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1 PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

The aim of the JIRAM Operation Procedures is to give flexibility to the JIRAM Science Community, in finalizing the science requests into instrument commands, and be able to process the data received from the instrument into the appropriate science data set within the time frame allocated in the Level-3 processes.

In the uplink side, this involves being able to support the Science Planning Working Group (SPWG) in the planning of science activities, and being able to generate all the JIRAM commands that support the science plan.

The downlink phase concentrates in being able to obtain/access the JIRAM instrument compressed level-2 science data from the File Exchange Interface (FEI) server, decompressing or expanding the data, calibrating the data (generating the level-3 science data), and producing the final higher-level science data products.

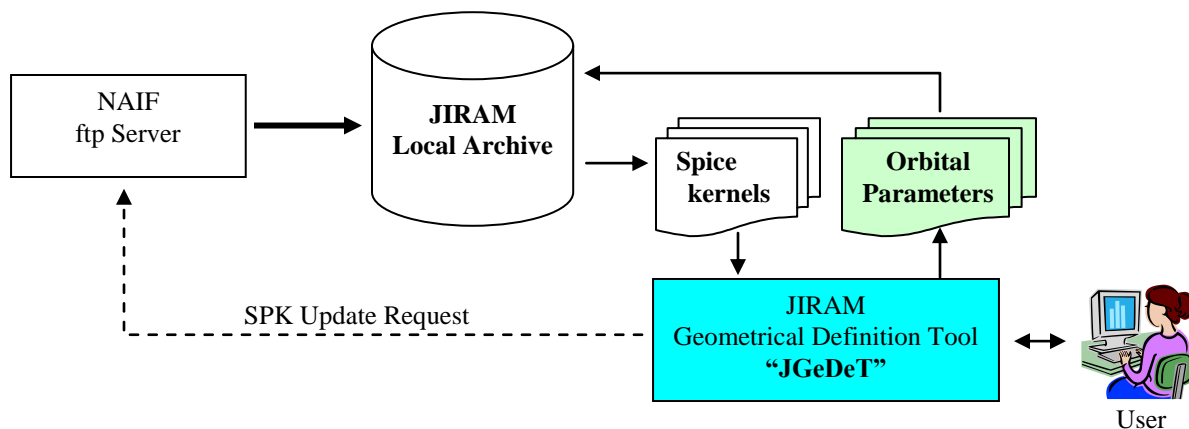
The JIRAM routine uplink and downlink operations are implemented via seven plan levels.

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2 UPLINK PROCEDURES

2.1 GENERATION OF THE MAIN ORBITAL PARAMETERS PROCEDURES

First step of the Commanding Chain is the generation of the spacecraft orbit and attitude information (Sub SC longitude, Sub SC latitude, SC altitude,...) that will be extracted by the Juno SPK and handled by the “*JIRAM Geometrical Definition Tool*”. The orbital parameters are stored in the “*JIRAM Local Archive*” to be available to the entire Commanding Chain.

