



- 3 "Social and political marginalization of women strongly correlates with the likelihood that a country will experience conflict." ³



0611: The African sun had just risen above the hills surrounding the sprawling city and sent its already dazzling rays streaming into the dusty alleyway. Corporal Hernandez felt the sun on his face and knew that today would, again, be sweltering. He was a squad leader in 2d Platoon, Lima Company and had, along with his men, spent a sleepless night

the perimeter. For the past week his platoon had provided security to the International lief Organization (IRO) workers who manned one of three food distribution points in American Sector of Tugala -- the war-torn capital of Orange -- a Central African

nation wracked by civil unrest and famine.

The situation in Orange had transfixed the world for nearly two years. Bloody tribal fighting had led first to the utter collapse of the government and economy, and ultimately, to widespread famine. International efforts to quell the violence and support the teetering government had failed, and the country had plunged into chaos. The United States had finally been compelled to intervene. A forward deployed Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable) was ordered to assist the efforts of the ineffective Regional Multi-National Force (RMNF) and the host of international humanitarian assistance organizations that struggled to alleviate the suffering. The MEU's arrival had stabilized the situation and allowed the precious relief supplies to finally reach the people who needed

Spring is the mischief in me, and I wonder

Before I built a wall I'd ask to know What I was walling in or walling out, And to whom I was like to give offense. Something there is that doesn't love a wall, That wants it down.' I could say 'Elves' to him, But it's not elves exactly, and I'd rather He said it for himself. I see him there Bringing a stone grasped firmly by the top

In each hand, like an old-stone savage armed. He moves in darkness as it seems to me, Not of woods only and the shade of trees. He will not go behind his father's saying, And he likes having thought of it so well

He says again, 'Good fences make good neighbors.'










LINE OF EFFORT 1: Seek and support the preparation and meaningful participation of women around the world in decision-making processes related to conflict and crises;




Defense Objective 1 – The Department of Defense exemplifies a diverse organization that allows for women's meaningful participation across the development, management, and employment of the Joint Force.

The Big Idea

"Guided by the legitimate principles stated under Article 1, Chapter 1 of the United Nations Charter, the UN Security Council resolution (S/RES/1325) on women and peace and security, and the principles embedded in our democratic constitutions, members of the IND O-PACIFIC family of nations, along with our international partners, and non-governmental organizations have developed this strategy to comprehensively empower women in our societies as a non-provocative, unconventional path and source of strategic leverage to rebalance our collective relationships with the Great Powers namely Russia, the United States, and China.

Taking a leadership role in the comprehensive advancement and empowerment of women in our societies will set a positive international example and message, and will advantage our collective future in the following ways: (1) improve the cohesiveness of our individual societies and the international bonds among like-minded nations; (2) enhance our abilities to evolve our economies in alignment with the preservation of our planethome; (3) enlist the unique technical skills, artistic expression, and communal leadership of women for advancing national and collective prosperity; (4) increase by nearly double, the numbers of our citizens contributing fully to our socio-economic strength and resiliency; (5) provide a resilient platform for cooperation in other areas of national, regional, and global concern; (6) advance our national interests, our in dividual national sovereignty, and our prospects for a brighter future."
