


United Way of Central MN/Partners for Student Success Overview

 - 24% students






Race Demographics of After School Centers




Students Care About School vs. Free/Reduced Lunch




Free Reduced Lunch/Going To Class Unprepared




Reduced Lunch vs. Importance of Being A Student



After School Programs vs. Free or Reduced Lunch Bar Graph