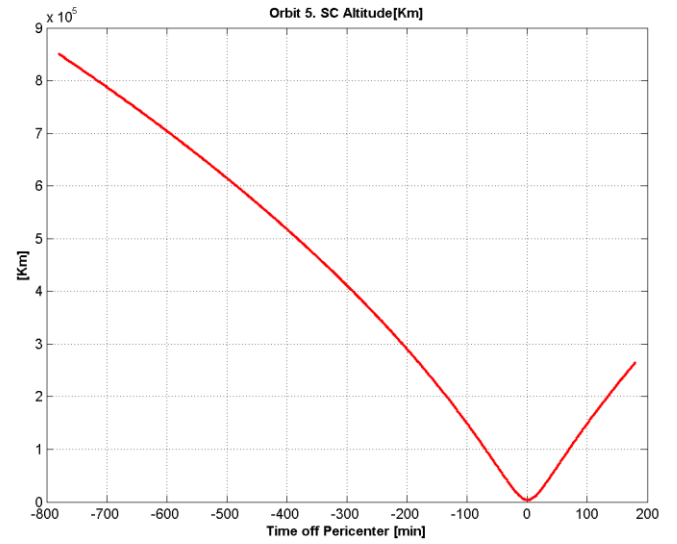
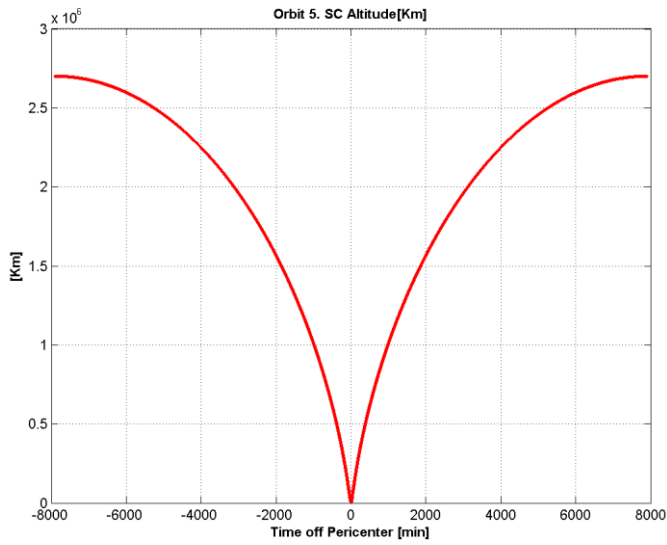
1. Login to JIRAM Ground Segment (Sign in using personal User_Id and Password)
2. Run JGeDeT tool.
3. Check the latest available Juno SPK products from (<ftp://naif.jpl.nasa.gov/pub/naif/JUNO/>)
4. Update SPK products into JIRAM local archive.
5. Software Environment Configuration:
 - a. Selection of the orbits of interest.
 - b. Definition of the Orbit Sampling Factor.
6. Selection of the orbital parameters:
 - a. All available orbital parameters.
 - b. Limited branch of orbital parameters.
7. Storage of the Output File into the JIRAM Local Archive.
8. Graphical Visualization of the calculated orbital parameters.



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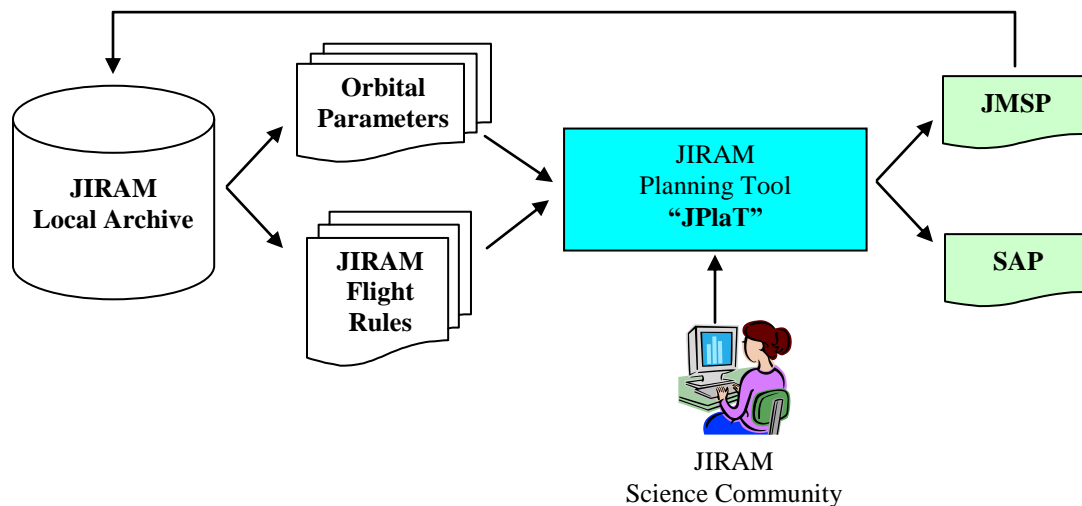
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Examples of Graphical Output



2.2 SCIENCE TIMELINE IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

The Science Timeline Implementation process culminates in the generation of the Science Activity Plan (SAP). An internal version of the SAP file is the JIRAM Master Science Plan (JMSP) is available to the JIRAM team through the JIRAM local archive. The JMSP nominally contains the selection of science observation periods in terms of Scientific Operative Sequences imposed by the mission goals, mission conditions and constraints (Data Volume, Power budget,...).

