ST. MARY'S MOOT COURT TEAM SHINES AT SUMMER TYLA STATE MOOT COURT COMPETITION

This summer, the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team competed against some of the best law schools in the country in the Texas Young Lawyer's Association State Moot Court Competition (TYLA SMC). The competition is open to every law school in the state and involves a round robin format where every Texas school competes against every other Texas school, with the top four teams vying for the opportunity to present their arguments in the Championship Round to the actual justices/judges of the Texas Supreme Court or Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. TYLA SMC is the premier state

moot court competition in the country, primarily because of the excellence of Texas moot court teams and the annual participation of either the sitting members of the Texas Supreme Court or the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. For example, this year, six of the seven teams competing at TYLA SMC were from law schools whose moot court programs are ranked Top-25 in the nation, with four of the seven schools ranked in the Top-10. Coy Westbrook (graduated 3L) and Haley Harvey (rising 3L) argued every round on behalf of St. Mary's. Jamie Weber (rising 2L) served as the bailiff for the team. Westbrook and Harvey broke second at the competition, beating the ABA NAAC National Champion team from Texas Tech along the way, and lost on a split decision to Baylor (the eventual Champion) in the semi-final round. Coy Westbrook received the award for best brief at the competition, while Coy and Haley also took two of the three top advocate awards - Coy was awarded 3rd Best Oralist and Haley was recognized as the Best Oral Advocate in Texas. This tournament was the first in-person competition for the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team since Natsumi Covey ('20) and Emily Reed ('20) won the championship round of the ABA NAAC Washington, DC Regional in 2020. Please congratulate these stellar advocates for their great start to the coming moot court year!

FALL 2022 COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

As the Fall 2022 semester commences, St. Mary's University will continue to enforce coronavirus-related policies that are in line with CDC guidelines.  directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.

DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for studerts and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

• This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted – but students are welcome to reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not necessary to alert the law school administration – as they will receive a notice from the SHC

directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.

 Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.

CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.


THE HON. LARRY E. KELLY BANKRUPTCY AMERICAN INN OF COURT

The members of The Hon. Larry E. Kelly Bankruptcy American Inn of Court are split into 6 pupillage teams, comprised of a mix of Masters, Barristers, Associates and Pupils from Austin and San Antonio. There are both consumer and commercial bankruptcy specialists and all the WDTX bankruptcy judges are active members. Each pupillage team is assigned one presentation per year. Our meetings are held in Austin, San Antonio and San Marcos (and sometimes virtually).

Dues are waived for law students. Because there are both an Austin and San Antonio Inn of Court, typically there are law students from both St. Mary's and UT law schools. You will find our meetings to be both educational and fun. DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or

occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.

DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a

timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.

DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.



ST. MARY'S NATIONAL MOOT COURT TEAM DOMINATES AT MACK KIDD MOOT COURT COMPETITION

Over this past weekend, the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team competed in the 25th Annual Mack Kidd Administrative Law State Moot Court Competition in Austin, Texas.

St. Mary's sent three teams to the moot court tournament: Haley Harvey (3L), Kathryn Cantu (3L) and Matthew Kiehn (2L) and Caitlin Sullivan (2L) and Rylee Stanley (2L) and Leslie Espiricueta (2L), Joseph Henk (2L) and Samantha Martinez (2L). The tournament is sponsored by the Administrative and Public Law Section of the State Bar of Texas and is open to all ABA accredited law schools within the State of Texas. The Championship Round was judged by Chief Justice Byrne, and Associate Justices Baker and Smith of the Third Court of Appeals.

The teams of Harvey/Cantu and Sullivan/Stanley both broke to the Semi-Final Round, and both teams beat Baylor's top teams in the Semis to close out the Finals.

In the All St. Mary's Championship Round, Harvey and Cantu prevailed, taking First Place, while Sullivan and Stanley placed a close second. In addition to St. Mary's winning the competition, Kathryn Cantu and Haley Harvey were named Co-Best Advocates in the Championship Round (the first time the tournament has ever named Co-Best Advocates), Matthew Kiehn was awarded the Best Brief, and Joseph Henk was named Best Advocate in the Preliminary Rounds.

