Why not join me on Saturday, May 26, and see what I am boasting about.

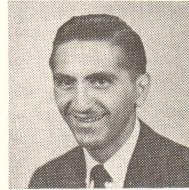

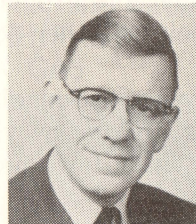
David M. Brooks, Jr., was a judge for the Knights of Pythias Oratorical Contest held recently in Providence. He is Assistant Professor of Speech and English.

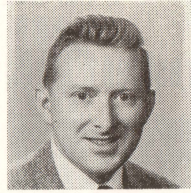

The seven-hour session was conducted at the Colony Motor Hotel in Cranston.

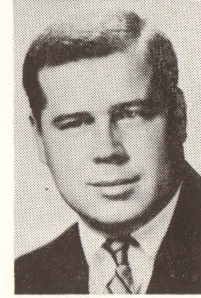

# THE TASK: Double Present Number of Library Volumes

## Gifts from President-Emeritus and President Jacobs Get Us Underway



A portion of our annual budget is now being spent for our library and to acquire new books each month. We hope to make it one of the most up-to-date business libraries in Southern New England. We plan to have from 30-40,000 volumes in 10 years.

To broaden the types of books available to students, faculty, and alumni, an effort is underway to *double the available volumes this year*. We have just over 8,000 books in the stacks at this time. A student campaign, a faculty-administration campaign, and an alumni campaign are expected to net at least 7,000 volumes.

A list of the types of books we can use is printed in the column to the right.

Doctor E. Gardner Jacobs has offered his office as a collection area for donated books. He has kicked off the campaign with the contribution of a set of red Morocco-bound Harvard Classics and 250 assorted titles in fiction.

President-emeritus Henry L. Jacobs has contributed a check for \$100 towards the purchase of additional volumes.

Dr. Lionel H. Mercier was named general chairman for the campaigns by President Jacobs and has laid considerable groundwork toward the projected goal. Dr. Mercier has appointed other committees as indicated on this page.

A competitive spirit prevails and we are certain that alumni will join the campaign for additional books. Contribute a few volumes or your whole library. Or, if you wish to send a check towards the fruition of this project, it will always be welcome.

Each book placed in the Library will have a bookplate with the donor's name. We will arrange to pick up any donated volumes in the Providence area. You may know of friends or relatives who will contribute books.

Professor John McCabe has made a gift of the medical library of his father, Dr. Frank J. McCabe, truly a treasure for the medical secretarial students and students of science and biology. Professor Ralph S. Handy has also pledged over 200 volumes.

The alumni section of this campaign will conclude on May 26—Homecoming. Bring those unused books with you. We will be pleased to receive them.

A resident of Barrington, Rhode Island, William died March 16 after an illness of one week. He was 64 and resided in the town of his birth until his passing.

He joined the Shepard Company in 1914 after his graduation and was later awarded the Bachelor of Accounts degree in 1925. In 1958 he was honored with a Master of Business Administration degree, honoris causa.

At the time of his passing he was executive vice-president, secretary-treasurer, and a director of the Shepard Company.

He is survived by his wife, Eleanor, and one son, William J. Hamilton, Jr.; as well as three brothers, two sisters, and three grandchildren.

He is survived by his wife, Frances, and a sister.

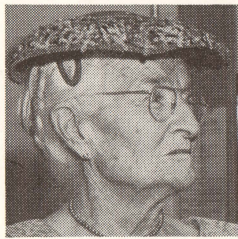
## NATIONAL GUARD ARMORY NAMED FOR DONALD S. SCHOFIELD, '38

Rhode Island Governor John Notte, Jr., has named a newly completed building in Cranston in memory of Lieutenant Donald S. Schofield, the husband of the former Miss Lucille Barbara Tetrault, and son of Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin Schofield.

