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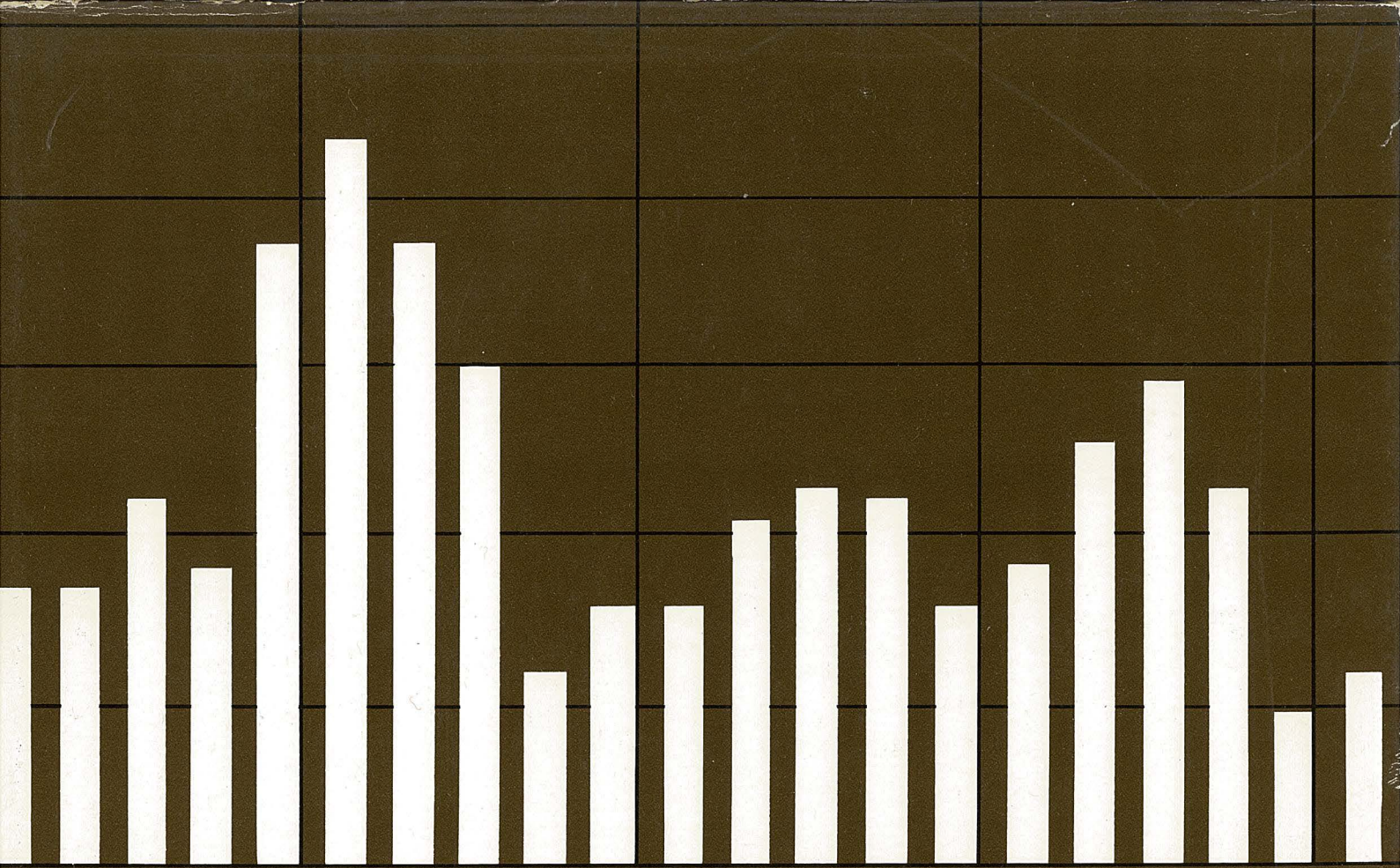



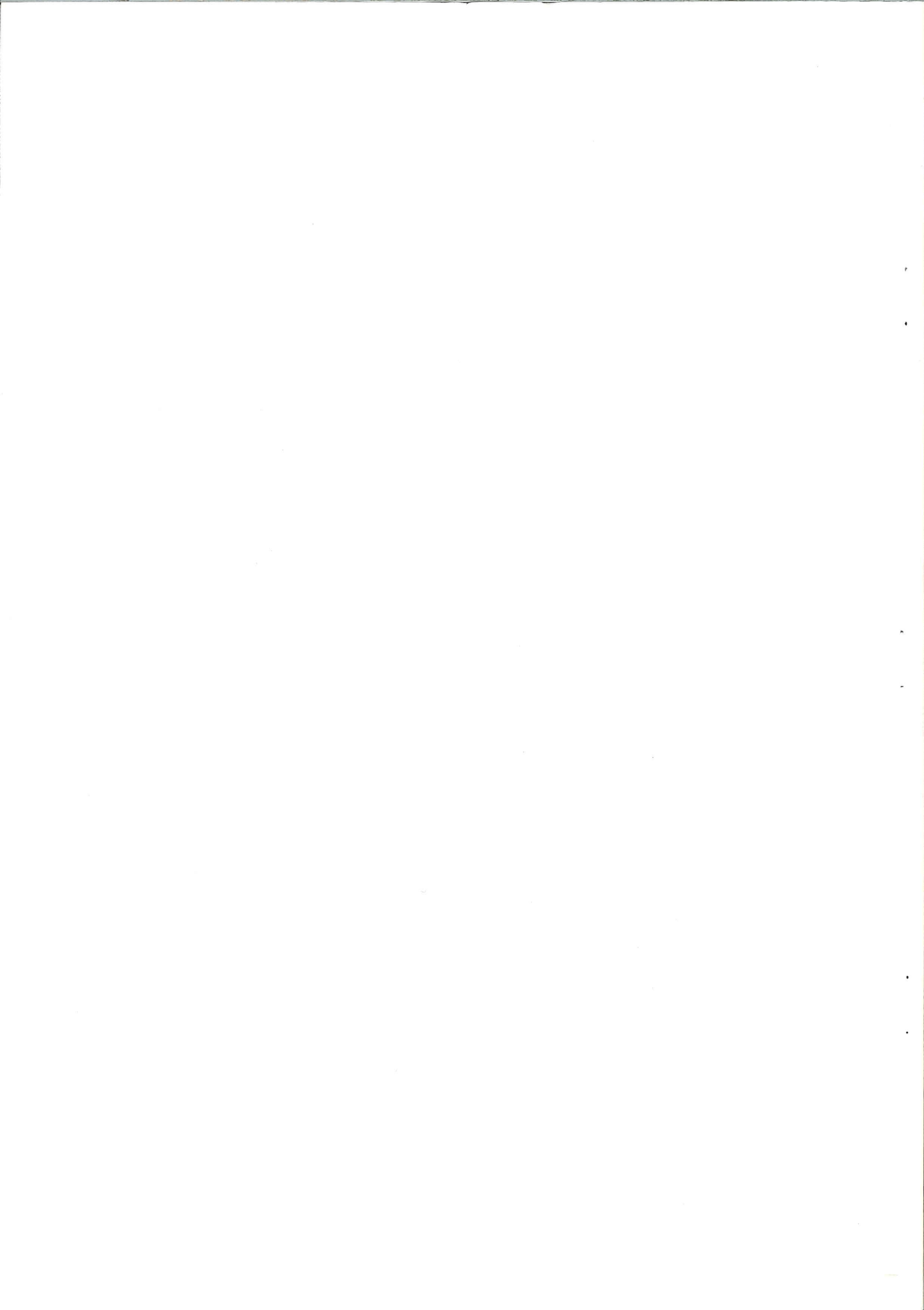

 Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories




INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Statistical Handbook is to bring together in one volume some of the series of social and economic statistics that are available in Hong Kong. Many of these figures have been published before, but in different publications; while many others have appeared only on a simple monthly or yearly basis and have not been presented as a statistical series for comparison over time. The Hong Kong Government Annual Report, the Annual Reports of various Government Departments and the Statistical Supplement to the Hong Kong Government Gazette have been used, among others, as source documents.

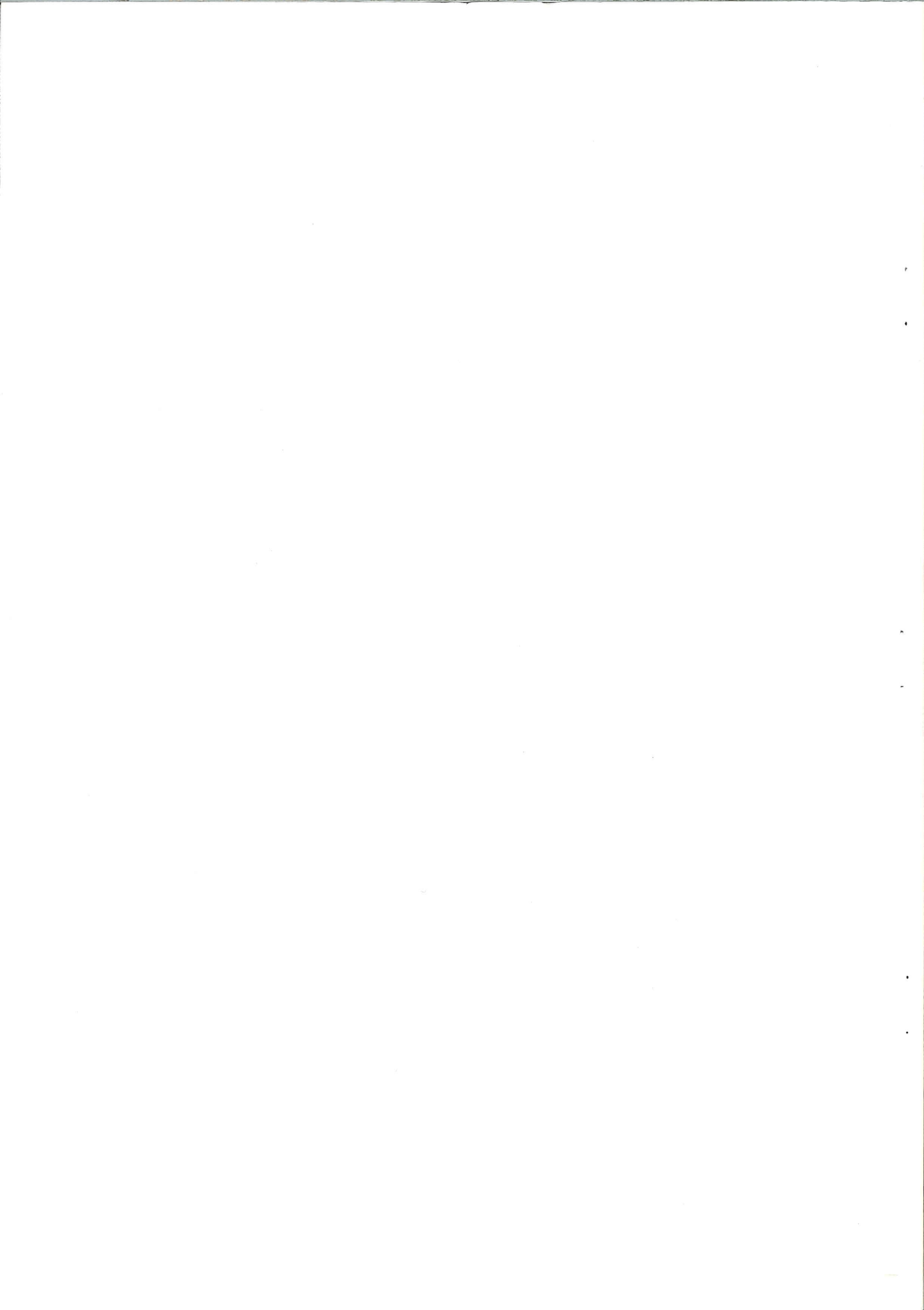
2. The Handbook is arranged in Sections according to subject matter and, wherever possible, the tables cover the period from 1947 to 1967. Where changes in method of compilation or in classifications have taken place over the years the original figures have been adjusted to make them comparable with the latest method and classification; where it has not been possible to do this, the series is broken into two or more sets. The last Section gives some statistics for the decade before 1941, which may be of historical interest. In the usual way, the rounding of figures may lead to some aggregates not being the arithmetical totals of their parts.

