Bryant Campus Moved To Lincoln

"This move will be quite beneficial to the students as a whole," stated Les LaFond, Vice President for Student Affairs, as he announced the plans for the construction of the new Tupper Campus of Bryant College in Lincoln, Nebraska.

"The new campus will be a resident's dream. It will have all of the amenities that one could ever desire," said LaFond. "However, it will be a bitch for the commuters, but these things happen."

"The new campus will benefit us all and truly increase our national appeal," stated Bryant Executive Vice President, William Trueheart.

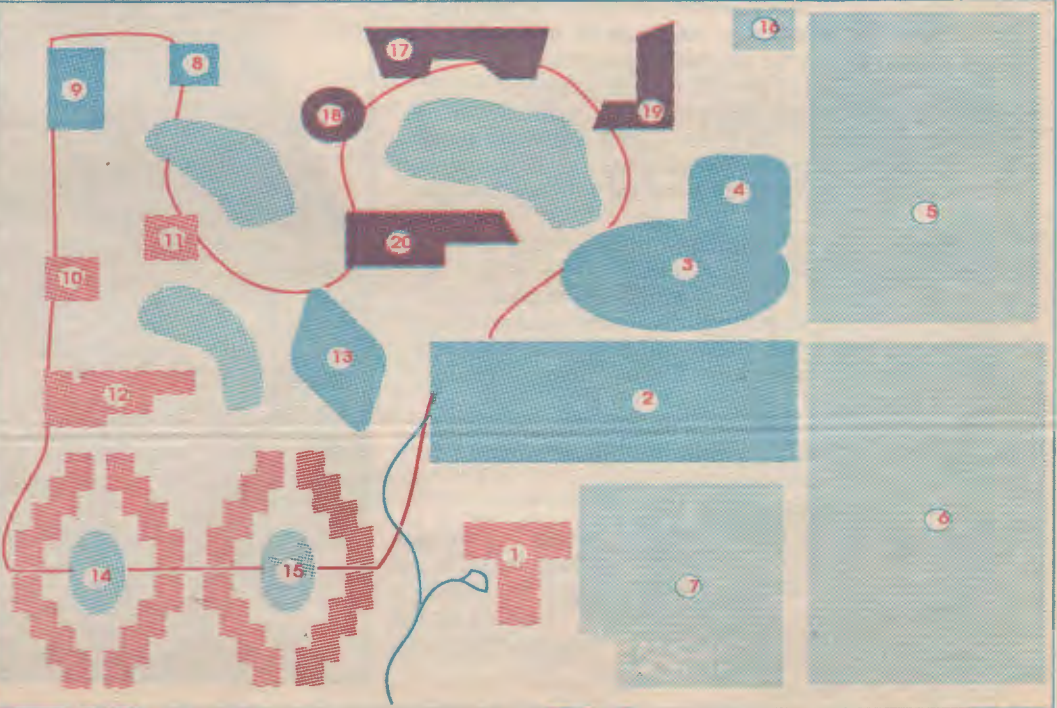
The campus is being moved to a new location in order to facilitate the conversion of the Unistructure at the current Smithfield campus into new faculty offices (see related story). The conversion will take place during the summer of 1990.

Although the new campus is not expected to be operational by the 1990-1991 academic year, a steel shelter will be constructed to temporarily house classes. Resident students will be furnished with camping equipment and provided with space on an adjacent prairie as temporary residence halls.

The question of the distance between the new campus and the new faculty offices was raised by many people concerned about the project. LaFond explained that the college would provide transportation between the two facilities.

"Bryant President Donald Trump has graciously donated a fleet of six supersonic lear jets to the Bryant Transit Authority. The college has promoted Public Safety Chief Richard Wheeler to the position of Chief Pilot to conduct the air-transportation division of the BTA. Contracts have been signed to create a Lincoln-Lincoln shuttle for the faculty members. The BTA will run the thirteen-hundred mile shuttle service from the North Central State Airport in Lincoln, RI to the O'Hara Intercampus Airfield in Lincoln, Nebraska," revealed LaFond

The campus will feature twin high-rise suite-style dormitory towers, a freshman complex, and two senior condominium villages. Five ponds will be strategically located across Nebraska Move, 3A

Unistructure to be Converted into Faculty Offices

After the second space utilization study in a year, college officials have announced that all classrooms in the Unistructure will be replaced with faculty offices. College officials sighted the need for faculty office space and the "obvious waste of space" by classrooms, as the primary reason for the change.