This is St. Mary's third Mack Kidd State Moot Court Championship in the last four years. Congratulations to all of these great advocates!






THE HON. LARRY E. KELLY BANKRUPTCY AMERICAN INN OF COURT



CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.

The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.



BIG WEEK FOR THE NATIONAL TEAM

The National Team had teams competing across the country this past weekend and brought home a lot of hardware. It all got started with the Best Brief, a Quarter Final, two Semi-Finals and one Championship finish. Congratulations to all of the students and coaches who worked so hard for an amazing weekend. Here is what happened:

St. Mary's National Moot Court Team Finishes Top-8 at Veterans Law Moot Court Competition Over the weekend, the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team traveled to Washington, DC to compete in the National Veterans Law Moot Court Competition (NVLMCC) sponsored by George Washington University School of Law. The NVLMCC is the premiere moot court tournament on issues involving America's veterans, and this year included a record 30 teams from law schools across the country. Two teams composed of 2L students participating at their first external competition took part in the tournament on behalf of the National Moot Court Team: Carson Wienecke and Erica Marrow and Berenis Lopez and Isaac Palacio. Wienecke and Marrow reached the quarter-finals of the competition, just missing the semi-finals on a split ballot, while Carson Wienecke was further awarded the Best Respondent's Brief. This tournament is the fourth competition of the year for the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team, and the fourth consecutive tournament where St. Mary's students reached the elite eight or better of their respective moot court competitions. The efforts of these advocates means that the Moot Court Team has already this competition year garnered one championship, one finalist, one semi-finalist, two quarterfinalist and one octo-finalist finish. This is also the third "Best Brief" award for the team this year, to go along with two "Best Oralist" awards. The team will conclude its stellar Fall semester in two weeks at the Chicago Bar Association National Moot Court Competition. Please congratulate Carson, Erica, Berenis and Isaac for their strong advocacy performances this weekend.

National Trial Team Reaches Semis in the 2nd Most Prestigious Tournament in the County

For the National Trial Team, performances in the Spring decide which tournaments you go to in the fall. St. Mary's National Trial Team was invited to three of the four most important tournaments with the second most important, the National Civil Trial Competition taking place this past weekend. Of the sixteen schools participating, the lowest ranked team was in the high teens. 3L's **Mariela Encinas, Leigh Ann Greenberg** and **Ryan Vereen** along with newcomer, 2L **Griffin Farney**, represented St. Mary's. With a difficult draw or National Champion UCLA, followed by Georgetown, American and Campbell, St. Mary's advanced to the Semi-final round to face UCLA once again, where they lost to the eventual tournament champion. ""I was super excited. They did so well against the best schools in the country" said Head Coach Jason Goss who was assisted by Adjunct Professor Maritza Stewart and Jackson Goss. Congratulations to all of the members of the team including our practice teams who stayed up late to get this team ready.


National Trial Team 2L's Go the Distance

Please see the below information regarding Fall 2022 final exams.

Important information regarding the upcoming Fall 2022 Exam Administration, November 29 -December 12, 2022, is listed below and on the attached materials. Please read all this information carefully to ensure you have the materials and information you need for Fall 2022 Exams, including the updated Exam Schedule with room assignments.

Instructions for each specific exam administration – In-person; Examplify (remote); and Dropbox – will be sent by Ms. Olfers in a separate email. If you have specific questions about your exams, please contact your faculty members.

Anonymous Exam PIN Numbers

Each student is given a four-digit anonymous exam number each semester, which is the ONLY student identification placed on examination responses. <u>Do not place your name on any exam</u> materials – doing so is an Honor Code violation.