Donald joined the Guard in 1936, became activated into federal service in 1941, and was graduated as a flight officer in the air corps in 1942. He served in the North African campaign and was credited with 20 combat missions before the announcement of his death in 1944. He was awarded the Purple Heart and four Air Medal clusters posthumously.

Official dedication of the armory will be held May 20.

## DR. KILCUP HONORED BY R. I. OSTEOPATHIC GENERAL HOSPITAL

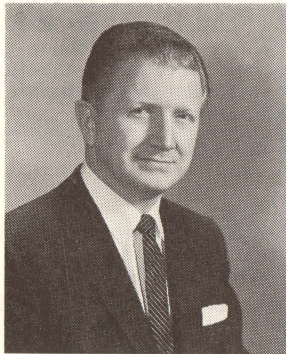

Robert G. Charland has been elected as assistant secretary and assistant treasurer of the Pyrofax Gas Corporation, a unit of Union Carbide Corporation.

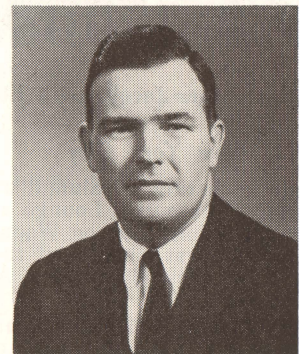
He was a member of the Class of 1949 and made his home in Nashua, New Hampshire. Robert began his association with Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation as an accountant.

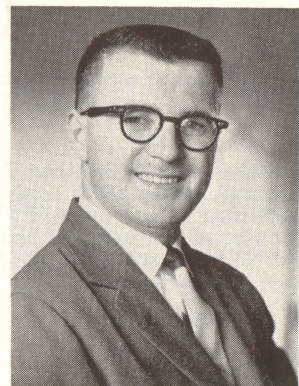
## IBM PROMOTES GOLDEN AND CHIQUETTE

Joseph is married and has four sons.

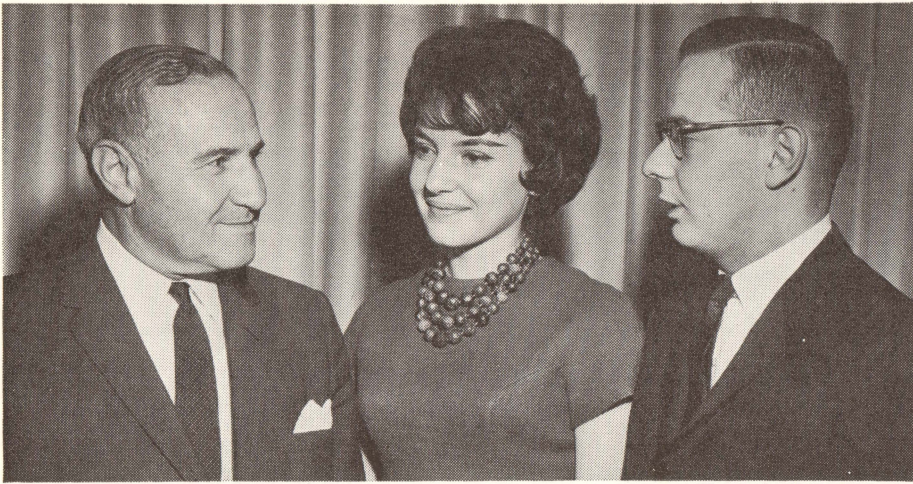


Roger C. Chiquette, '51, has been promoted to controller at the Federal Systems Division Engineering Laboratory at Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

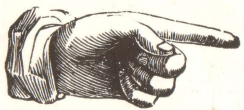

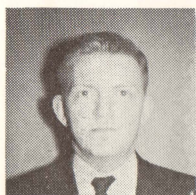

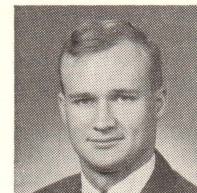