3. The Census and Statistics Department is conscious of shortcomings in this volume but it hopes that the statistics will be of use to those who are interested in Hong Kong, and it will be grateful to receive any suggestions for improvements that might be incorporated into a future revised edition.

AREA AND CLIMATE

1. The Colony of Hong Kong is on the south-east coast of China, adjoining the province of Kwangtung. It is just inside the tropics, less than 100 miles south of the tropic of Cancer, and lies between latitudes $22^{\circ} 9'$ and $22^{\circ} 37'N$ and longitudes $113^{\circ} 52'$ and $114^{\circ} 30'E$. The twin cities of Victoria on Hong Kong Island, and Kowloon, on the mainland, stand on either side of the harbour, and are about 90 miles south-east of Canton and 40 miles east of Portuguese Macau.

2. The total land area of the Colony is $398\frac{1}{2}$ square miles of which Hong Kong Island itself, together with a number of small adjacent islands, comprise 29 square miles. Kowloon and Stonecutters Island comprise another $3\frac{3}{4}$ square miles. The New Territories, which consist of part of the mainland and more than 230 islands, have a total area of $365\frac{3}{4}$ square miles.

3. Hong Kong enjoys a variety of weather from season to season unusual for tropical countries. The winter monsoon normally begins during September and prevails from October to mid-March and occasionally to May. Early winter is the most pleasant time of the year. The summer monsoon occurs from mid-April to September but is not so persistent. Summer is the rainy season and is almost continuously hot and humid.