Students access their exam PIN number on Gateway, either via "LAUNCHPAD" then "LAW" and "Law Student Pin," or using the "LAW" tab at the top right, then below "Related Links," "Exam Pin Number" and click on "View My Pin." A student who does not see the exam number should contact the University's IT department (<u>helpdesk@stmarytx.edu</u> or 210-431-4357) to correct the problem. The use of an incorrect exam number on a final exam may cause the student not to receive a grade, as the professor will be unable to reconcile the grade with the correct anonymous exam number. A student who uses an incorrect exam number should contact Ms. Yvonne Olfers (<u>yolfers@stmarytx.edu</u>) and provide the course name and professor, incorrect exam number used, and student ID#.

Using ExamSoft/Examplify to Laptop Exam Answers

For in-person exams that will allow students to use a laptop for their answers, and for remote Examplify exams, students <u>MUST have the latest version of Softest from ExamSoft/Examplify</u> downloaded on the laptop the students will use for exams. It is critical that any student planning on using their laptop for exams <u>take SEVERAL PRACTICE TESTS</u> (password is mock123). This is particularly important for students taking exams remotely.

Questions about ExamSoft/Examplify should be directed to the Law School's IT Department at <u>lawtech@stmarytx.edu</u>, 210-431-6721, or their offices in Room 101 of the Raba Law Faculty Building. Ms. Olfers will send you additional instructions about ExamSoft/Examplify if you have an exam scheduled that requires this software.

If you are planning to check out a laptop from Law IT during an exam, email <u>lawtech@stmarytx.edu</u> for <u>a reservation</u> and for further instructions <u>at least one (1) full business day before your</u> <u>scheduled exam(s)</u>. Please note that there is no last-minute capacity to check out laptops – you must have a proper reservation scheduled at least one full business day in advance. All laptops are due back at the Law IT office at the end of each exam.

Posting Fall 2022 Grades

No grades are posted during the exam period (November 29 – December 12, 2022), or while the

University is closed for the Christmas Holidays (December 19, 2022 - January 2, 2023). If a faculty member submits grades prior to the holiday break, the Director of Student Records will process and post those grades on <u>Tuesday, December 13, shortly before 5:00 pm; this is the only day</u> grades will be posted prior to the break.

All remaining grades will be processed when the University reopens on Tuesday, January 3, 2023; the grading deadline for faculty to submit their grades is 5:00 pm on that date. As such, barring any unforeseen issues or late grade submissions, you will be able to see all grades by the end of the day on Wednesday, January 4, 2023. If you do not see one of your course grades by the end of the day on January 4, please reach out to your faculty member to inquire. Grades are reviewed to ensure they meet grade rules before being posted.

Once posted, students can view their individual grades on Gateway, "LAUNCHPAD," "STUDENTS," "My Student Profile" then "View Grades" underneath the student's ID picture.

An exam review period will be opened for 30 days once all Fall 2022 grades are entered and processed. You will receive an email on Friday, January 6, 2023, announcing the exam review period dates. Dean's List and other academic honors will be announced by email on or before January 20, 2023.

Please carefully review the below exam policies, which will be in effect for Fall 2022.



PRO BONO PROGRAM

J.D. students who complete 100 hours of pro bono service, community service, or any combination thereof during their legal studies are eligible to receive the Pro Bono and Public Service Certificate at Commencement. One graduating student who demonstrates exceptional commitment to public service



will be recognized with the Public Service Award at Commencement. Additionally, students in each level of study who demonstrate outstanding commitment and achievements in public service are eligible for recognition at the end of the academic year.

COMMUNITY SERVICE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. 
THE HON. LARRY E. KELLY BANKRUPTCY AMERICAN INN OF COURT

CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED





FALL 2022 - FINAL EXAM INFORMATION

Please see the below information regarding Fall 2022 final exams.

Important information regarding the upcoming Fall 2022 Exam Administration, November 29 -December 12, 2022, is listed below and on the attached materials. Please read all this information carefully to ensure you have the materials and information you need for Fall 2022 Exams, including the updated Exam Schedule with room assignments.

Instructions for each specific exam administration – In-person; Examplify (remote); and Dropbox – will be sent by Ms. Olfers in a separate email. If you have specific questions about your exams, please contact your faculty members.

