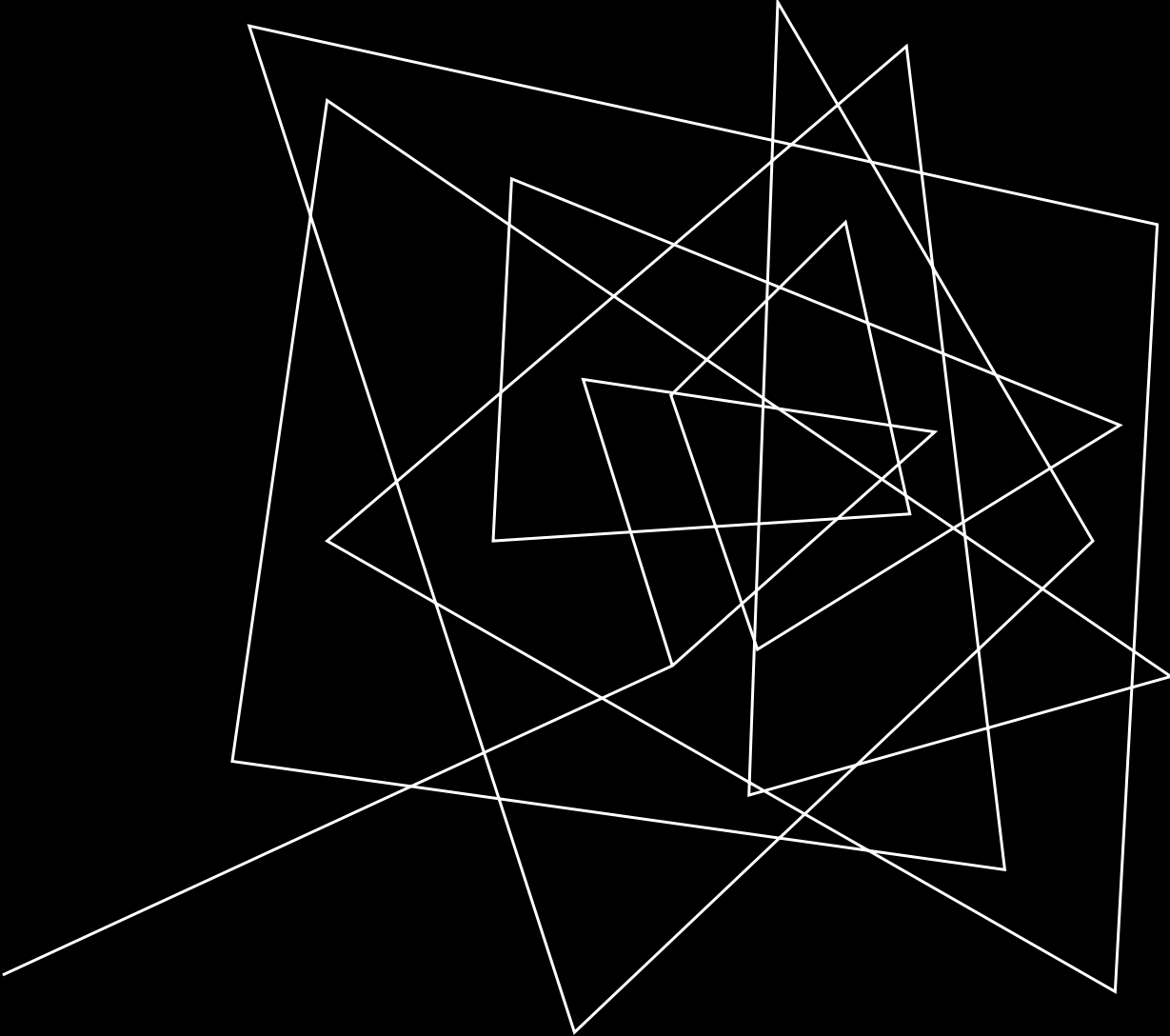

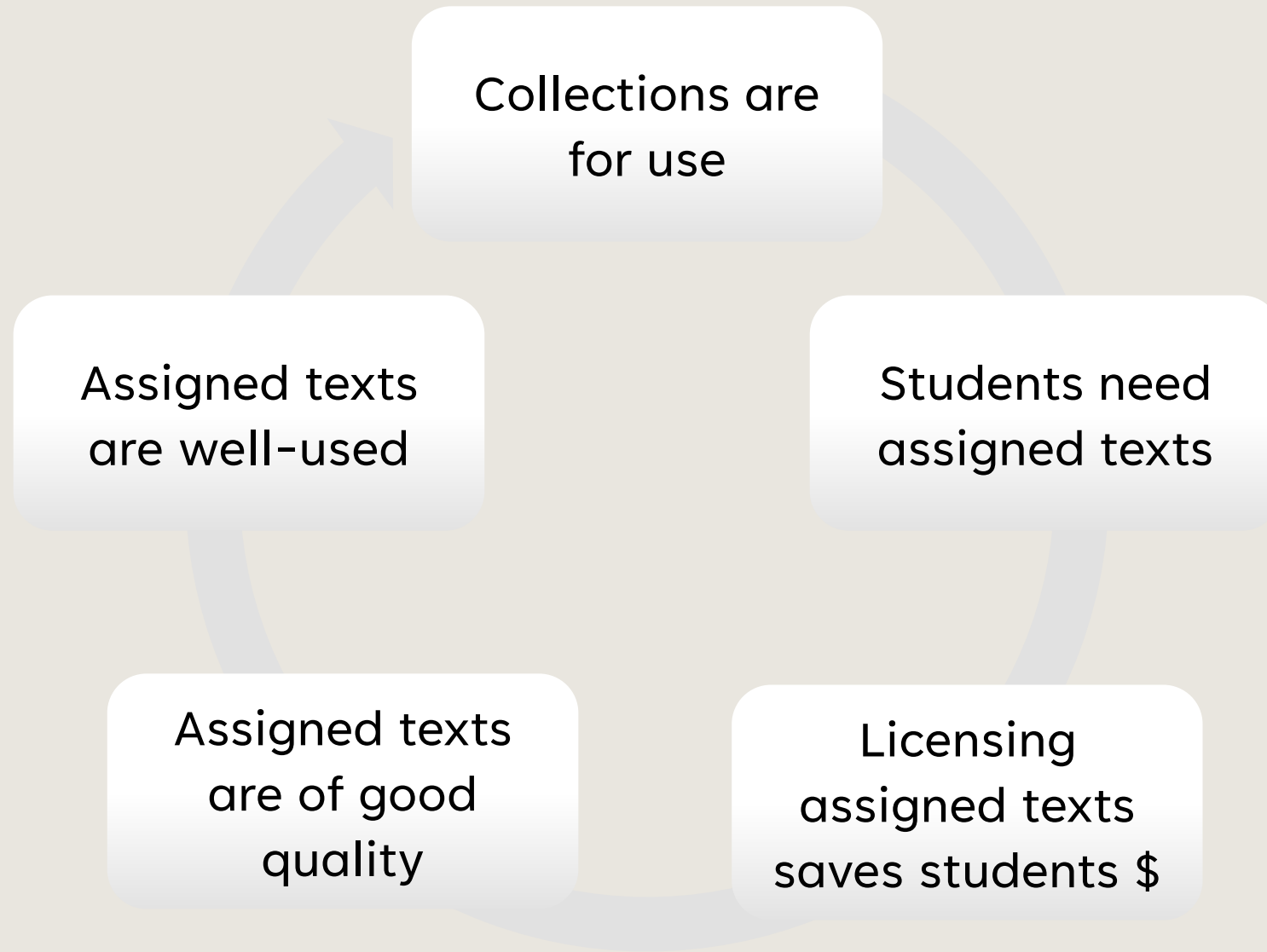

COURSE ASSIGNED E-BOOKS OUTPERFORM DEMAND DRIVEN ACQUISITIONS DURING SAME PERIOD

- Library licensed etextbooks: 13% included in RCL and 1% have Outstanding Academic Text designation
- All assigned texts at ISU: 13% included in RCL, with 0.4% designated as Outstanding Academic Texts
- Demand Driven Acquisition: 7% included in RCL and 0.6% designated as Outstanding Academic Texts.