"We're not saying the quality of student life is not important, we're just saying the needs of the faculty outweigh the needs of the students," a college official stated.

The conversion will be completed for the 90-91 academic year. Tuition will not be raised, officials stressed. Instead students, wishing to attend classes at the new location, will be charged a user's fee.

The plans call for the transformation of Koffler Rotunda into the new faculty lounge and renamed Popper's Place, where no smoking will be permitted. Popper's Place will come complete with a full service bar (with daily happy hour), live entertainment, lighted dance floor, and satellite television.

Upon the completion of faculty suite G in the former pool area, M-wing classrooms will be converted into the Les LaFond Fitness Center. The Center will include an Olympic-size pool, ten Jacuzzis, and seven saunas. The facilities will be for faculty use only.

Salmanson Dining Hall will become the Carol Word Trueheart Cafe, a 5-star restaurant to be run by the Four Seasons Restaurant of New York. To create an atmosphere worthy of Bryant faculty, faculty suite F will be destroyed in order to return the Cafe's ceiling to its former three-story height.

"Bryant can't hope to attract faculty with the current parking conditions," college officials stated. Therefore, the entire first floor of the library will be transformed into Wheeler

Carport, a valet parking facility with a capacity of three-hundred cars.

To make the Unistructure a truly full-service faculty building, the third floor classrooms will be replaced by a full-service hotel. The Sheraton Corporation has signed a contract with the college to run the O'Hara Inne, complete with vibrating king-size beds, whirlpool tubs, cable tv, and room

Body of Jimmy Hoffa Found Beneath Pool

In a startling turn of events yesterday, construction workers removing the pool to build new faculty offices turned up the body of alleged mobster Jimmy Hoffa, buried to his waist in the concrete surrounding the pool.

Chief Richard Wheeler was the first Public Safety officer on the scene, and said "This is a startling turn of events. What this means is that somebody else is buried under the endzone at Giants Stadium." Wheeler is referring to the story that came out last year that the alleged mobster had been buried under the endzone in the Meadowlands in East Rutherford, NJ.

Workers used a jack hammer to chip away at the cement so the body could be extracted. A state police spokesman stated "we can finally put to rest all the rumors that he is buried here or he is buried there, because we've got his body as irrefutable proof that he was buried here in Smithfield."

Proof, maybe, but apparently not irrefutable. Just hours after the discovery was announced at a press conference in President Trump's office, a woman claiming to have married Hoffa last year came forward with a wedding picture. Police have taken her to a nearby mental hospital for observation.

USA TOMORROW has received anonymous tips that the body was placed in the concrete back in 1972 by alleged Providence gangster Luis "The Mexican Jumping Bean" Rivera-Schwartz. Schwartz was not able to be reached for comment on the allegations, but the USA TOMORROW offices have received several bomb threats and has been the victim of a drive-by shooting. No one has been injured.

President Trump stated "This is great publicity for the school. I'm working on a deal right now that would allow K-Mart stores to sell one ounce pieces of the cement that Hoffa was buried in to the public for only \$9.95. I call it 'Piece of the Buried Wall.'"

Newly elected Student Senate President Mark St. Pierre stated "I'm really looking forward to meeting with the crime families of Providence and New York to see if we can work out an equitable solution over where the body should be buried. Haas was also upset about the art value of the discovery. The body, Haas claims has all the makings of a sculpture, and "it would look great next to the Class of 1988's Senior Class gift."

ARA Loses Food Service

The dining service contract has been awarded to STAAF for the upcoming academic years. STAAF will replace ARA Services as the provider of meals to the Bryant College campus as of August 1, 1990.

STAAF (Students Against Atrocious Food) is a student owned and student run company that will operate as a division of Brycol, the campus student services foundation. The organization will operate as a private company under a not-for-profit charter. It will be controlled through the Brycol Board of Trustees.

The change is the first in the dining services since 1983, when ARA Services replaced SAGA. The contract will run through 1993.

Shawn Gogan, Brycol's Vice President for Food Operations and newly-elected CEO and President of STAAF, indicated that there will be many changes in the dining halls once STAAF takes over.

"STAAF's intention is to provide the students of Bryant with the best nutrition possible," stated Gogan. "We have many new plans in the process and will be ready come September."