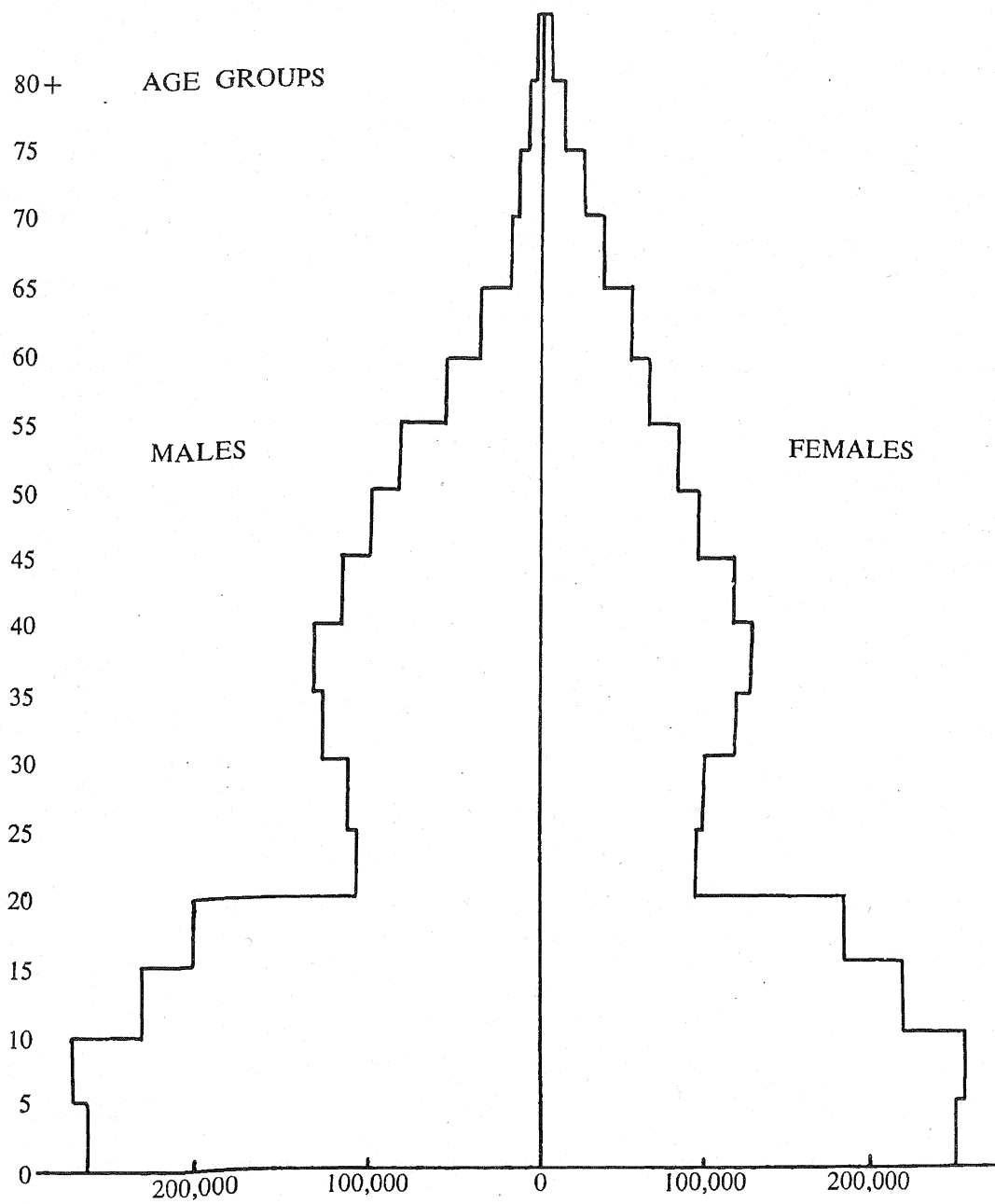

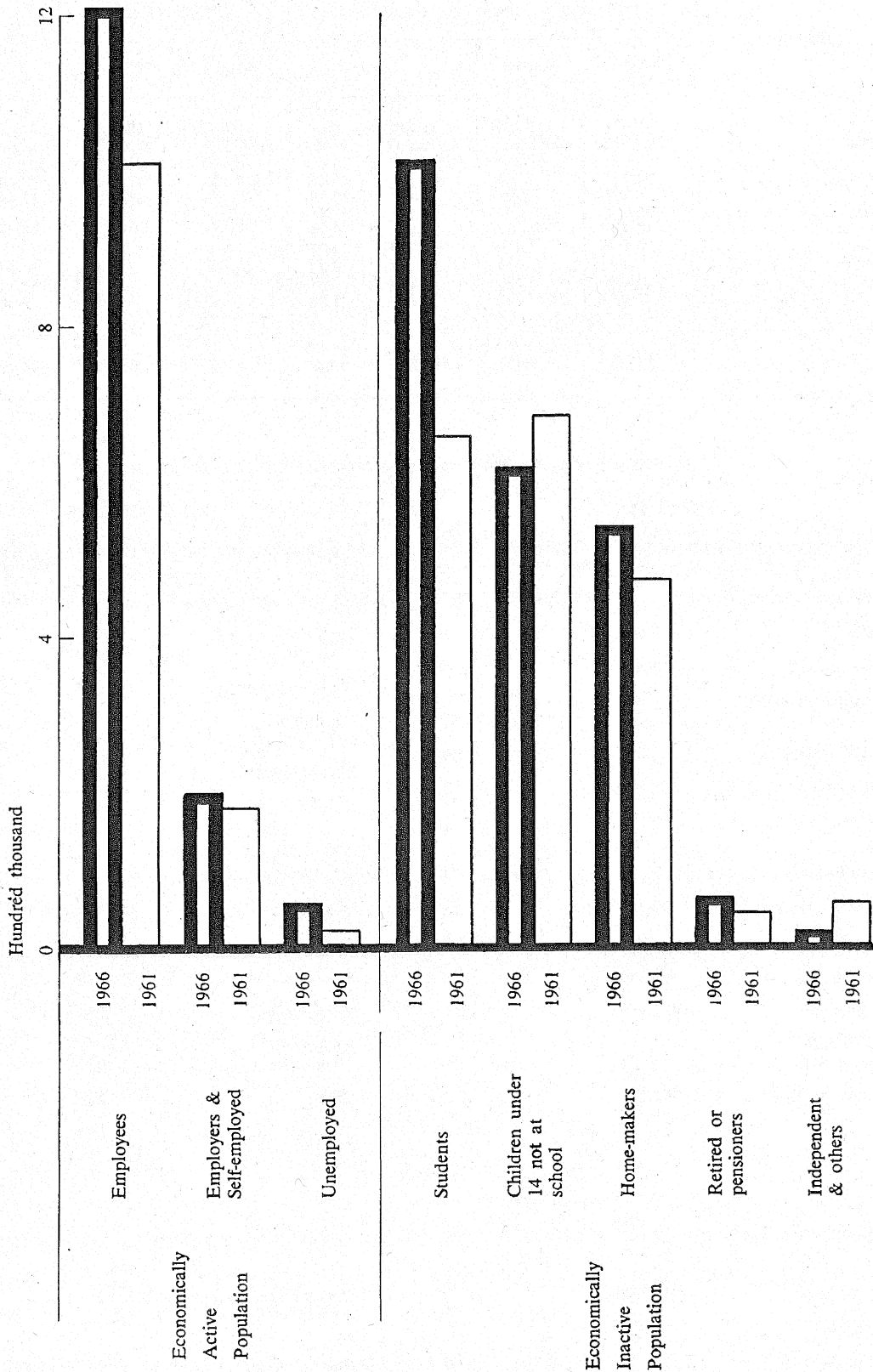

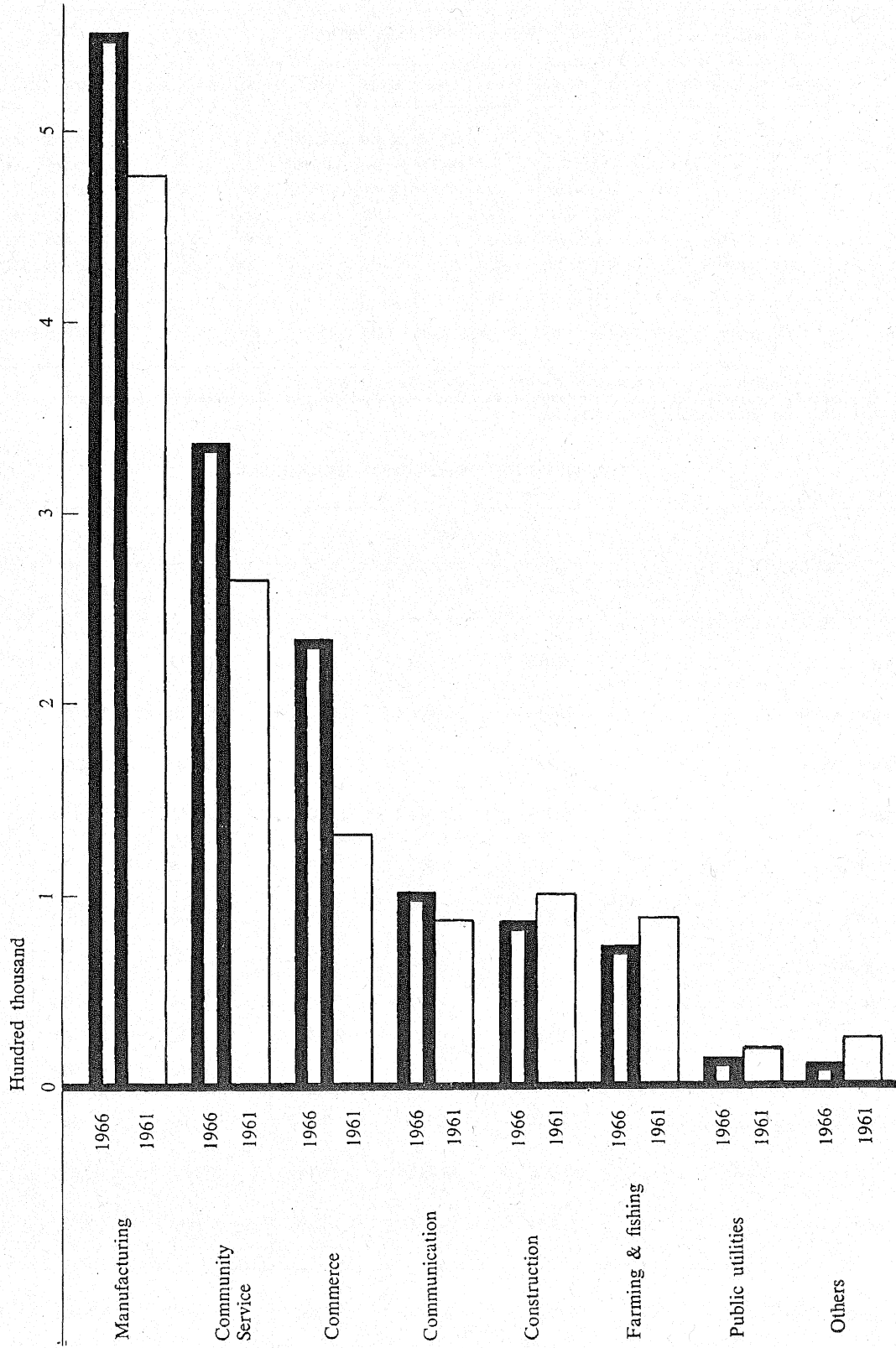

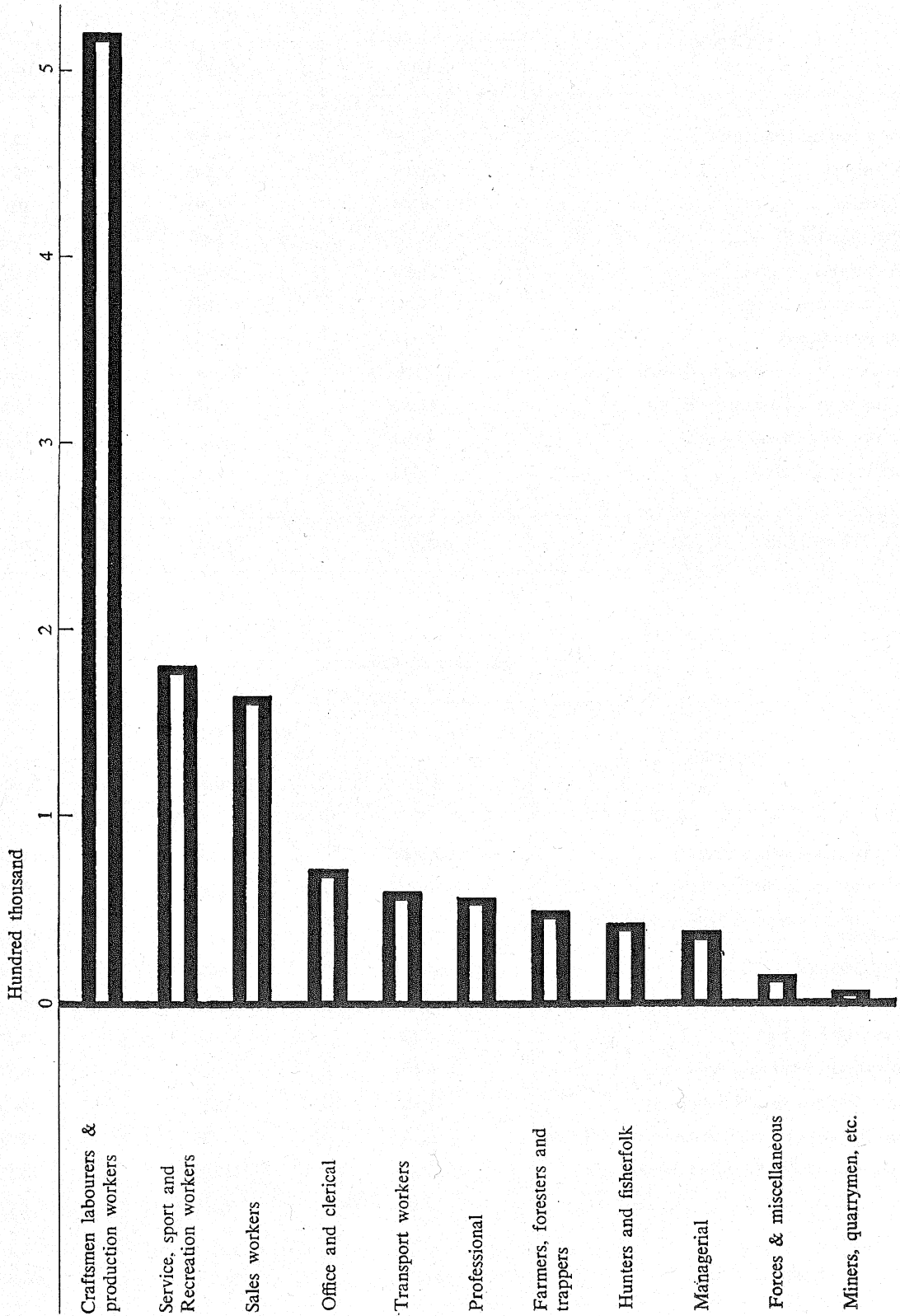

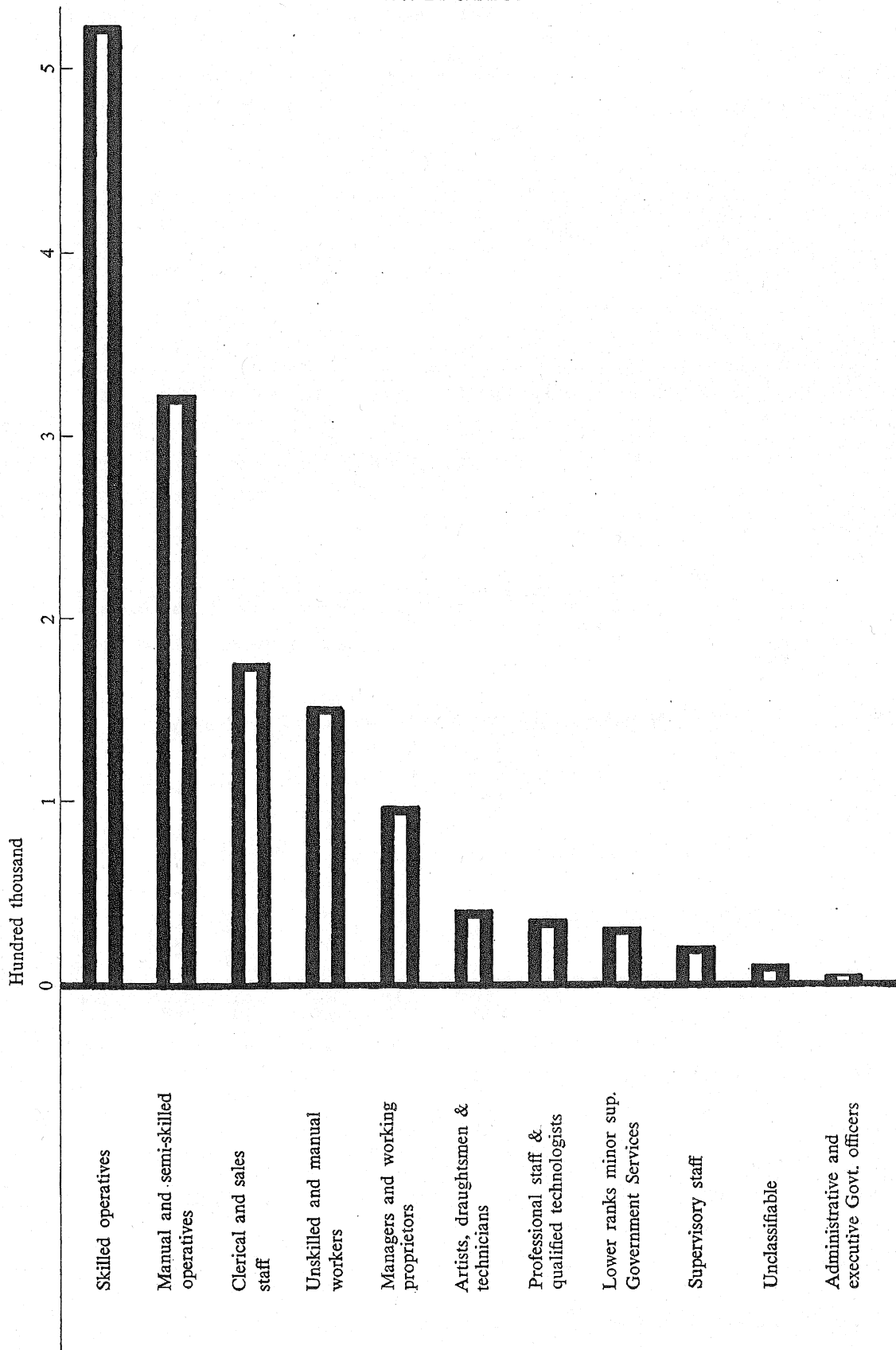

SECTION 4

INDUSTRIAL EMPLOYMENT AND ESTABLISHMENTS

1. Statistics on industrial employment and establishments relate only to establishments registered with or recorded by the Labour Department. The terms "registered" and "recorded" refer to industrial undertakings which are equipped with power-driven machinery or employ 20 or more manual workers. While "registered" factories hold registration certificates issued by the Labour Department, "recorded" factories, being in the course of registration, do not hold such certificates. Outworkers and persons employed in very small industrial concerns and home industries are not included.