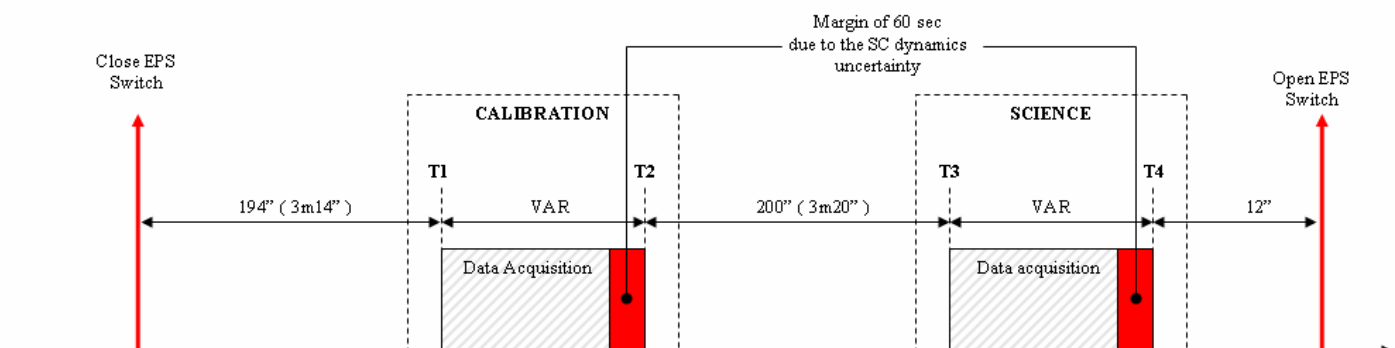

Detailed Check List:

1. Login to JIRAM Ground Segment (Sign in using personal User_Id and Password)
2. Run **JPLaT** tool.
3. Export Orbital Parameters and Flight Rules to the local workstation.
4. Identification of all the science areas interested by the selected flyby (orbit)
5. Prioritization of the science areas (High Medium Low).
6. Analysis and validation of the achievable Science Goals, provided by the JIRAM Science Community, over the prioritized science targets.
7. Modelling of the Jupiter Radiation Environment for the identification of the no working regions.

8. The Planning Tool has been also designed to access different kind of information related to the mission and display them in a different format, with intensive graphical outputs. The aim of the application is the data merging (fusion utilities) to optimize the planning process and the scientific exploitation phase. The design modularity should allow the addition of future functionalities.
9. Implementation of the JIRAM Master Science Plan (**JMSP**) with the implementation of the Science Operative Blocks, necessities to achieve the designed Science Goals previously defined.
10. Computation of the Data Volume, Power profile and SC pointing attitude, requested by the **JMSP**.
11. Resolution of the overall mission conflicts, if any, in term of:
 - a. Data Volume overflow
 - b. Power Overflow.
 - c. Violation of the SC and instrument flight Rules.
12. The original JMSP, will be reshaped in case of conflicts.
13. Estimation of the Global Coverage achievable with the harmonized **JMSP**.
14. The harmonized **JMSP** will be stored into the JIRAM local archive and then converted into SAP format.
15. Login to JSOC using the correct IP address (<https://jsoc.swri.edu/jsoc>)
16. Sign in using personal JSOC user name and corresponding password.
17. Upload of the SAP activities.

