Parking Changes During Winter Break

When winter break began Dec. 12, Park-N-Ride, commuter and all residential permit holders have been allowed to park on campus in any student parking area, regardless of zone. This will continue through Jan. 18.

Metered parking and the Pavilion Garage parking will remain pay-on-demand zones, and faculty-staff, reserved and service parking spaces will remain restricted. During the break, permits must be displayed on all vehicles, and parking rules and regulations will be enforced.

Regular and residential Park-N-Ride bus services will be suspended from Dec. 12 through Jan. 18. The Silver, Gold and Brown Park-N-Ride lines will resume operations at 7 a.m. Tuesday, Jan. 19. All Park-N-Ride permit holders must park in those designated areas of campus at that time.