2. The annual departmental reports of the Commissioner of Labour form the sole source of information. All figures published refer to the position as on 31st March, except those in Table 4.7 which cover the calendar year.

3. Industrial classification follows the International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities adopted in Hong Kong in 1949. Due to extensive revision of industrial grouping by the Labour Department, it is not possible to compare employment particulars of 1959 onwards with those of earlier years below major group level. Therefore, statistics on selected industries have been presented in two separate tables.

1. Index numbers *without brackets* in the following tables are compiled by using average daily wages in 1958 as the base for the industry concerned. Therefore, no direct comparison can be made between different industries. Comparison can only be made over time in the industry concerned.
2. Index figures *in brackets* are compiled by using the overall average wages excluding or including fringe benefits in 1958 as the common base throughout industry such that comparison can be made directly between any industries at any time. For example, if we wish to compare the average daily wages excluding fringe benefits between workers in Garments and Shirts and Cotton Spinning in 1964, we can compare the two index figures in brackets, i.e. 171 to 141 and obtain the result, 121%.
3. The overall average daily wages excluding and including fringe benefits in 1958 were H.K.\$5.53 and H.K.\$6.41 respectively.
4. Average daily wages excluding or including fringe benefits for any particular industry listed in the table in any period can be calculated by multiplying the overall average daily wages excluding or including fringe benefits in 1958 by their respective index numbers in brackets. For example, the average daily wages excluding and including fringe benefits for workers in Cotton Spinning in 1964 can be obtained by multiplying \$5.53 by 141% and \$6.41 by 171% respectively.
5. Fringe benefits include: (i) cash benefits, such as New Year bonus, good attendance and efficiency bonuses and other cash allowances, e.g. electricity allowances; (ii) free or subsidized food or food allowance; (iii) free or subsidized accommodation; and (iv) paid holidays.
6. No overtime payment has been included.
7. All index numbers refer to the position in March each year except as indicated and are calculated to the nearest point or per cent.
8. The textile industry consists of Cotton Spinning, Cotton Weaving (2 and 3 shifts), Knitting and Garments and Shirts.
9. Manufacturing includes the first ten industries from Cotton Spinning to Plastics listed in the tables.
10. The term "worker" includes skilled and unskilled operatives and supervisors as well as service trades such as fitters, mechanics and electricians.

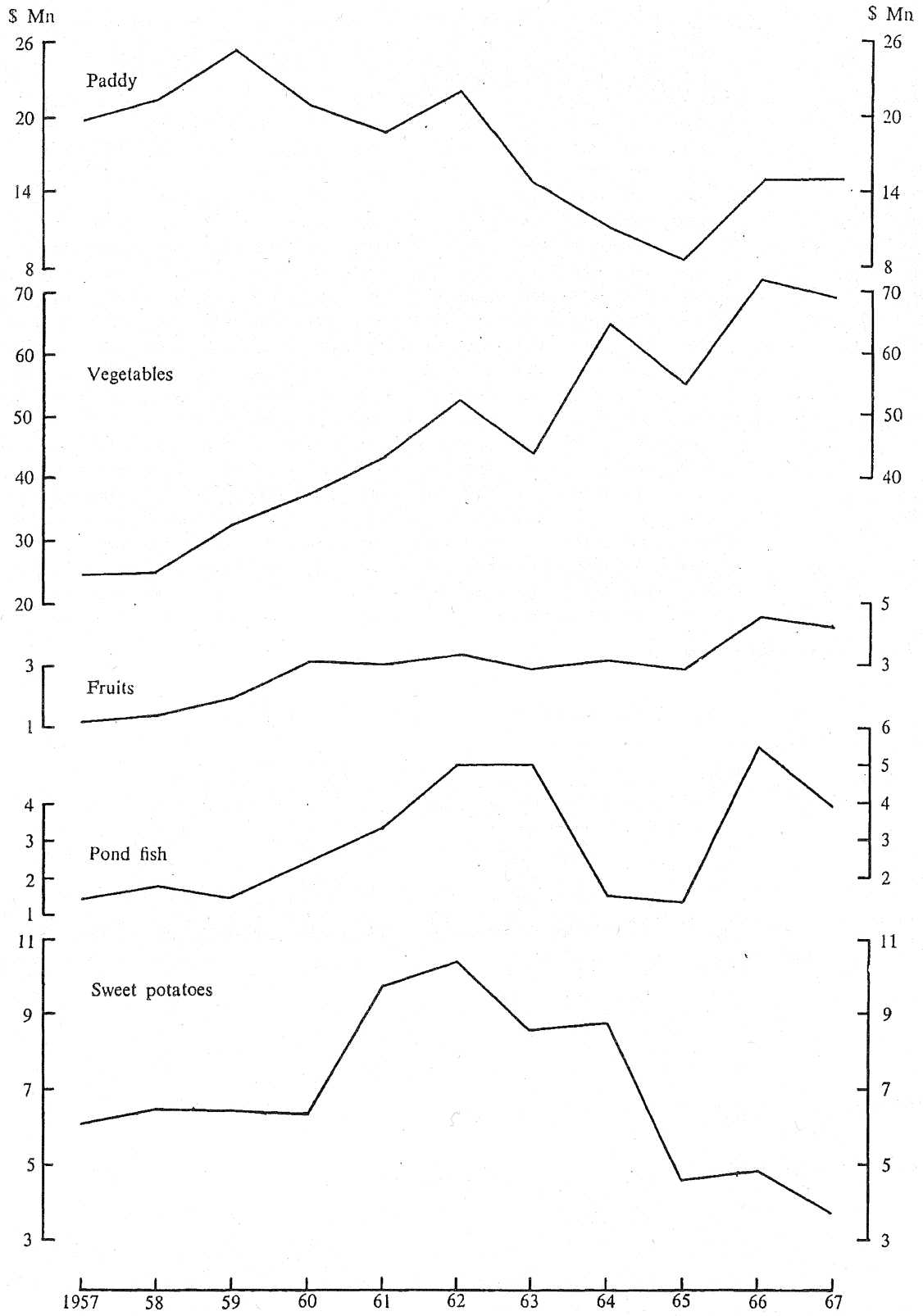

SECTION 6

EXTERNAL TRADE

1. Trade statistics comprise movements of cargo between Hong Kong and other countries by land, air and water, and to a limited extent, by post, with the exception of the following classes of goods:—

- (a) Transshipment/transit cargo;
- (b) Articles imported or exported by the armed forces of the Crown;
- (c) Ships' stores, including bunker fuel; aircraft stores, including aviation fuel;
- (d) Personal baggage and possessions of travellers;
- (e) Advertising material supplied free of charge and samples of no commercial value;
- (f) Marine fish arriving in the Colony direct from fishing grounds on fishing craft registered or licensed in the Colony;
- (g) Gifts of a personal nature where no payment has been made by the receiver.

2. IMPORTS are goods which have been produced or manufactured in places outside the jurisdiction of Hong Kong and brought into Hong Kong by land, air or water for whatever purpose.

3. EXPORTS from Hong Kong are the natural produce of Hong Kong or the products of a manufacturing process in Hong Kong which has changed permanently the shape, nature, form or utility of the basic material used in manufacture.

4. RE-EXPORTS are products which have previously been imported into Hong Kong and which are re-exported without having undergone in Hong Kong a manufacturing process which has changed permanently the shape, nature, form or utility of the product.

5. Previous to 1959 all shipments from Hong Kong were accounted for as EXPORTS. Separation of RE-EXPORTS from EXPORTS commenced only from 1959.

6. The value of imports represents cost, insurance and freight, and the values of exports and re-exports represent the cost and charges of delivering the goods on board the vessel for shipment.

7. Movements of gold and specie are recorded in a special table. The figures in the series of trade tables represent the trade in merchandise only.

8. Up to the end of 1947 the Pre-war Classification List of Commodities was used; from 1948 to 1951, the International Minimum List of the League of Nations; from 1952 to 1963, the S.I.T.C. (Original); and since 1964 the S.I.T.C. (Revised). All trade figures previous to 1964 have been adjusted on the Division level with those of that year and onwards.

9. The list of countries with which Hong Kong has trade relations has been extended and adjusted from year to year. To facilitate comparison over the years, the 1967 classifications have been followed.

10. The tables and graphs under this Section have been prepared from the data published in the HONG KONG TRADE STATISTICS. This publication, issued monthly, should be consulted for fuller details concerning the external trade of Hong Kong.

