Cultural Valorisation

A comprehensive and pondered perspective for the evaluation of small museums

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Propositions

To accompany the thesis "Cultural Valorisation – A comprehensive and pondered perspective for the evaluation of small museums", by JOSÉ ALDO DO CARMO JUNIOR.

- 1. Small museums are different from large museums. They are small organisations, with limited budget, polyvalent staff and volunteers in charge of key functions (this thesis).
- 2. Purposes are the fundamental reasons for the existence of an organisation. Museums should be faithful to their purposes, which are usually reflected in their productions (this thesis).
- 3. 'Purpose-drift' is the deviation from the own purposes of the organisation, as consequence of excess or deficiency of managerial practices (managerialism), bureaucracy (bureaupathology), or marketing (marketisation) (this thesis).
- 4. Museums are hybrid organisations. They combine two identities: the normative related to its purpose (here named Cultural Activities), and the utilitarian concerning museums' operations (here named Support Activities) (this thesis).
- 5. Cultural Activities and Support Activities may be in conflict due to their nature. The dynamic equilibrium between conflicting identities is crucial for the success of hybrid organisations (this thesis).
- 6. Exhibitions, publications, studies, educational programs and tours constitute Cultural Activities. These contribute to the evolving cultural capital of visitors, as direct consequence of the visit (this thesis).
- 7. Support Activities are divided in four clusters: Collection-related, Non-collection-related, Finance-related, and Stakeholders-related activities. Stakeholders are individualized in three groups: Internal (staff), External (direct influencers), and visitors (professional- and amateur-visitors).
- 8. This study introduces the Cultural Valorisation Method an evaluation programme designed for small museums considering them hybrid organisations, aiming the long-term equilibrium of the Cultural Activities and Support Activities, towards the creation of relevant and lasting museums (this thesis).