One major change is the acquisition of a new head chef. STAAF has confirmed that world-renowned chef Julia Childs will be donning a STAAF chef's hat in September. The famous chef will be in charge of diversifying the current menu.

"I have such wonderful plans for Salamander's Hall," said Childs. "We will just wisk up the wonderful taste buds of Bryantonians campus-wide with our new selected entrees."

Gogan added that STAAF operations will be incorporated with other Brycol operations. The major change will be the availability of delivery service in conjunction with Tupper's. Due to the expansion of Tupper's (see related article, p.B1), delivery service from the Country Comfort, Tupper's, or Salmonson Dining Hall will be available during most times. The tentative delivery schedule for the fall would include deliveries every fifteen minutes to each dorm from 5

p.m. to Midnight. Delivery during Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights would extend until 3 a.m. A special feature, the delivery of Saturday and Sunday brunch to groups of at least six, will also be added to the delivery schedule.

"The delivery service will become the cornerstone of the STAAF service to students," stated Gogan. He also stated the new delivery service "should increase the public image of the dining services on this campus."

ARA Dining Services Cited for Violations

The Rhode Island Division of Unsanitary Services cited the ARA Dining Services at Bryant College for "alleged violations and abuses" regarding its workers.

ARID-US report cited the death of worker Isto Young in the Bryant Center last month. Young, 13, of Smithfield, was killed when he became entrapped in a large double broiler. The report detailed the rigorous tasks ARA workers are required to perform as part of their job, such as working twenty hour shifts over hot stoves. The most hazardous task was identified as mixing the toxic compounds that make up the "Soup of the Day."

As a result of the incident, ARA was fined by the state for the hiring of an underage worker. ARA Services defended itself by saying that Young had forged working papers showing that he was 17 years old.

Since then, an in-depth study into ARA Services has revealed that 45 percent of its workers are underage.

The RID-US has not leveled any additional fines against ARA Services. A decision in the matter is expected by late next week.

Salmon Swarms Overcome Paris

The recent change in the weather patterns that brought the harsh December and the mild February to New England has also affected Europe. In recent weeks the weather in Europe has been plagued by violent storms, with winds reaching 125 km per hour. Apart from the destruction of property, these storms have had a curious affect on nature.

Every spring, salmon swim upstream to mate at their birthplace, often overcoming impossible barriers and eventually dying of exhaustion. This year, however, naturalists are studying a new phenomena. For the first time it seems the salmon have changed their instinctive behavior patterns, and, for unexplainable reasons, have chosen an entirely new river as their eventual goal.

Reports indicate that the River Seine in France is seeing the heaviest of the salmon's spring migration. Swarms of fish are currently battling the river, that eventually leads them to Paris. "It seems that the salmon have lost their sense of direction, almost a loss of memory," reports one scientist, "We have no idea if this is a permanent change, or if the change is only for this spring."

Parisians are already noticing the arrival of the salmon, as hundreds jump onto the banks of the Seine. At first many were surprised at the unexpected arrival, while others eagerly collected the dying fish, either for sale or personal consumption. However, the salmon are collecting at such a rate that tourism is beginning to suffer.

The Paris sanitation service has been unable to cope with the epidemic, and are asking for volunteers to collect dead and decaying fish. One restaurant owner complained, "At first my customers were happy to have such fresh fish on the menu, but now the smell is driving them all away. It is a disaster. Two more weeks of this and I will be bankrupt!"

Anglers, lined up along the banks, are reeling in the fish by the dozens, something that was not possible for years as pollution increased and the fish counts fell.

"My grandfather was the last to catch a fish in the Seine. I usually have to drive many kilometers outside Paris to find a nice quiet river not destroyed by pollution" cheers one angler. What ever feelings the Parisians have to the arrival of the salmon, the fish have affectionately been named "Poisson D'Avril!"

Note: "Poisson D'Avril" means "April Fool's" in French.

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Public Safety Heads to Florida - ROTC Patrols Campus During Spring Weekend

A recently intercepted high level memo indicates that Public Safety will be sent to Florida for spring weekend and a legion of 125 ROTC cadets will resume the duties usually reserved for the public safety officers.

Participating cadets will come from Bryant, UConn, Holy Cross College, and URI. All cadets will be under the on site supervision of Captain Wolfenden. According to Wolfenden the "Area of Operation, AO will be the entire campus."

