Biographics

Glenn Block has served as the Director of Orchestras and Opera and Professor of Conducting at Illinois State University since 1990. In addition, he served as Music Director of the Youth Symphony of Kansas City from 1983-2007. Prior to his appointment at Illinois State in the fall of 1990, Dr. Block served for 15 years as Director of Orchestras and Professor of Conducting at the Conservatory of Music of the University of Missouri - Kansas City and Music Director of the Kansas City Civic Orchestra. Born in Brooklyn, Dr. Block was educated at the Eastman School of Music. He received his Ph.D. from the University of California at San Diego.

A frequent guest conductor, he has appeared in over 42 states with all-state and professional orchestras. Foreign guest-conducting have included concerts and master classes at the Fountainebleau Conservertoire in France, and concerts in Spain, Canada, Colombia, Estonia, Russia, Italy, Hungary, Austria and the Czech Republic. He has served on the Boards of Directors for both the Conductors Guild and the Youth Orchestra Division of the American Symphony Orchestra League. The Youth Symphony of Kansas City and Dr. Block made their Carnegie Hall debut in June 1997. Dr. Block has served on the faculty of the National Music Camp at Interlochen as Resident Conductor of the World Youth Symphony Orchestra, and at the Interlochen Arts Academy as Visiting Conductor. In addition, he has served as Music Director of the Summer Festival Orchestra at the Rocky Ridge Music Center in Estes Park, Colorado.

Carlyn Morenus is Associate Professor of Piano and Keyboard Area Coordinator at Illinois State University. She teaches group piano, piano pedagogy, individual instruction in piano and organ, and piano literature. She previously taught at The University of Texas at Austin and at Vincennes University (Indiana). Dr. Morenus holds degrees from The University of Texas at Austin, University of Wisconsin-Madison and University of Southern California.

Carlyn Morenus maintains an active performing schedule as a solo pianist, collaborative pianist and chamber musician. Recent concerts have included appearances in Malaysia, Thailand, Italy, Austria and Slovakia, as well as recitals, workshops and master classes around the United States. She has recorded for the Vienna Modern Masters label.

Rebecca J. Cutler grew up in southwest Missouri and became involved in music at a very early age, partly due to her own interest but also due to her parents' attempt to keep this precocious child occupied. She became proficient in several instruments and at fourteen co-founded a Suzuki violin program in her rural community. She currently serves as concertmaster of the ISU Symphony Orchestra and as graduate teaching assistant to Dr. Sarah Gentry while pursuing a simultaneous master's in violin and orchestral conducting studying with Dr. Glenn Block. She is also a contracted violinist with the Illinois Symphony Orchestra. Rebecca did her undergraduate studies at Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kansas with Dr. Selim Giray, graduating Magna cum laude with a degree in Violin Performance.

Glenn Block has served as the Director of Orchestras and Opera and Professor of Conducting at Illinois State University since 1990. In addition, he served as Music Director of the Youth Symphony of Kansas City from 1983-2007. Prior to his appointment at Illinois State in the fall of 1990, Dr. Block served for 15 years as Director of Orchestras and Professor of Conducting at the Conservatory of Music of the University of Missouri - Kansas City and Music Director of the Kansas City Civic Orchestra. Born in Brooklyn, Dr. Block was educated at the Eastman School of Music. He received his Ph.D. from the University of California at San Diego.

A frequent guest conductor, he has appeared in over 42 states with all-state and professional orchestras. Foreign guest-conducting have included concerts and master classes at the Fountainebleau Conservertoire in France, and concerts in Spain, Canada, Colombia, Estonia, Russia, Italy, Hungary, Austria and the Czech Republic. He has served on the Boards of Directors for both the Conductors Guild and the Youth Orchestra Division of the American Symphony Orchestra League. The Youth Symphony of Kansas City and Dr. Block made their Carnegie Hall debut in June 1997. Dr. Block has served on the faculty of the National Music Camp at Interlochen as Resident Conductor of the World Youth Symphony Orchestra, and at the Interlochen Arts Academy as Visiting Conductor. In addition, he has served as Music Director of the Summer Festival Orchestra at the Rocky Ridge Music Center in Estes Park, Colorado.

Carlyn Morenus is Associate Professor of Piano and Keyboard Area Coordinator at Illinois State University. She teaches group piano, piano pedagogy, individual instruction in piano and organ, and piano literature. She previously taught at The University of Texas at Austin and at Vincennes University (Indiana). Dr. Morenus holds degrees from The University of Texas at Austin, University of Wisconsin-Madison and University of Southern California.
