

 Relationship between the weaponization of gendered narratives and fostering societal resilience and networks of resistance


Russian Toxic Masculinity

Old versus New Battlespace problems:

Women, Peace, Security (WPS)
 interweaved in the Russo-Ukraine War

Methodology: Fieldwork and interviews in Eastern Europe (including Ukraine) and analysis of Russian media trends





Cultural Dimension

- Ideological and/or cultural clash
- Russians defending the Eastern
 Orthodoxy/Christianity against the
 immoral West
- UKR: 60,000 women in Ukrainian military (22% of forces)
 - 5,000 serve in combat units
- RUS: 41,000 women in Russian military (4% forces)
 - "Field Wife" practice
- Russian practices today vs. USSR women in combat









Resilience in the Digital Age

- Shift from Industrial Age resilience to Information Age resilience
- Helping Build Resilient Societies (UN Resilience Guidance)
 - ability of individuals, households, communities, cities, institutions, systems and societies to prevent, resist, absorb, adapt, respond and recover positively, efficiently and effectively when faced with a wide range of risks, while maintaining an acceptable level of functioning without compromising long-term prospects for sustainable development, peace and security, human rights and well-being
- Ukrainian messaging of defending the homeland
- Informal Security Assistance -PEOPLE
 - Ukrainian civil society
 - NGOs
 - Volunteers
 - Global Civil Society (Social media)
 - NAFO


Narratives & Information Warfare

• "Narrative is both the fundamental way in which individuals understand their own personal experiences and a foundational framing of human ways of world-making." (Goodman, 1978)

• Antifeminism: "movements classified under the umbrella term *the manosphere*, wage ideological narrative warfare to endorse a misogynistic worldview." (Nurminen, 2019)

• "Gender and narrative are foundational to the ways in which humans engage in meaning making." (Fivush & Grysman, 2022)

 Ukraine: Photographs and videos on social media show male soldiers cooking, women fighting, and everyone snuggling kittens and puppies



Ukrainian Refugees & Russian Violence

- Stories told about violence, trauma, and loss inform knowledge of post-conflict societies.
 Stories have a context which is part of the storyteller's life narrative
- Ukraine illustrates how in conflict as well as in post-conflict, women are both subjects and agents of change
- Bucha atrocities no different than Soviet Army occupation of Eastern Europe



Conclusion & Recommendations

- Russian leaders believe they are righteously waging an ideological/cultural war
- Narratives matter
- StratCom: Ukraine putting on a master class in "Strategic Communication" – and conveying societal and digital resilience
- WPS practices across Western governments and militaries must be institutionalized
- WPS must be integrated into future operations, be it conventional or irregular warfare