The move is an attempt to enforce the campus wide cup ban and curtail the rowdiness of the estimated 5,000 attendees of Spring Weekend. President Trump, officially out of town, has pledged to "keep the operation as clean as possible."

Student Senate President-elect, Mark St. Pierre is totally outraged. "I was hoping to make the campus a kinder, gentler campus. That doesn't seem likely now."

At dawn on Thursday the cadets will arrive in a spectacular parachute drop. In addition to the 125 cadets, 4 M48 tanks retrofitted with water cannons, 2 HUMMER vehicles, and assorted supplies necessary to sustain the operation will be air dropped.

As far as weaponry is concerned the cadets will be armed only with rubber bullet firing assault

weapons.

Lot C-3 will serve as the staging area for the operation. The security cameras already in place there will provide security against counter-attacks by students.

The third floor of the Bryant Center will serve as Headquarters (HQ) for the operation and the guard post on Jacobs Drive will be renamed Checkpoint Charlie for the duration of the operation.

A team from the Army Corps of Engineers is expected to arrive on campus within a week to begin modifications.

The operation, widely publicized in military circles will be observed by officials from dozens of colleges across the country. If all works well this sort of operation may be adopted by other institutions. Furthermore, as Defense Department spending is cut the possibility of the government hiring out the Marines as college police forces exists.

Any student who's car is damaged during the air drop or during any part of the operation is asked to submit a certified damage estimate to the bursars office no later than the Friday immediately after the operation. Forms will be available there and adjusters from the "Big Six" insurance firms will be on campus all day Wednesday and Thursday to handle claims.

FORMER BRYANT President William O'Hara has started a new publishing company specializing in those little informational brochures that Career Services distributes. The company, Doc O Inc., has not yet been able to secure Bryant as a client due to the process of bidding that the College forces all publications to go through.

BRYANT COLLEGE has issued a new low security "junk" bond to finance the move to Nebraska. Investors can purchase bonds with face values from \$1,000 to \$5,000, with a guaranteed return of .00000001% of tuition (about nine-thousandths of one cent.)

IN WHAT HAS BEEN TERMED the block buster deal of the decade, Richard Spivak has announced plans to buy Rockefeller Center from the Japanese for 1.2 trillion. Spivak will be financing the deal with help of an investment group headed by Edgar Tatro, and has plans to convert Rockefeller Center into a religious refuge for Hare Krishnas, complete with an auditorium where Tatro will be the feature performer, giving five hour lectures on Kennedy's assassination every six hours.

THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC SAFETY (OOPS) has announced that they are currently in the midst of an employee buyout bid. Tupper's Goes National

Tupper's, the Brycol run pizza and grinder establishment located in the Bryant Center, has announced that it will enfranchise itself to colleges across the nation this summer.

The move was spurred by the growing demands for its services on campus, according to Brycol Vice President Shawn Gogan.

The franchise packaging will include the Tupper's logo, rights to all Tupper's secret recipes, and any extra Pepsi cups that remain after the end of the current school year. Tupper's franchises will maintain the same menu at all locations. However, some local entrees may be added at the franchises, provided they are approved by the Brycol Board of Trustees.

To date, twelve franchise locations have been announced. Boston University, Northeastern University, and the Massachusetts College of Pharmaceuticals, all in Boston, Massachusetts, will open Tupper's franchises in September. Columbia University in New York City will open a franchise in October. Harvard University is scheduled to open a franchise in late November or early December.

Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland and Georgetown University in Washington D.C. are slated to open Tupper's franchises in December. The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Louisiana State University are slated to open their franchises in January 1991.