Anonymous Exam PIN Numbers

Each student is given a four-digit anonymous exam number each semester, which is the ONLY student identification placed on examination responses. Do not place your name on any exam materials – doing so is an Honor Code violation.

Students access their exam PIN number on Gateway, either via "LAUNCHPAD" then "LAW" and "Law Student Pin," or using the "LAW" tab at the top right, then below "Related Links," "Exam Pin Number" and click on "View My Pin." A student who does not see the exam number should contact the University's IT department (<u>helpdesk@stmarytx.edu</u> or 210-431-4357) to correct the problem. The use of an incorrect exam number on a final exam may cause the student not to receive a grade, as the professor will be unable to reconcile the grade with the correct anonymous exam number. A student who uses an incorrect exam number should contact Ms. Yvonne Olfers (<u>yolfers@stmarytx.edu</u>) and provide the course name and professor, incorrect exam number used, and student ID#.

Using ExamSoft/Examplify to Laptop Exam Answers

For in-person exams that will allow students to use a laptop for their answers, and for remote Examplify exams, students <u>MUST have the latest version of Softest from ExamSoft/Examplify</u> downloaded on the laptop the students will use for exams. It is critical that any student planning on using their laptop for exams <u>take SEVERAL PRACTICE TESTS</u> (password is mock123). This is particularly important for students taking exams remotely.

Questions about ExamSoft/Examplify should be directed to the Law School's IT Department at <u>lawtech@stmarytx.edu</u>, 210-431-6721, or their offices in Room 101 of the Raba Law Faculty Building. Ms. Olfers will send you additional instructions about ExamSoft/Examplify if you have an exam scheduled that requires this software.

If you are planning to check out a laptop from Law IT during an exam, email <u>lawtech@stmarytx.edu</u> for <u>a reservation</u> and for further instructions <u>at least one (1) full business day before your</u> <u>scheduled exam(s)</u>. Please note that there is no last-minute capacity to check out laptops – you must have a proper reservation scheduled at least one full business day in advance. All laptops are due back at the Law IT office at the end of each exam.

Posting Fall 2022 Grades

No grades are posted during the exam period (November 29 – December 12, 2022), or while the University is closed for the Christmas Holidays (December 19, 2022 - January 2, 2023). If a faculty member submits grades prior to the holiday break, the Director of Student Records will process and post those grades on <u>Tuesday, December 13, shortly before 5:00 pm; this is the only day</u> grades will be posted prior to the break.

All remaining grades will be processed when the University reopens on Tuesday, January 3, 2023; the grading deadline for faculty to submit their grades is 5:00 pm on that date. As such barring any

unforeseen issues or late grade submissions, you will be able to see all grades by the end of the day on Wednesday, January 4, 2023. If you do not see one of your course grades by the end of the day on January 4, please reach out to your faculty member to inquire. Grades are reviewed to ensure they meet grade rules before being posted.

Once posted, students can view their individual grades on Gateway, "LAUNCHPAD," "STUDENTS," "My Student Profile" then "View Grades" underneath the student's ID picture.

An exam review period will be opened for 30 days once all Fall 2022 grades are entered and processed. You will receive an email on Friday, January 6, 2023, announcing the exam review period dates. Dean's List and other academic honors will be announced by email on or before January 20, 2023.



DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law

Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

REGISTERED STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS (RSO)

All Law RSO events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean of Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.

STUDENT E-MAIL ACCOUNTS

Each student is assigned a Law School e-mail account and is required to check this account daily. Faculty and the Administration use e-mail to communicate with students and to send official notices. Students are deemed to have knowledge of all communications from the Faculty and Administration sent to their Law School e-mail address. Therefore, not checking the school email account is not an acceptable defense for not responding to information disseminated by email. Additionally, various professors may have more specific requirements with respect to e-mail, TWEN, and Canvas classrooms.