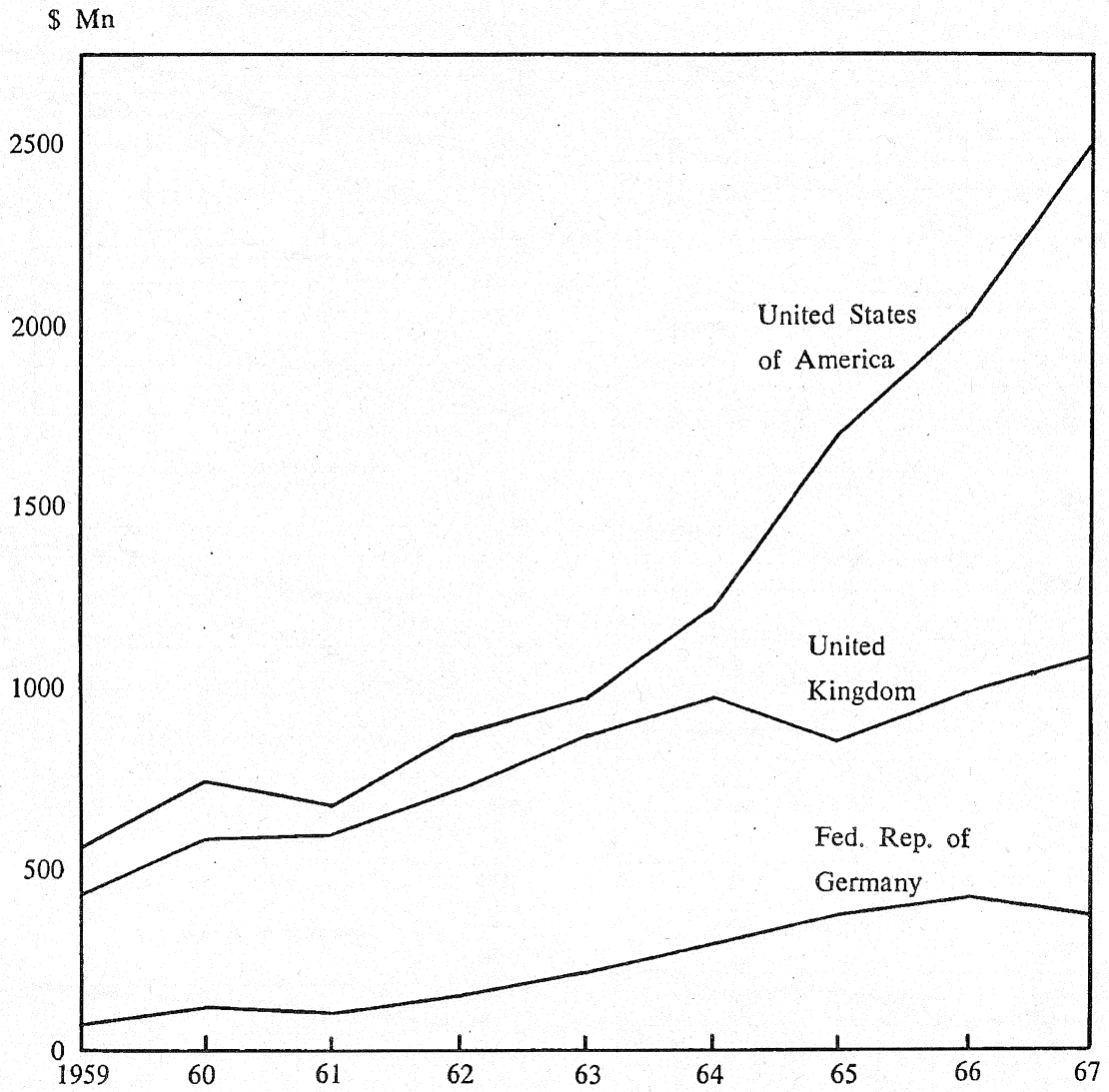
6.13 PRINCIPAL DOMESTIC EXPORTS



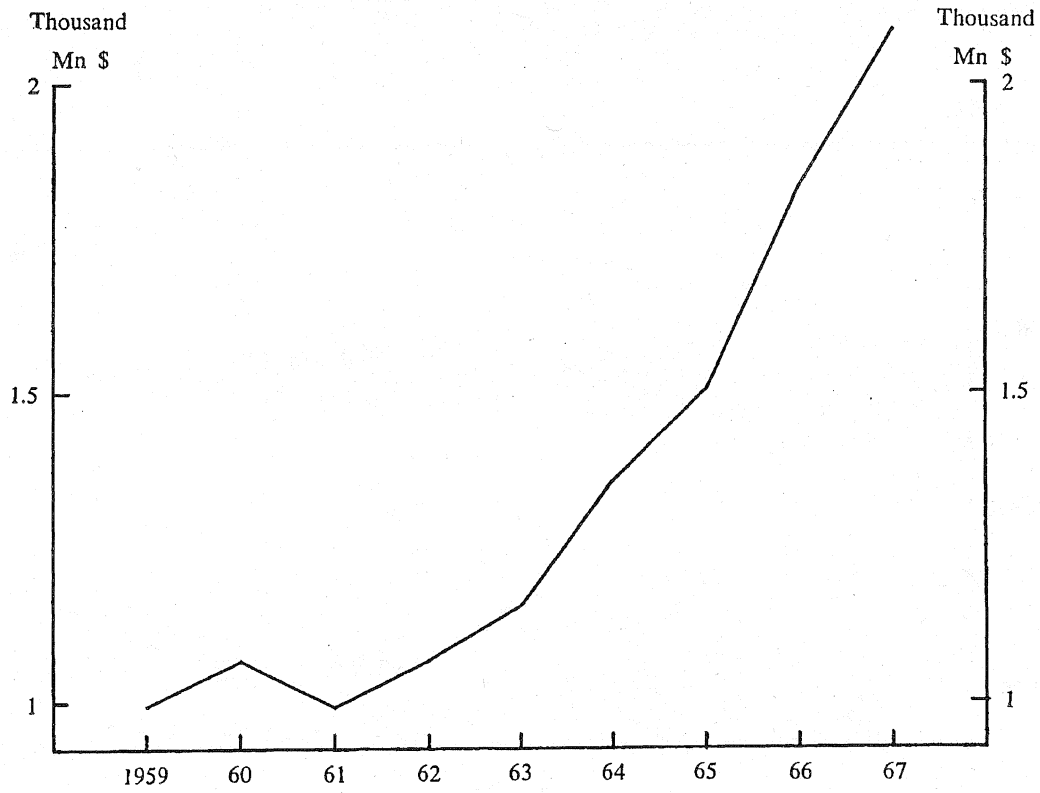
6.14 PRINCIPAL DOMESTIC EXPORTS TO MAIN MARKETS



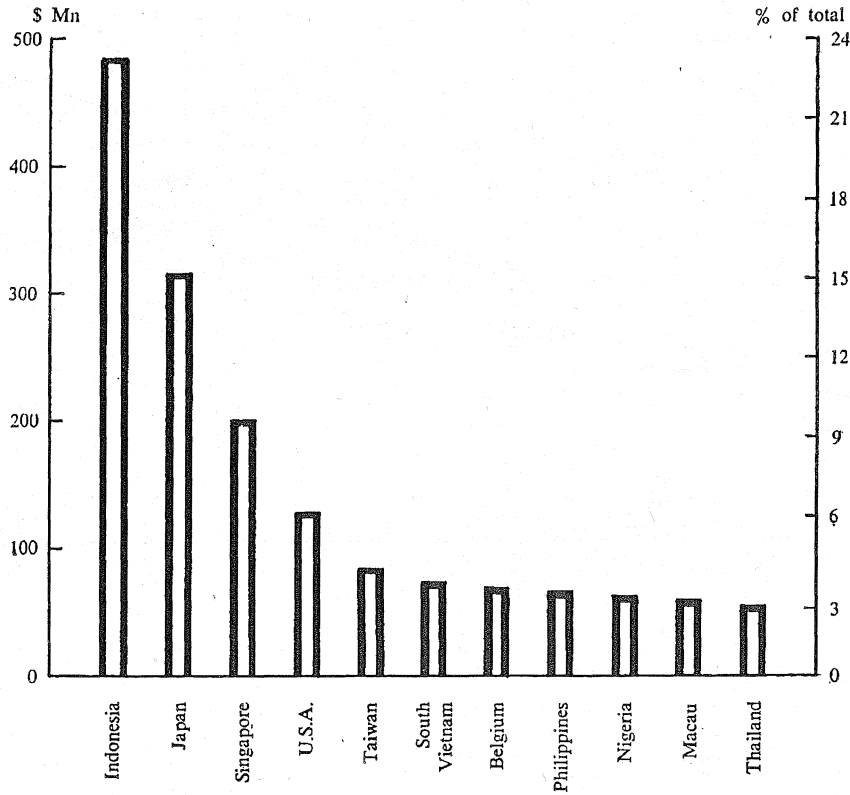