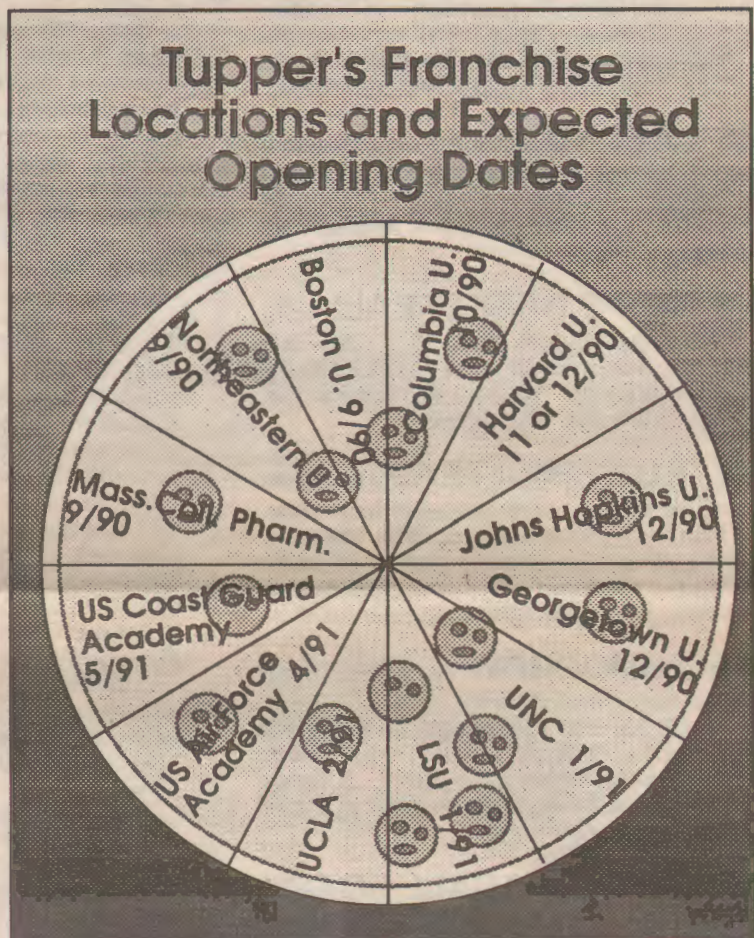
UCLA and UCal at Berkley will bring Tupper's to the west coast in February 1991. The US Air Force Academy in Colorado and the US Coast Guard Academy in New York will be the first two branches of the military to acquire Tupper's franchises, scheduled to open in April and May 1991 respectively.

Another Tupper's location will be at the new Bryant Campus in Nebraska. This location will not be considered a franchise. It will be an extension of the original Smithfield location of Tupper's. The original Tupper's will still provide service to the Bryant Community even

after the campus move. Direct express delivery service to the new campus from Smithfield will be featured until the new Tupper's location in Nebraska can be built.

The expanded locales will mean an increase in the expansion of the delivery service from Tupper's. Tupper's delivery

times for the fall have tentatively been scheduled for every fifteen minutes to each dorm from 5 p.m. to Midnight. Service on Friday and Saturday evenings will be extended to 3 a.m. The delivery service would also make deliveries for the Country Comfort and the STAAF dining services at Bryant.

Federal Detention Center to Save Bryant Big Bucks

According to a recent pole by Duey, Cheat'em, and Howe, the official accounting firm of Bryant College, 76 percent of Bryant residents favor a prison being built next door. Student Frank Leone says, "maybe we'd finally have some excitement around here." Of those over 60 percent actually favor going to prison over staying at Bryant. Some cited their reason as being, "because prison is a hell of alot cheaper." Another student remarked, "the inmates will be great to party with."

The administration is currently hammering out a deal with prison officials. According to Executive Vice President Trueheart, the college is "has the duty to provide for the needs and wants of students."

Also, Dorm 15 could easily be converted to Block 15. The ousted students would be tripled up in other dorms. Housing rates would remain the same however.

"We'll really be making money now", exclaimed Joe Meichelbeck.

In an attempt to reduce the Public Safety payroll, detainees awaiting trial will be utilized on campus. Now, instead of students returning to find their illegally parked car booted, they will return to a doorless hunk of steel supported by four cinder blocks. Chief Wheeler only giggled when asked to comment.

The creation of 5 internships at the prison, available only to juniors and seniors will be created. Also, thirty-five ten hour work-study positions will be available at the facility as one form of student aid.

Bryant to Join Penn State as New Member of Big Ten

With a face obviously beaming with pride, Athletic Director Leon Drury announced yesterday that Bryant College will be admitted as the newest member of the Big-10 conference beginning in the 1991-'92 season.

"This is a key moment in the history of Bryant sports," stated Drury. "This will bring us national recognition and T.V. money from the Big Ten Television network."

Bryant will be making the leap to Division I with all of its athletic teams. Plans for a new 10,000 seat basketball stadium have been developed. The stadium will be located with easy access to via monorail the three level parking garage that has been planned for the new Nebraska campus (see campus map, p 1A). The stadium will be open in 1995. Until then, the Indians will play in their home away from home in the Omaha Civic Center, sharing time with the Nebraska Community College Seed Planters. "We don't anticipate any conflict with the Planters," stated Drury. "If there are any conflicts, I'm sure they will be easily worked out." Non-conference home games will be played in the new MAC.