INVITING DIGNITARIES TO CAMPUS? WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

All law school registered student organizations (RSO) are reminded to submit a request for approval PRIOR to inviting a dignitary to the School of Law. The form must be completed prior to contacting and inviting a dignitary to campus. Requests should be made 45-days prior to the scheduled event. A Visiting Dignitary includes, diplomats, local public figures including but not limited to, the Archbishop of San Antonio, judges, and other elected officials. CDC COVID-19 GUIDANCE UPDATED

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its COVID-19 guidance for quarantine and isolation. St. Mary's will continue to follow <u>CDC guidance</u> using these new updates for students and employees who are ill or exposed to COVID-19.



The primary change in the guidance is that after two negative COVID-19 tests after Day 5 of isolation, you may return to work/class while continuing to wear your mask through Day 10. employees and students should test twice after Day 5 and report those results before returning to work or classes.

Students who experience COVID-19 symptoms should self-report to the <u>Student Health Center</u> and follow protocols for isolation and quarantine. The SHC will notify the law school Administration, who in turn will ask faculty to provide recordings for missed classes for the period of official COVID quarantine. Any class absences during official University-sanctioned quarantine will not count towards attendance policies.

- This is an automatic process and all your faculty is alerted but students are welcome to
 reach out to their individual faculty directly if there are questions or concerns. It is not
 necessary to alert the law school administration as they will receive a notice from the SHC
 directly, and that is what will trigger faculty notice on the Administrative end.
- Please note that faculty are not required to record their classes outside an official University accommodation.





Important information regarding the upcoming Fall 2022 Exam Administration, November 29 -December 12, 2022, is listed below and on the attached materials. Please read all this information carefully to ensure you have the materials and information you need for Fall 2022 Exams, including the updated Exam Schedule with room assignments.

Instructions for each specific exam administration – In-person; Examplify (remote); and Dropbox – will be sent by Ms. Olfers in a separate email. If you have specific questions about your exams, please contact your faculty members.

Anonymous Exam PIN Numbers

Each student is given a four-digit anonymous exam number each semester, which is the ONLY student identification placed on examination responses. <u>Do not place your name on any exam</u> materials – doing so is an Honor Code violation.

Students access their exam PIN number on Gateway, either via "LAUNCHPAD" then "LAW" and "Law Student Pin," or using the "LAW" tab at the top right, then below "Related Links," "Exam Pin Number" and click on "View My Pin." A student who does not see the exam number should contact the University's IT department (<u>helpdesk@stmarytx.edu</u> or 210-431-4357) to correct the problem.

Using ExamSoft/Examplify to Laptop Exam Answers

For in-person exams that will allow students to use a laptop for their answers, and for remote Examplify exams, students <u>MUST have the latest version of Softest from ExamSoft/Examplify</u> downloaded on the laptop the students will use for exams. It is critical that any student planning on using their laptop for exams <u>take SEVERAL PRACTICE TESTS</u> (password is mock123). This is particularly important for students taking exams remotely.

Ms. Olfers will send you additional instructions about ExamSoft/Examplify if you have an exam scheduled that requires this software.

If you are planning to check out a laptop from Law IT during an exam, email <u>lawtech@stmarytx.edu</u> for <u>a reservation</u> and for further instructions <u>at least one (1) full business day before your</u> <u>scheduled exam(s)</u>. Please note that there is no last-minute capacity to check out laptops – you must have a proper reservation scheduled at least one full business day in advance. All laptops are due back at the Law IT office at the end of each exam.

Posting Fall 2022 Grades

No grades are posted during the exam period (November 29 – December 12, 2022), or while the University is closed for the Christmas Holidays (December 19, 2022 - January 2, 2023). If a faculty member submits grades prior to the holiday break, the Director of Student Records will process and post those grades on <u>Tuesday, December 13, shortly before 5:00 pm; this is the only day</u> grades will be posted prior to the break.

All remaining grades will be processed when the University reopens on Tuesday, January 3, 2023; the grading deadline for faculty to submit their grades is 5:00 pm on that date. As such, barring any unforeseen issues or late grade submissions, you will be able to see all grades by the end of the day on Wednesday, January 4, 2023. If you do not see one of your course grades by the end of the day on January 4, please reach out to your faculty member to inquire. Grades are reviewed to ensure they meet grade rules before being posted.