6.15 DOMESTIC EXPORTS: MAIN MARKETS



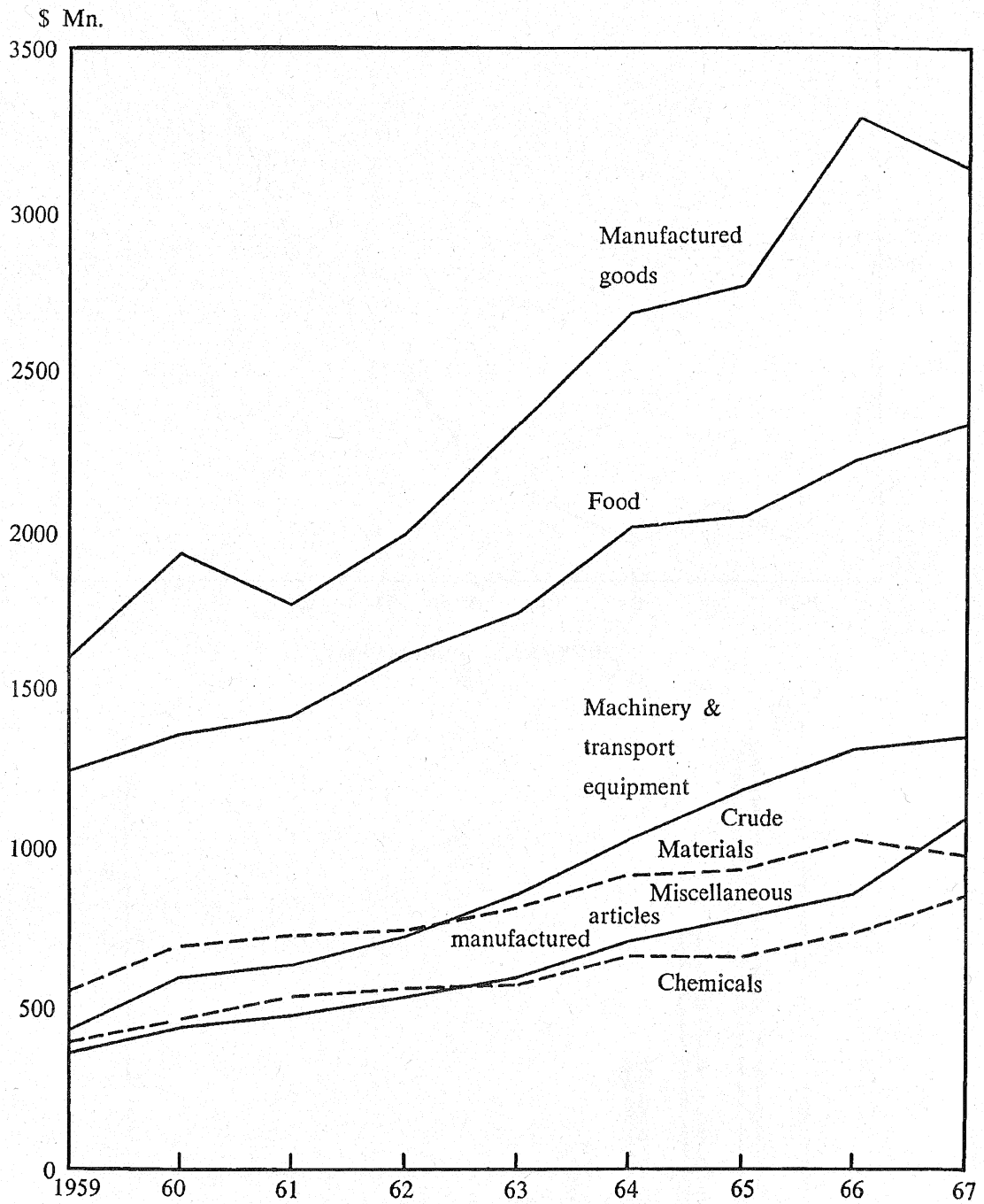

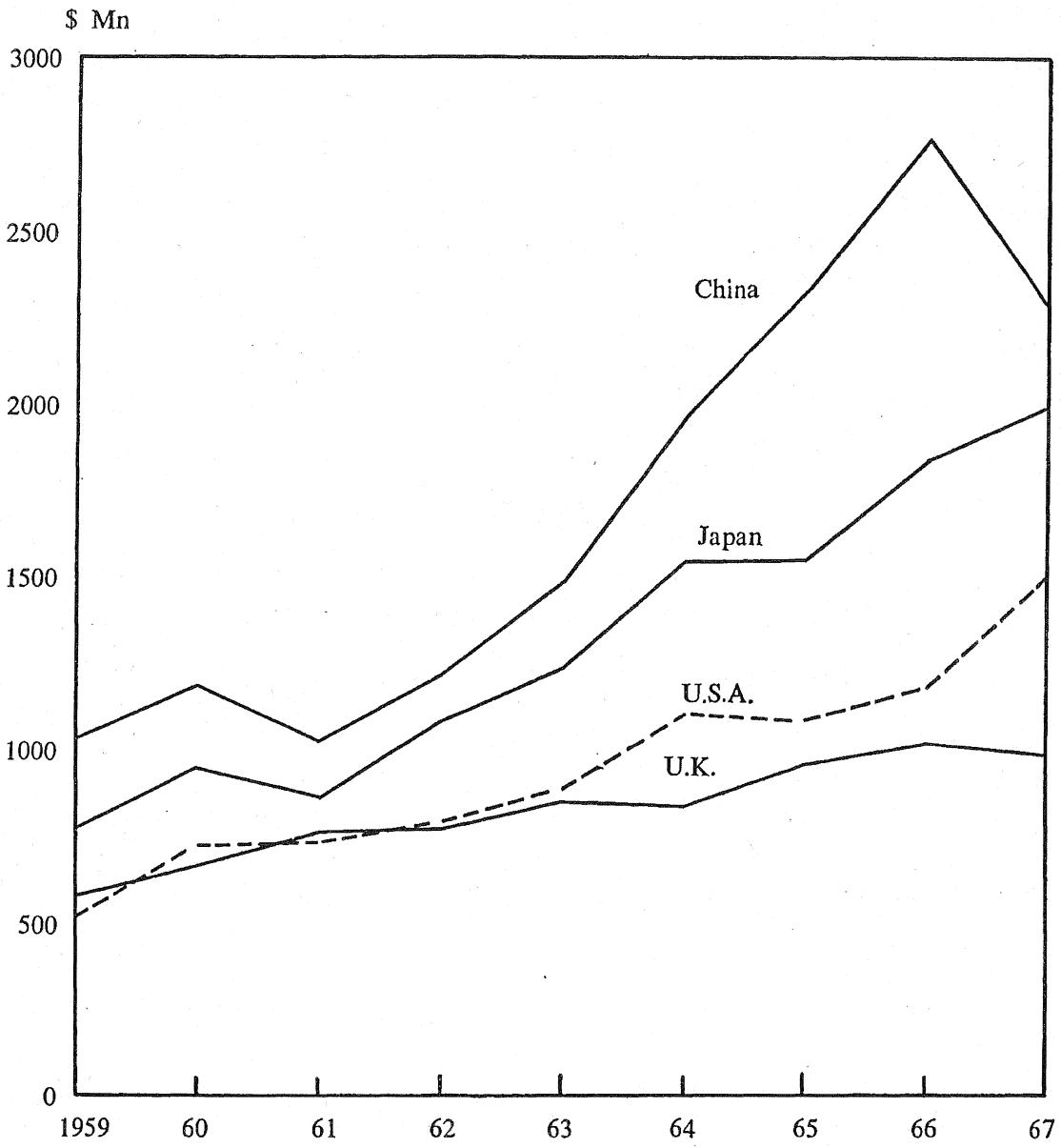

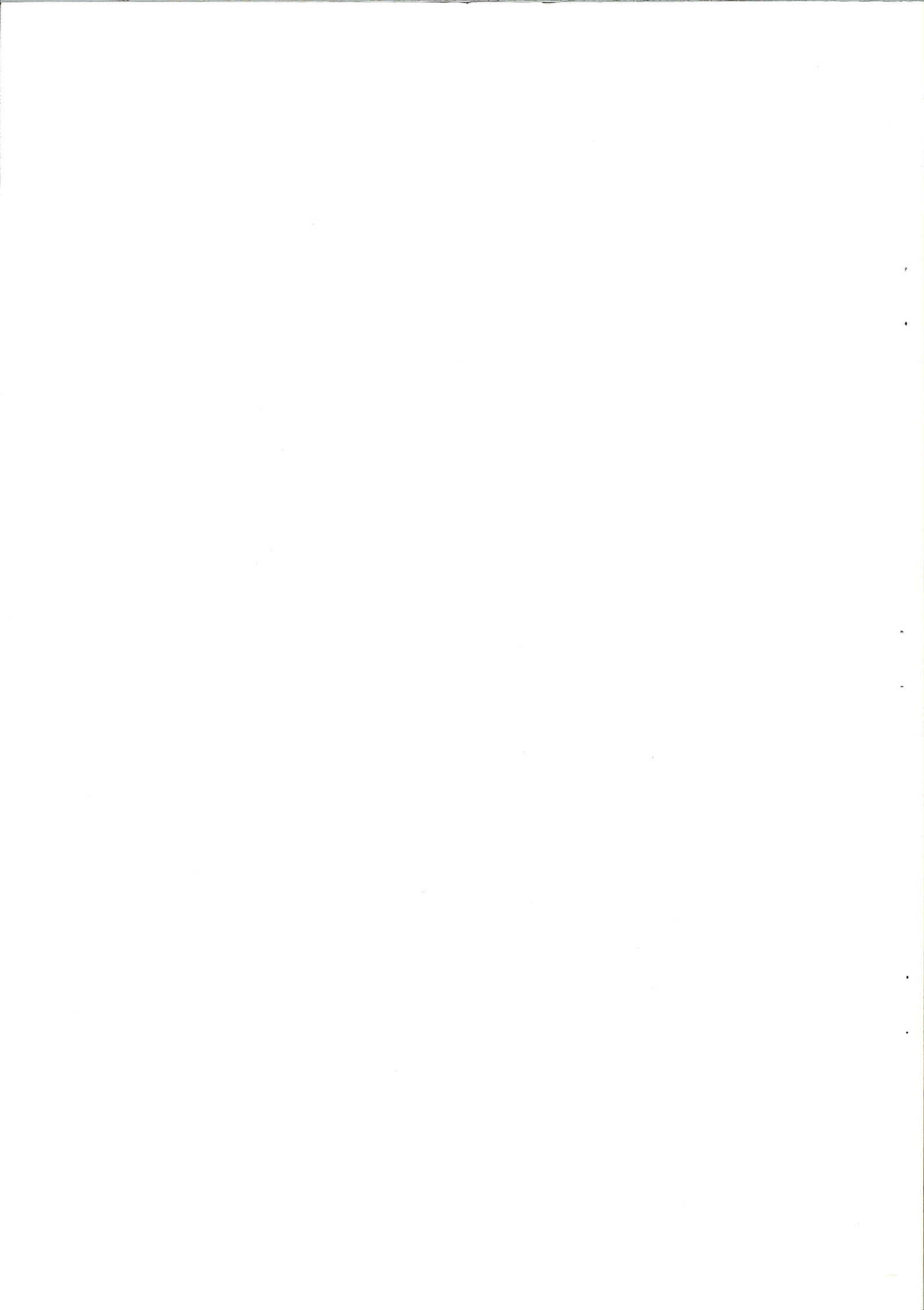


6.17 PRINCIPAL IMPORTS



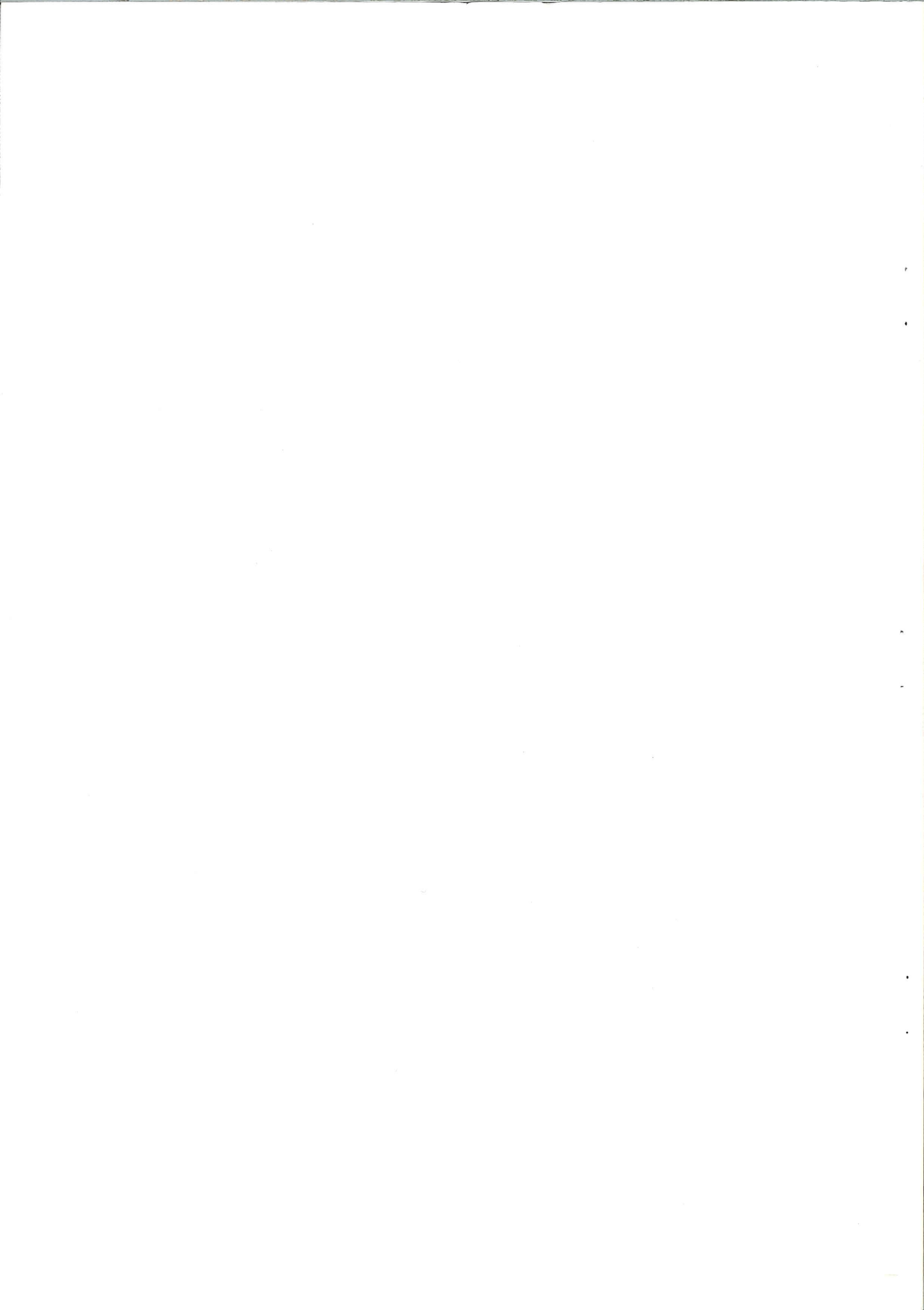

