The role of musculoskeletal symptoms and physical work factors

- 1. The support from colleagues, team and supervisors is indispensable to keep students and novice nurses motivated and committed to the profession. (this thesis)
- 2. Overweight nursing students are less able to do their job because they endure more physical health problems. (this thesis)