Once posted, students can view their individual grades on Gateway, "LAUNCHPAD," "STUDENTS," "My Student Profile" then "View Grades" underneath the student's ID picture.

An exam review period will be opened for 30 days once all Fall 2022 grades are entered and processed. You will receive an email on Friday, January 6, 2023, announcing the exam review period dates. Dean's List and other academic honors will be announced by email on or before January 20, 2023.

ST. MARY'S NATIONAL MOOT COURT TEAM CLOSES OUT FINALS ROUND, WINS NATINAL CHAMPIONSHIP AND BEST BRIEF

This weekend the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team traveled to New York City to compete in the 18th Annual National Immigration Law Competition sponsored by New York University School of Law. This national moot court competition involves cutting edge issues in the field of immigration law and draws teams from across the country, including this year's twenty-eight (28) teams from such law schools as Chicago-Kent, Columbia, Emory, Northwestern, Seton Hall, Temple, California, Miami, Virginia and UNLV. This was the first year that St. Mary's competed in this prestigious tournament.

The St. Mary's National Moot Court Team fielded two teams: Haley Harvey (3L), Emily Mann (2L) and Kathryn Cantu (3L) and Carson Wienecke (2L) and Berenis Lopez (2L). BOTH TEAMS reached the Final Round of the competition, arguing an ALL ST. MARY'S CHAMPIONSHIP ROUND before judges from the Ninth and Eleventh Circuits, as well as the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York. The team of Harvey, Mann and Cantu was declared National Champions with Wienecke and Lopez recognized as this year's Second Place Team. Cantu was further recognized as having the Best Competition Brief at the tournament. Harvey and Mann argued all seven rounds for their team, as did Wienecke and Lopez.

This tournament win marks the third moot court championship this year for Cantu and Harvey, and the first national championship for Emily Mann.

Please congratulate all of these amazing student advocates for their incredible achievements on behalf of St. Mary's University School of Law and the National Moot Court Team.

A one point difference kept one team from the semifinal round and the other from the championship round. 



ST. MARY'S NATINAL CHAMPION MOOT COURT TEAM WINS THIRD CONSECUTIVE NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

Over the weekend, two teams comprised of members of the **St. Mary's National Moot Court Team** traveled to Williamsburg, Virginia for the 52nd Annual William B. Spong Jr. National Moot Court Competition.

The competition took place at William & Mary Law School. The **all 2L teams** of **Rylee Stanley and Layne Mustian** *and* **Caitlin Sullivan** *and* **Isaac Palacio** competed against 42 other teams from some of the best advocacy schools across the United States, with Stanley and Mustian advancing to the Championship Round. With questions coming from a panel of nine (9) "Supreme Court" justices, including actual judges and justices from federal district courts, the Virginia Supreme Court, and magistrate judges, **Stanley and Mustian** bested a talented team from Washington University School of Law to claim the **National Championship**.

This is the FIRST TIME in the 20+ year history of the National Moot Court Team that an all 2L team has won a national championship. It is the National Moot Court Team's 34th Championship and the third consecutive national championship for the moot court team this year. With this championship, St. Mary's Moot Court has more national championships this year than any other moot court advocacy program in the country.

FEDERAL COURT JUDICIAL INTERNSHIPS IN SAN ANTONIO

Semesters: Summer 2023, Fall 2023, and Spring 2024 Deadline: Noon Wednesday, March 1, 2023



Applications are now being accepted for roughly fifteen pre-

graduation judicial internships with federal judges who have chambers in San Antonio. Check your law school email account for a message containing: (1) the Pre-graduation Judicial Internship brochure; (2) an application form; and (3) application announcement. Copies of these same materials are available from the receptionist's desk on the second floor of the Raba Law Building.