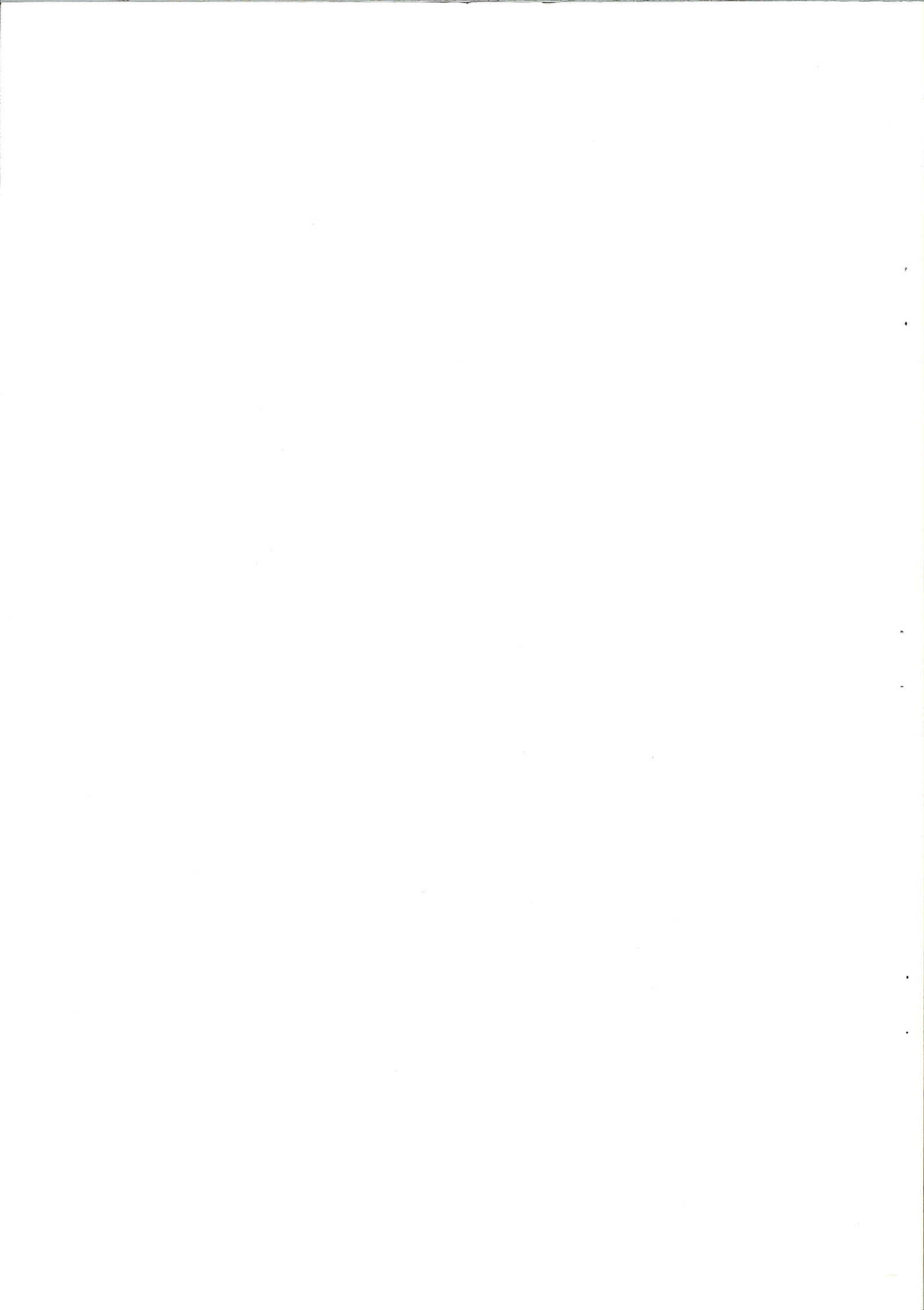

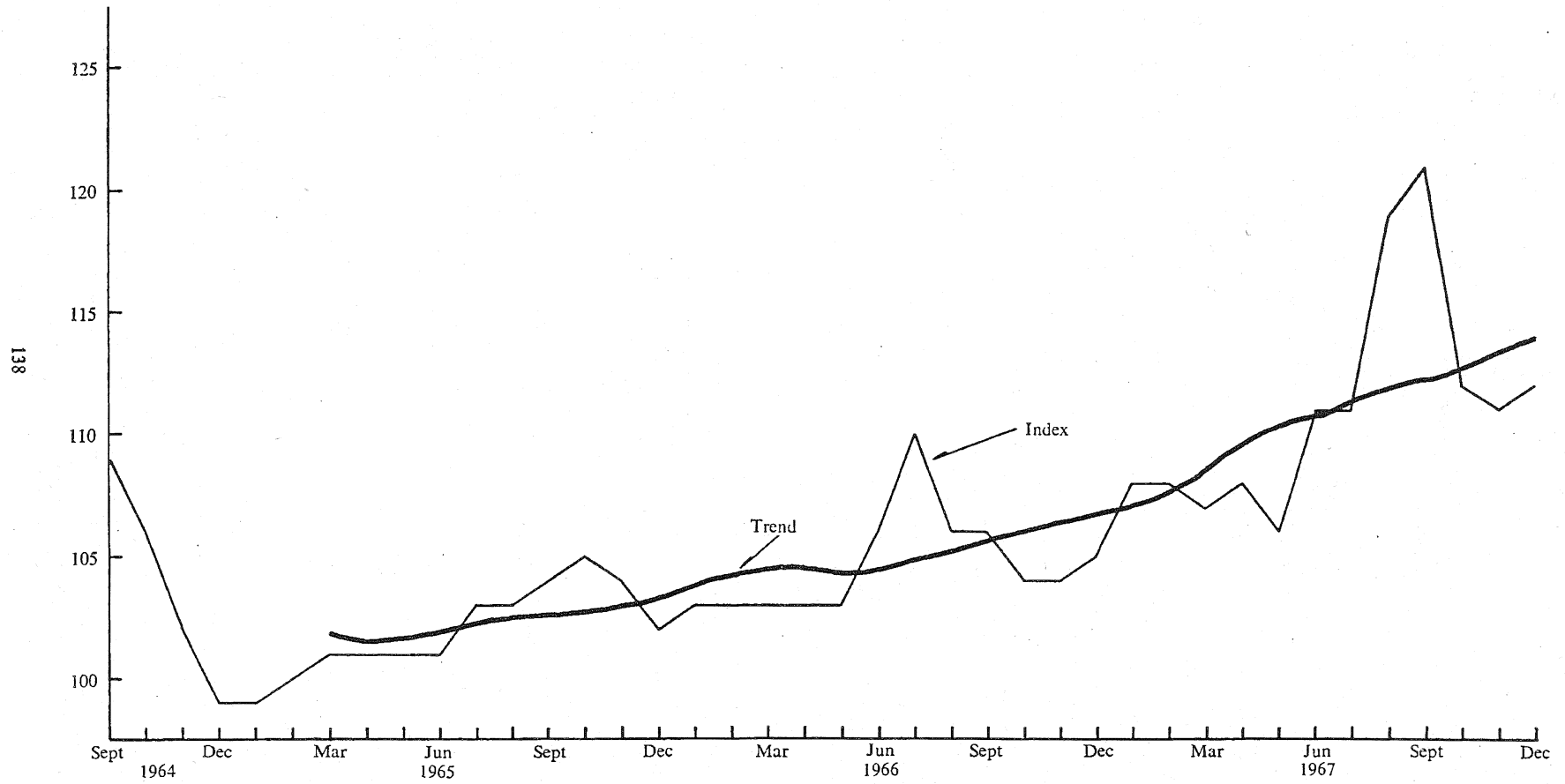

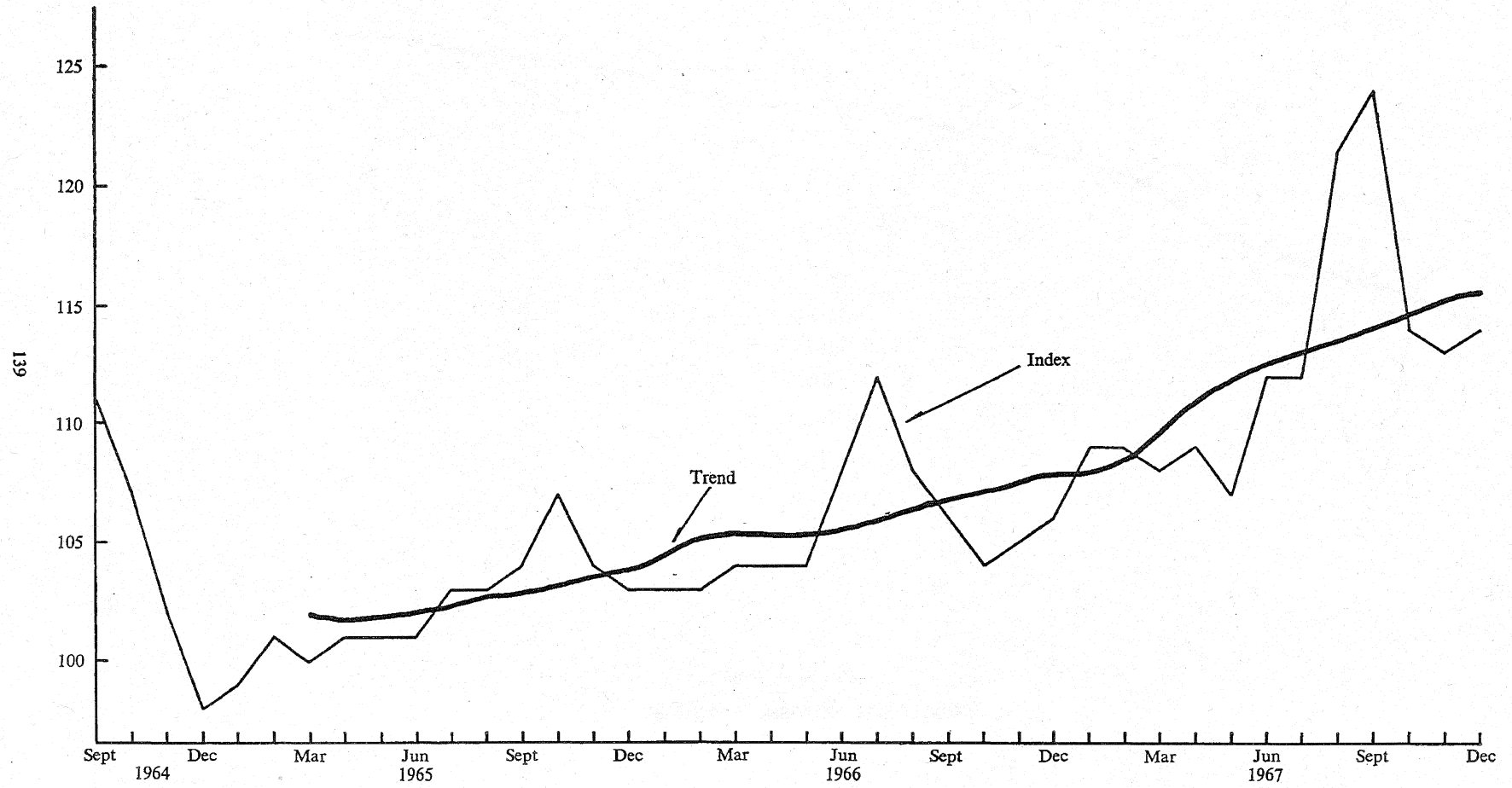
8.3 GENERAL CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

(1963-64 = 100)



