# THE TASK: Double Present Number of Library Volumes

#### Gifts from President-Emeritus and President Jacobs Get Us Underway



A portion of our annual budget is now being spent for our library and to acquire new books each month. We hope to make it one of the most up-to-date business libraries in Southern New England. We plan to have from 30-40,000 volumes in 10 years.

To broaden the types of books available to students, faculty, and alumni, an effort is underway to double the available volumes this year. We have just over 8,000 books in the stacks at this time. A student campaign, a faculty-administration campaign, and an alumni campaign are expected to net at least 7,000 volumes.

Doctor E. Gardner Jacobs has offered his office as a collection area for donated books. He has kicked off the campaign with the contribution of a set of red Morrocco-bound Harvard Classics and 250 assorted titles in fiction.

President-emeritus Henry L. Jacobs has contributed a check for \$100 towards the purchase of additional volumes.

Dr. Lionel H. Mercier was named general chairman for the campaigns by President Jacobs and has laid considerable groundwork toward the projected goal. Dr. Mercier has appointed other committees as indicated on this page.

A competitive spirit prevails and we are certain that alumni will join the campaign for additional books. Contribute a few volumes or your whole library. Or, if you wish to send a check towards the fruition of this project, it will always be welcome.

Each book placed in the Library will have a bookplate with the donor's name. We will arrange to pick up any donated volumes in the Providence area. You may know of friends or relatives who will contribute books.

Professor John McCabe has made a gift of the medical library of his father, Dr. Frank J. McCabe, truly a treasure for the medical secretarial students and students of science and biology. Professor Ralph S. Handy has also pledged over 200 volumes.

The alumni section of this campaign will conclude on May 26—Homecoming. Bring those unused books with you. We will be pleased to receive them.