The United States District Court

At the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, internships will be available with the Honorable David A. Ezra, the Honorable Xavier Rodriguez, and the Honorable Jason K. Pulliam. Interns will assist the judges with a variety of tasks, which may include rulings on motions, preparation of jury charges, and research and writing related to trial court litigation. Interns at the U.S. District Court will have the opportunity to observe courtroom proceedings.

United States District Court interns are normally required to work 120 hours during the semester at the federal courthouse in downtown San Antonio and may earn two pass/fail credits, for which tuition must be paid. (See the *Pre-Graduation Judicial Internships* brochure for details.) *Successful internship candidates typically have a very strong academic record.*

Judge Pulliam offers not-for-credit internships that have different time requirements. He has emphasized that the application process for internships with his court is open to all law students.

The United States Magistrate Court

At the United States Magistrate Court, one internship may be available each semester with the


Honorable Henry Bemporad. In the internship with Judge Bemporad, a student is required to work 240 hours in exchange for four <u>graded</u> credits. The Bemporad internship is designed to be especially demanding and to provide for intensive supervision of the intern's research and writing. This internship can be a valuable credential and steppingstone to a post-graduation judicial clerkship. Magistrate judges handle motions and other matters at the request of the United States District Court and may preside over trials with the consent of the parties. *Successful candidates typically have a very strong academic record and must submit a writing sample.*

The United States Bankruptcy Court

At the United States Bankruptcy Court, one or more internships may be available during the summer semester with the Honorable Craig Gargotta. Interns are required to work 120 hours during the semester at the Hipolito F. Garcia Federal Building and United States Courthouse in downtown San Antonio near the Alamo. Interns assist the judge with matters related to bankruptcy proceedings. *Successful candidates typically have a very strong academic record.* Prior completion of a course on Bankruptcy Law is useful but not required.

All Law RSO events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean of Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.

LAW STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES





Federal Court Judicial Internships in San Antonio

Semesters: Summer 2023, Fall 2023, and Spring 2024 Deadline: Noon Wednesday, March 1, 2023



Applications are now being accepted for roughly fifteen pregraduation judicial internships with federal judges who have

chambers in San Antonio. Check your law school email account for a message containing: (1) the Pre-graduation Judicial Internship brochure; (2) an application form; and (3) application announcement. Copies of these same materials are available from the receptionist's desk on the second floor of the Raba Law Building.

The United States District Court

At the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, internships will be available with the Honorable David A. Ezra, the Honorable Xavier Rodriguez, and the Honorable Jason K. Pulliam. Interns will assist the judges with a variety of tasks, which may include rulings on motions, preparation of jury charges, and research and writing related to trial court litigation. Interns at the U.S. District Court will have the opportunity to observe courtroom proceedings.

United States District Court interns are normally required to work 120 hours during the semester at the federal courthouse in downtown San Antonio and may earn two pass/fail credits, for which tuition must be paid. (See the *Pre-Graduation Judicial Internships* brochure for details.) *Successful internship candidates typically have a very strong academic record.*

Judge Pulliam offers not-for-credit internships that have different time requirements. He has emphasized that the application process for internships with his court is open to all law students.

The United States Magistrate Court

At the United States Magistrate Court, one internship may be available each semester with the Honorable Henry Bemporad. In the internship with Judge Bemporad, a student is required to work *240 hours in exchange for four graded credits.* The Bemporad internship is designed to be especially demanding and to provide for intensive supervision of the intern's research and writing. This internship can be a valuable credential and steppingstone to a post-graduation judicial clerkship. Magistrate judges handle motions and other matters at the request of the United States District Court and may preside over trials with the consent of the parties. *Successful candidates typically have a very strong academic record and must submit a writing sample.*

The United States Bankruptcy Court

At the United States Bankruptcy Court, one or more internships may be available during the summer semester with the Honorable Craig Gargotta. Interns are required to work 120 hours during the semester at the Hipolito F. Garcia Federal Building and United States Courthouse in downtown San Antonio near the Alamo. Interns assist the judge with matters related to bankruptcy proceedings. *Successful candidates typically have a very strong academic record.* Prior completion of a course on Bankruptcy Law is useful but not required.

DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. 
The <u>Ms. JD Fellowship program</u> promotes mentorship and professional development for women-identifying law students.



DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a

timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. J.D. students who complete 100 hours of pro bono service, community service, or any combination thereof during their legal studies are eligible to receive the Pro Bono and Public Service Certificate at Commencement. One graduating student who demonstrates exceptional commitment to public service



will be recognized with the Public Service Award at Commencement. Additionally, students in each level of study who demonstrate outstanding commitment and achievements in public service are eligible for recognition at the end of the academic year.



DISCLOSURE OF CHARACTER AND FITNESS ISSUES

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. All Law RSO events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean of Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.

LAW STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES



THE JIMI DERRICK AND THE FEDERAL BAR ASSOCIATION SAN ANTONIO CHAPTER MEMORIAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

This year, the St. Mary's School of Law Board of Advocates partnered with the Federal Bar Association to host *The Jimi Derrick and the Federal Bar Association San Antonio Chapter Memorial Moot Court Competition* at the new Federal Courthouse downtown. This partnership is the result of Dean Alvaro Bellido de Luna's leadership and vision in making this internal competition an inspiring cornerstone competition for St. Mary's and the students. This is a competition for all law students at St. Mary's, but we are especially proud that this year half of our competitors were first year law students. As a testament to the quality of students that St. Mary's has this year, our Champion of this competition and Best Rookie was Daniel Ramirez, a first-year student. Of the four semifinalists, Daniel Ramirez, Emily Garcia, and Samuel Tunnel are all first-year law students, and Caitlin Sullivan is a second-year law student and member of the National Team.

This year, the competition director and Board of Advocates Chair of Alumni Relations, Sophia Richardson, along with her committee, Arieana Martinez, Layne Mustian, Emily Mann, Amy Russo, Jayden Cool, Jenny Shamoon, and Kaelie Bernard, worked tirelessly to plan and coordinate every aspect of the competition. The constitutional problem argued in this competition was written by National Team members Layne Mustian and Emily Mann. The students were judged by volunteers Federal Bar Association members, former St. Mary's National Team members, St. Mary's National Team coaches, and current sitting judge and justices. The Finalist, Caitlin Sullivan, and the Champion, Daniel Ramirez competed in front of Justices Beth Watkins and Lori Valenzuela of the

Fourth Court of Appeals, and Judge Graig Gargotta, Onler Bankruptcy Judge of the Western District of Texas.

Jimi Derrick's mother, Dr. Rebecca Millikin and her husband, Dr. Lee Millikin, attended both days of the competition and watched each competitor at least once. The Millikins spent time talking with the students between rounds and encouraging our advocates to bring their best to the competition. BARRISTERS HONORS CELEBRATES RECORD BREAKING YEAR

This past week, the law school celebrated the success of the National Team. This was a record-breaking year celebrating competition, individual awards and of course the Faculty Awards. A new scholarship was created with the San Antonio chapter of the Texas American Board of Trial Attorneys awarding the best Trial Advocate \$3,000 at the awards banquet. Those honored included our champions from the 2022-2023 school year. The National Team



had an unprecedented year hosting or supporting a total of 39 competitions, three of which included national championships. These competitions hosted thousands of students and members from the bench and bar from across the United States who saw our name and logo and our commitment to advocacy across the country. In addition to hosting, our competing teams had the best year ever recorded in our school's history:

Five National Championships, Four Regional Championships, One State Championship, Six Finals, Ten Semi-Finals, Six Quarter or Octo-Finals and 28 individual awards.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

Dr. Rebecca Millikin was awarded the Supporter of Advocacy Award. Dr. Millikin is the mother of Jimi Derrick, who along with James Derrick sponsored a moot competition every year after Jimi's passing. This year, Jimi's parents allowed us to combine the competition with the Federal Bar Association and have the entire competition held at the new Federal Courthouse. As a result, we will be able to share this year's \$13,500 with several students.

The Champion of Advocacy Award was given to **Maxine Scott**. Every year at Barristers, Professor L. 