President Trump has promised to donate his shuttle to the team in order to make road trips easier on the players.

When asked if the jump to Division I had anything to do with the AACSB accreditation, Vice-President for Student Affairs Les LaFond stated "This was not a move designed specifically for AACSB. We had been considering Division I for some time, and when we were offered the #12 spot in the league, we jumped at it."

Men's coach Ed Reilly responded to the plan saying "This fits well into my plan to rebuild the team. This will help us to get more blue-chip recruits because we'll be on T.V. I can see the Big Dance

in our future by 1997 - I call it my seven year plan."

Bryant's football program will become a reality with the jump, also becoming a member of the Big Ten conference, beginning in 1992. Student

Senator Rob Covino stated "This program has gone beyond my wildest dreams. To think that 15 months ago this plan was only a Division III dream and now we will be playing in the Big Ten...its amazing."

Drury Expected to take N.C. State Job

Athletic Director Leon Drury is expected to announce today that at the end of the academic year he will leave Bryant in order to take the head coaching job at vacated by Jim Valvano at North Carolina State.

Drury is one of several candidates who has been to Raleigh in the wake of the point shaving scandal that led to the dismissal of Valvano as head coach of the Wolfpack. Says Drury, "I have been to North Carolina to interview for the position, but at this time I am not at liberty to disclose any further details."

An N.C. State insider has informed USA TOMORROW that Drury has signed a five year contract worth at least \$85,000 a year, plus added incentives of \$10,000 per NCAA Tournament round, and \$20,000 for getting to the Final Four.

USA TOMORROW has contacted Nike, Reebok, and Converse. All confirmed that they had offered Drury a shoe contract. The Reebok spokesperson stated that the contract offered by his company "was for an adequate sum of money."

Jim Valvano was contacted over the phone yesterday, and stated "Leon Drury is from where? Smithfield, R.I.? Is that near Providence, because I have some buddies up in Providence that he should meet. They'd make him a deal he couldn't refuse, if ya' know what I mean."

Other people interviewed for the job include Kentucky's Rick Pitino, Providence's Rick Barnes, and New York Knick's coach Stu Jackson. N.C. State's Athletic Department denied USA TOMORROW's request for an interview with an assistant A.D., but an N.C. State insider revealed "Pitino is too uptight, Barnes couldn't beat Ohio State, and Stu Jackson wanted too much money. So its up to you to figure out who is left."

Reaction to the story has been mixed.

Director of Sports Information John Gillooly stated "I'll be sorry to see Lee go - he's a great guy and he's easy to beat at Poker."

Newly elected Student Senate President Mark St. Pierre said "I'm looking forward to meeting the new Athletic Director, and I'm hoping to show Mr. Drury that all of the students of Bryant wish him well in his future ventures by sending the entire community on an all expense paid trip to see N.C. State's home opener next season."

Candidates mentioned as possible a replacement Athletic Director include Mike Tyson, who would retire from boxing to take the job, Olympic Gold Medalist Carl Lewis, who would retire from singing, and Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis. A decision on Drury's replacement is expected within one month.

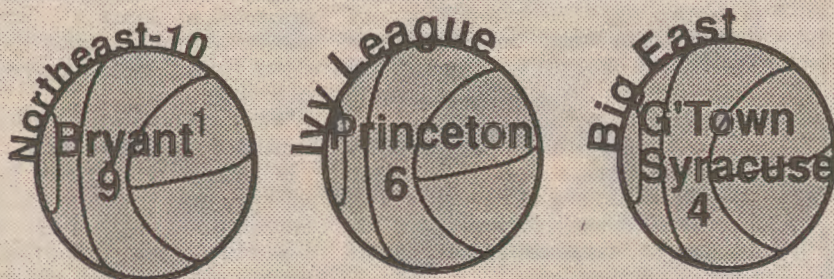

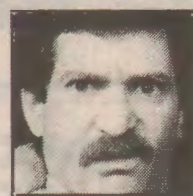
unseeded team of jockey Bill Shoemaker and professional wrestler Mt. Fuji.

The lilting voice of Ellen Servetnick rises above it all as she adopts Billy Joel's "New York State of Mind" to the rhythm that by now the entire band has picked up. "I find this relaxes me when I'm finished a hard day of meetings with student leaders."