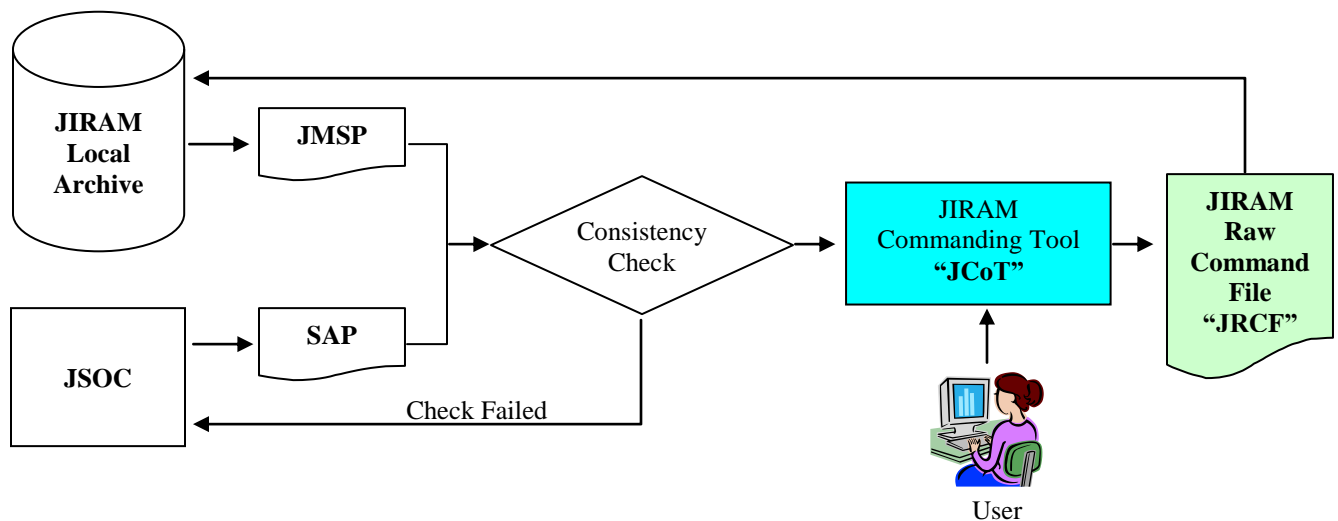
JMSP Graphical Visualization



In the JMSP timeline contain just Science Activities (Calibration block, Science block, ...). The timeline will be completed by the Jiram Commanding Tool, adding the technical blocks (SAFE, STB ecc).

2.3 RAW COMMANDS GENERATION

Once the Planning Cycle has been harmonized (all conflicts solved) the next phase is the generation of the hardware Tele-Commands and parameters.

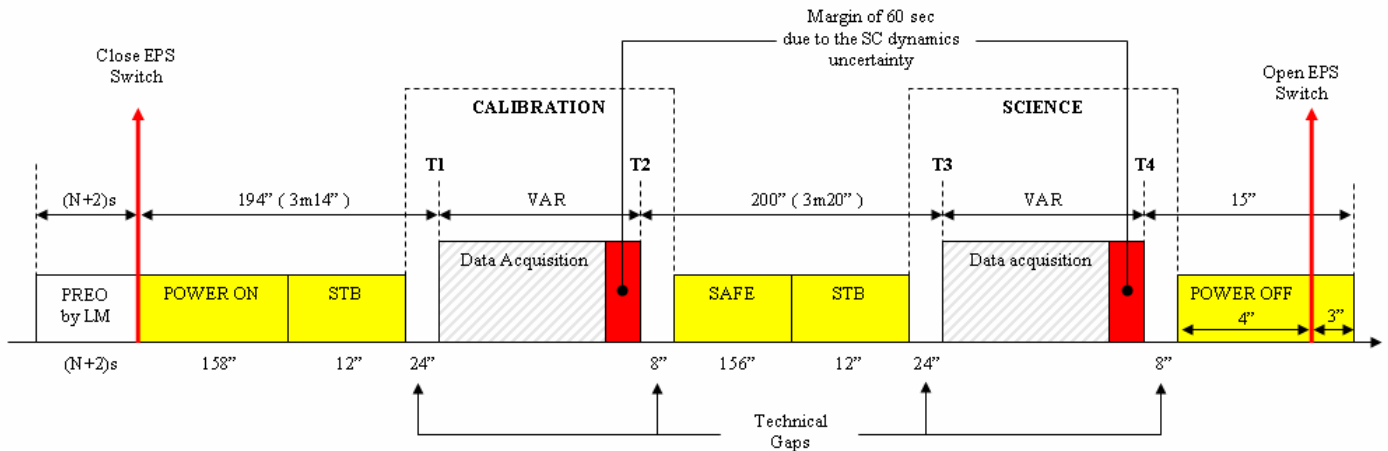

Detailed Check List:

1. Login to JSOC using the correct IP address (<https://jsoc.swri.edu/jsoc>).
2. Sign in using personal JSOC user name and corresponding password.
3. Select the Science Activity Plan (SAP) under consideration.
4. Export the SAP to the local workstation.
5. Login to JIRAM Ground Segment (Sign in using personal User_Id and Password)
6. Select and export to the local workstation the harmonized JMSP (under consideration) from the local archive.
7. Verify the consistency between SAP and JMSP.
8. In case of discrepancies (JMSP not in line with SAP) then contact JSOC.
19. Definition of the *Atomic Sequences* in term of Tele-Commands and Settable Parameters. Items fully described in [RD-01].
20. Definition of the *Timing* (relative and absolute) and *Duration* of the Atomic blocks.

