

Building Disease Models and Intervention Scenarios | Dr Aaron Lim visits AKU

The "Building Disease Models and Intervention Scenarios - A Health Data Science Workshop" organized by the CITRIC - Health Data Science Centre at The Aga Khan University Karachi was held from June 1-3, 2023. The workshop aimed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of disease modeling and handson experience in utilizing modeling tools.

One of the distinguished speakers and guest lecturers at the workshop was Dr. Aaron Lim, a prominent member of the research team at the University of Bristol Medical School. Dr. Lim specializes in infectious disease modeling, and his expertise contributed greatly to the workshop's goals. During his presentation, Dr. Lim emphasized the importance of disease modeling in uncovering patterns and trends related to infectious diseases, particularly hepatitis C and HIV.

Dr. Lim's presentation shed light on the challenges faced in disease control and highlighted the significance of evidence-based interventions to address complex public health issues. His insights and expertise provided valuable knowledge to the participants, enabling them to understand the intricacies of infectious disease modeling and its applications in public health.

The workshop served as a platform for participants to enhance their understanding of disease modeling and intervention strategies. By gaining extensive experience in utilizing modeling tools, attendees were equipped with the necessary skills to contribute to the field of health data science and make informed decisions regarding disease control and prevention in Pakistan.

The Centre for Impact – "NIHR Global Health Centre for Improving mental and physical health and building Research Capacities", is a newly launched Global Health Centre funded by the National Institute for Health Research, UK. It is aimed at improving mental and physical health together across Afghanistan and Pakistan. This Centre is led jointly by the Aga Khan University, Pakistan and the University of York, UK and includes several collaborating partner institutions. Dr Najma Siddiqi - a Professor of Psychiatry at the University of York, in a joint appointment with the Department of Health Sciences and the Hull York Medical School (HYMS) where she is a member of the Centre for Health and Population Sciences. Her research is

focused on physical and mental illness comorbidity. As the lead of the mental health theme within the Centre **Dr Siddiqi visited Karachi** recently and discussed way forward with the members from AKU as well as BIDE, SINA & PILL institutions. This collaboration will address the challenges of mental and physical multimorbidity that affects some of the most vulnerable people in low and middle income countries.

3rd European Congress of Clinical Microbiology & Infectious Diseases (ECCMID)









60th annual European Renal Association (ERA) Congress
