pope Pius XI in 1936 and was awarded the Christian Culture Award in 1947.

His inventions include laws governing radiation in biology, light treatment processes, electronic devices and processes. As editor and author he has had many papers published in scientific journals relative to cancer research and in the Bulletin of Basic Science Research of The University of Cincinnati of which he was co-editor. He was co-author of the "Quantum Theory in Biology" and "Correlated Investigations in the Basic Sciences." He is at present Editor-In-Chief of the Institutum Divi Thomae official publication.

Holding membership in Eta Kappa Nu, honorary electrical engineering society, he is also a member of Tau Beta Pi, engineering fraternity, Sigma Xi, scientific society, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Royal Society of Arts of London, and other learned associations. Dr. Sperti is a founding member of the American Society for the Aged.

### FLORENCE KERINS MURRAY

### Judge of the Superior Court of Rhode Island

A native of Newport, Rhode Island, Judge Murray received her Bachelor's Degree at Syracuse University and her Law Degree at Boston University, She has taught in Rhode Island Schools and serves as Chairman of the Newport School Committee of which she has been a member for the past nine years.

A member of both the Massachusetts and Rhode Island Bars, she has also been admitted to practice before the Federal District Court, the U. S. Supreme Court, Internal Revenue Commission, U. S. Court of Military Appeals, the American Arbitration Association and served as a Master in Chancery in the Rhode Island Superior Court. She has actively practiced law in association with her husband, Paul F. Murray. Elected to the Rhode Island Senate, she served from 1948 to 1956 and was Chairman of the Special Legislative Committee.

Rising through the ranks in the Women's Army Corps in 1942 she became the youngest woman promoted to Lieutenant Colonel at the time of her appointment. After four and one-half years in the military service, where she served in various official capacities, she became the commander of the first and only WAC Reserve Camp at Camp Lee, Virginia. Judge Murray was awarded the Army Commendation Certificate, the Army Commendation Ribbon and the Legion of Merit.

A past Newport president, and state and regional officer of the Business and Professional Women's Club, the Quota Clubs, she was also Judge Advocate of American Legion Post and Director for Red Cross, Girl Scouts, Community Chest and many other civic and state welfare organizations. A member of the 1950 White House Conference on Youth and Children, she was appointed a member of the National Advisory Committee on Women in the Service by the Secretary of Defense.

In 1956 she was honored with the Arents Honorary Alumni Award at Syracuse University, the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Education from R. I. College of Education, and the Carroll Award by the R. I. Institute of Instruction. She was appointed Associate Justice of the Rhode Island Superior Court on April 29 of that year. Judge Murray is the mother of a son, Paul F. Murray, Jr.

President of the East Providence Boys' Club and chief of their Auxiliary Police, he is also a Trustee and Financial Secretary of the Haven Methodist Church. He is Director of Civil Defense for his city. A Director of the Rising Sun Lodge No. 30, F. & A. M., he holds memberships in many fraternal organizations.

Past President of the Bryant National Alumni Association, he is also on the Executive Committee and a Past President of the Rhode Island Public Finance Officers' Association.

Elected as Treasurer of East Providence in 1946, he became General Treasurer of the State in 1948, being re-elected for four consecutive terms and currently serving in this capacity.