21. Data Volume and Power Consumption will be finalized in this phase (possible reduction of resources, declared in the **SAP**).
22. All the Tele Commands and Settable Parameters will be checked by the **JCoT** itself, in term of:
 - a. Data Production Rate.
 - b. Instantaneous Consumed Power.
 - c. Tele-Commands fields “Consistency Check”.
 - d. Detection and warning message display of the risk parameters and Tele-Command (if any), see [RD-01] Chapter 6.

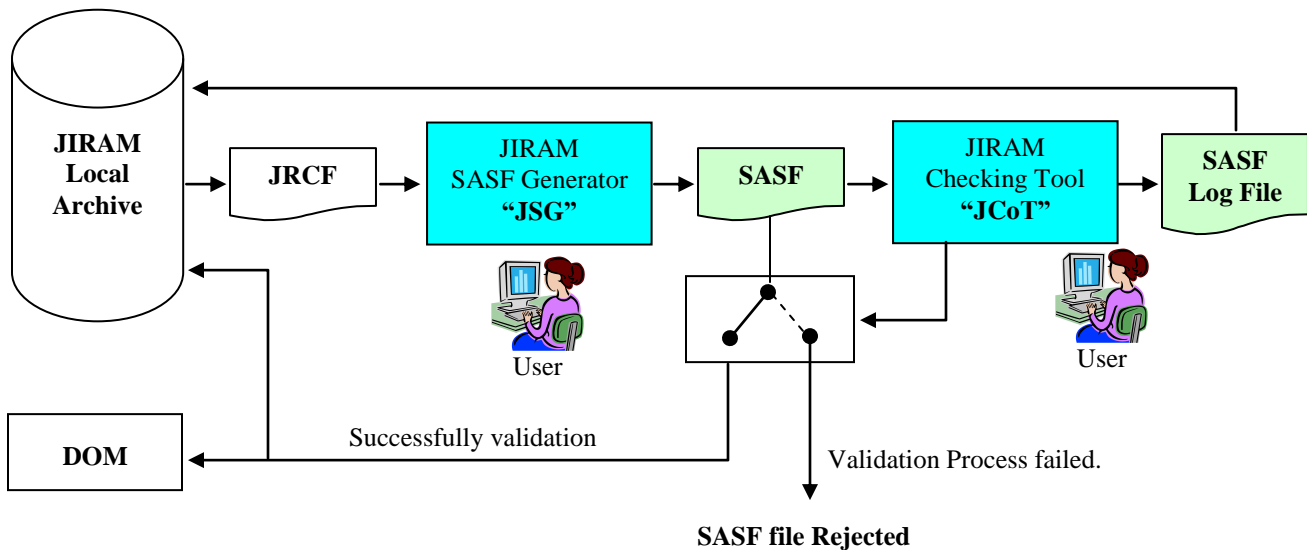
JRFC Graphical Visualization

2.4 SASF GENERATION PROCEDURES

Accordingly to the JIRAM Raw Command Files (**JRFC**), generated by the (**JCoT**), the raw sequences are then converted into SASF format and finally checked by the JIRAM Testing Tool before the delivery to the DOM client.

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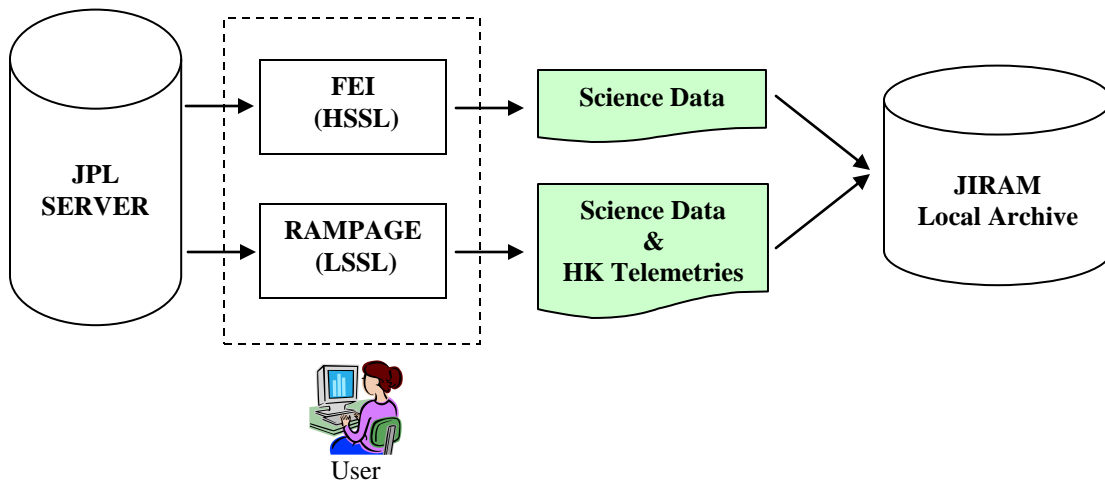

13. Verification of the instrument Flight Rules.
14. Verification of the overall SASF timing.
15. SASF Syntax Check
16. Storage of the approved SASF file into the JIRAM local Archive.
17. Login to the JPL DOM server (Sign in using personal User_Id and Password)
18. Publish of the SASF file into the DOM server.

3 DOWNLINK PROCEDURES

The downlink procedures involve JIRAM Science and Engineering Telemetries, as well as JUNO spacecraft housekeeping telemetries and SPICE kernels products. JIRAM is able transfer the collected data through two dedicated bus: HSSL and LSSL. Depending on the selected BUS, data products are respectively retrieved by the File Exchange Interface (FEI) for HSSL and RAMPAGE for LSSL .

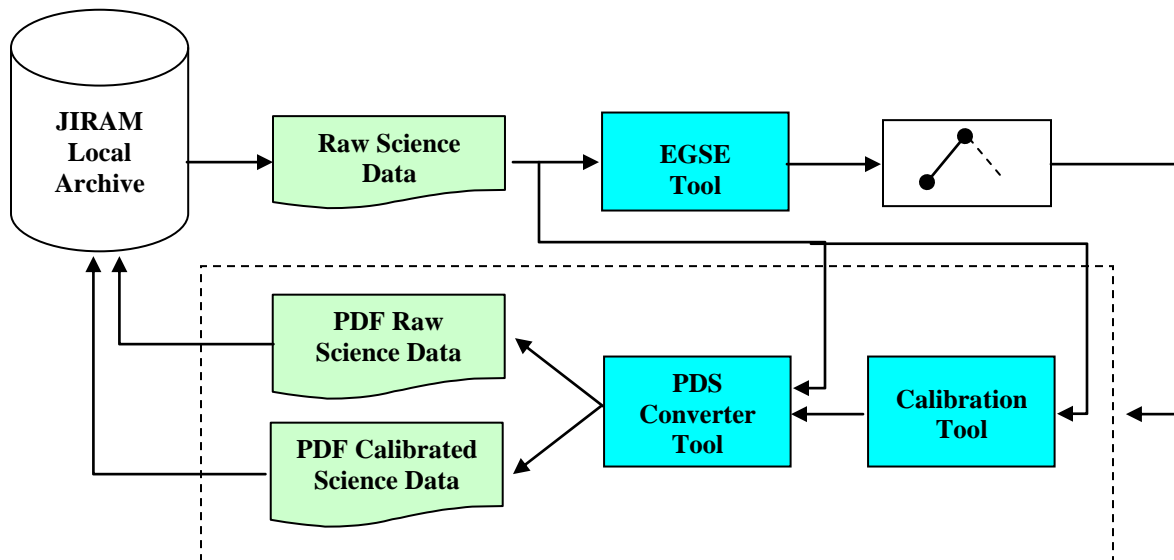

 - b. Check of the Executed Commands.
 - c. Reconciliation of the executed commands by JIRAM with the command contained in the SASF file.
4. Check of the log file generated by EGSE with the Checks Results (previous bullet 3.)
5. Execution of the DPS conversion and Storage into the JIRAM Local Archive (data not yet processed).