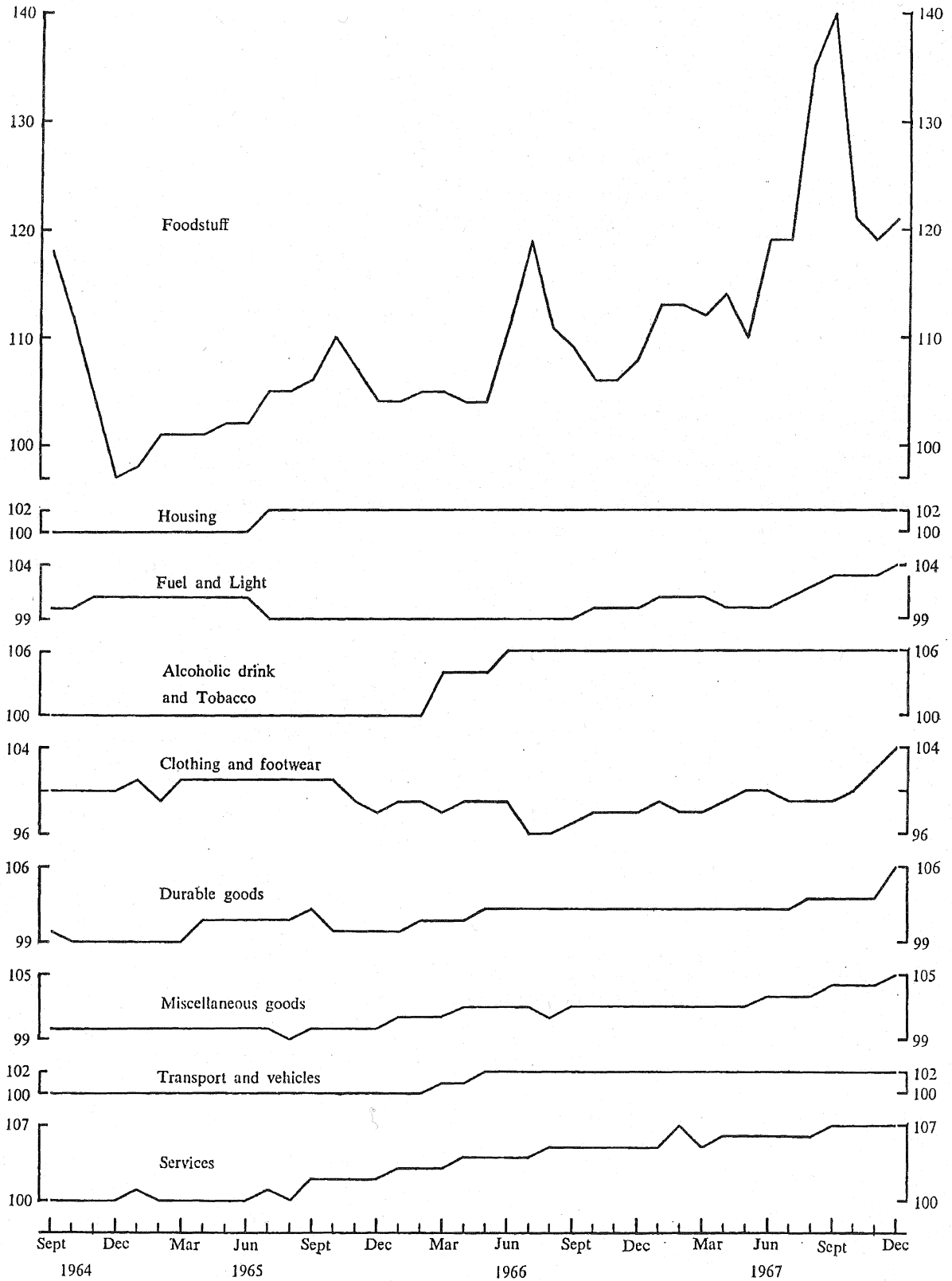
8.4 MODIFIED CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

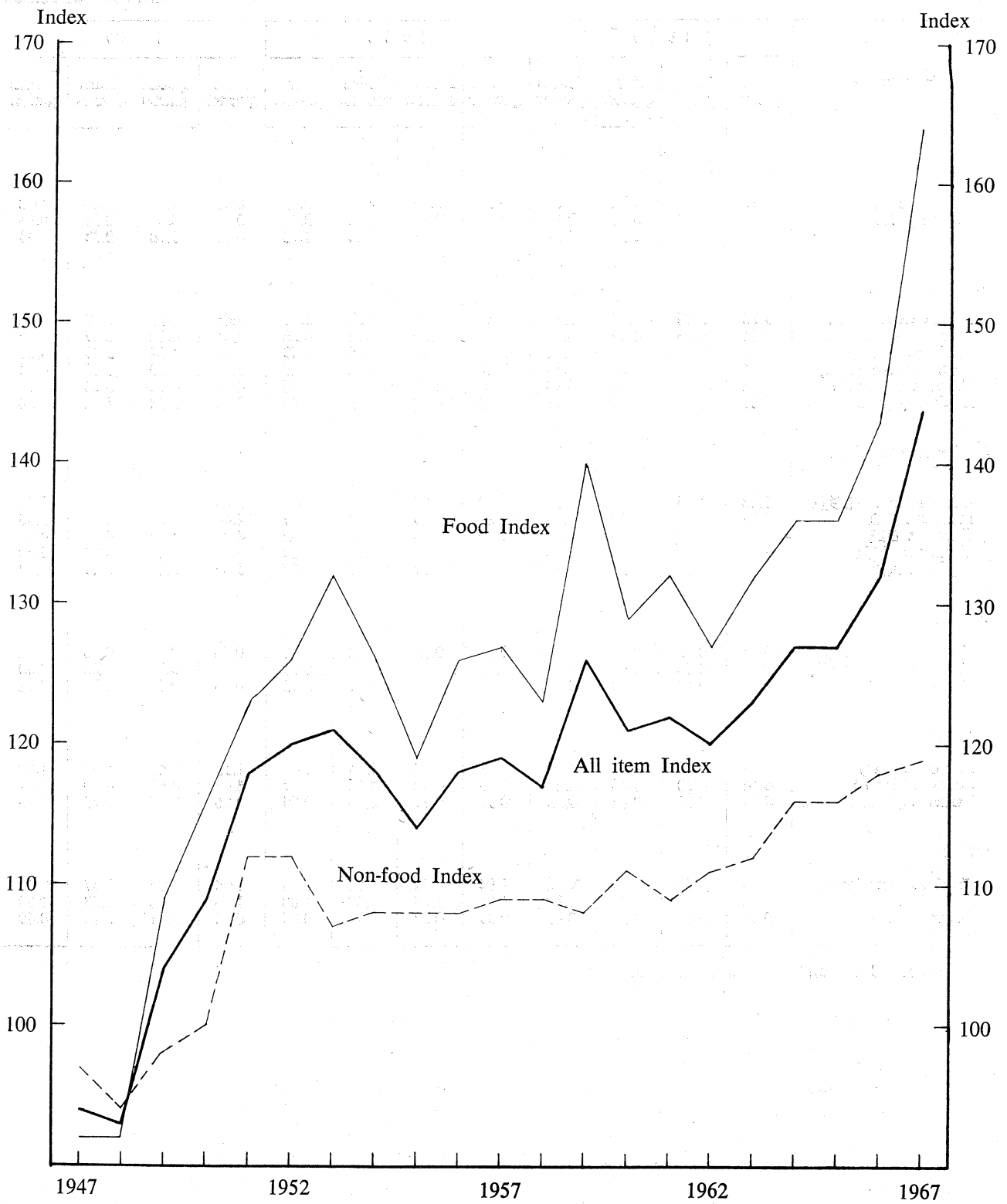

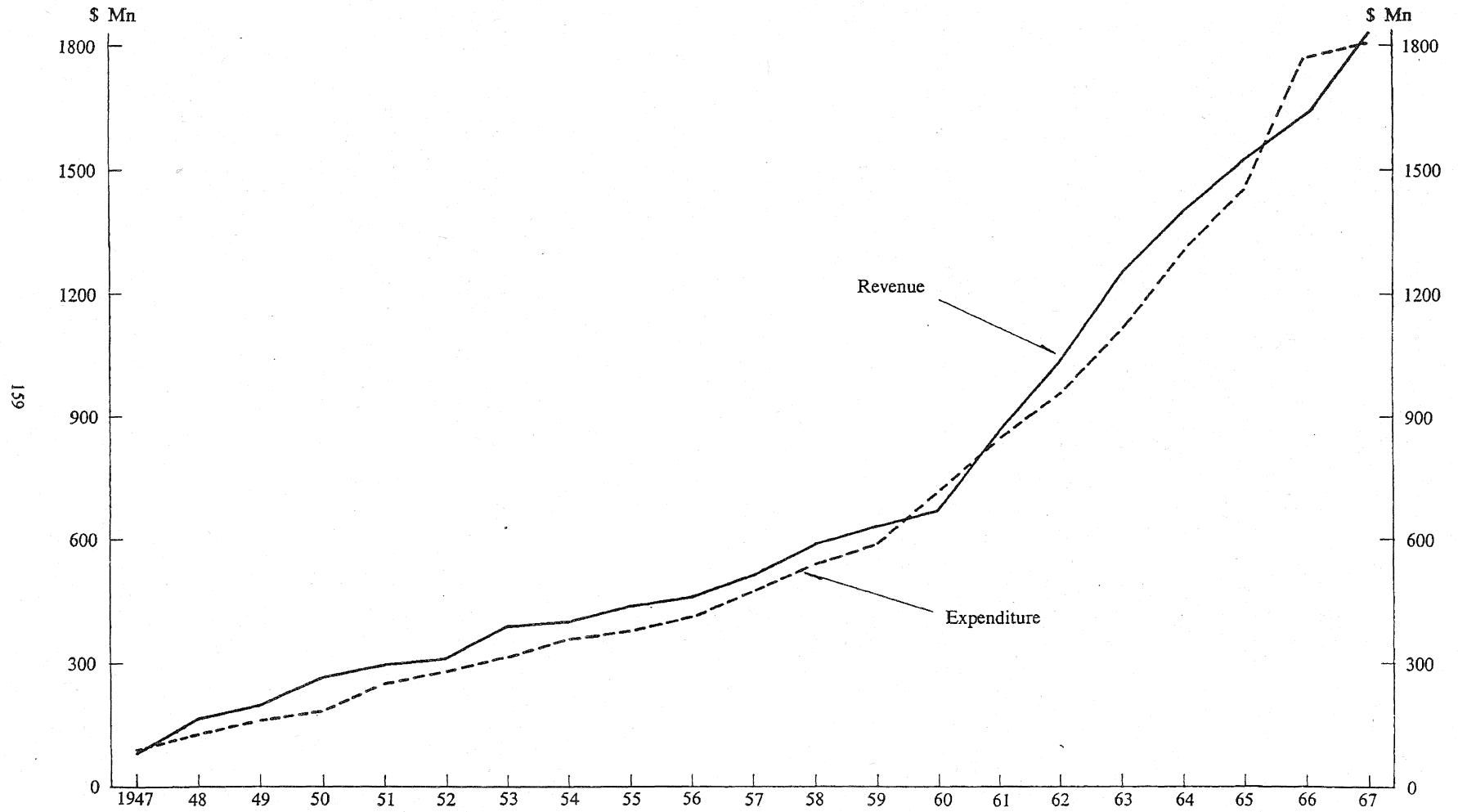

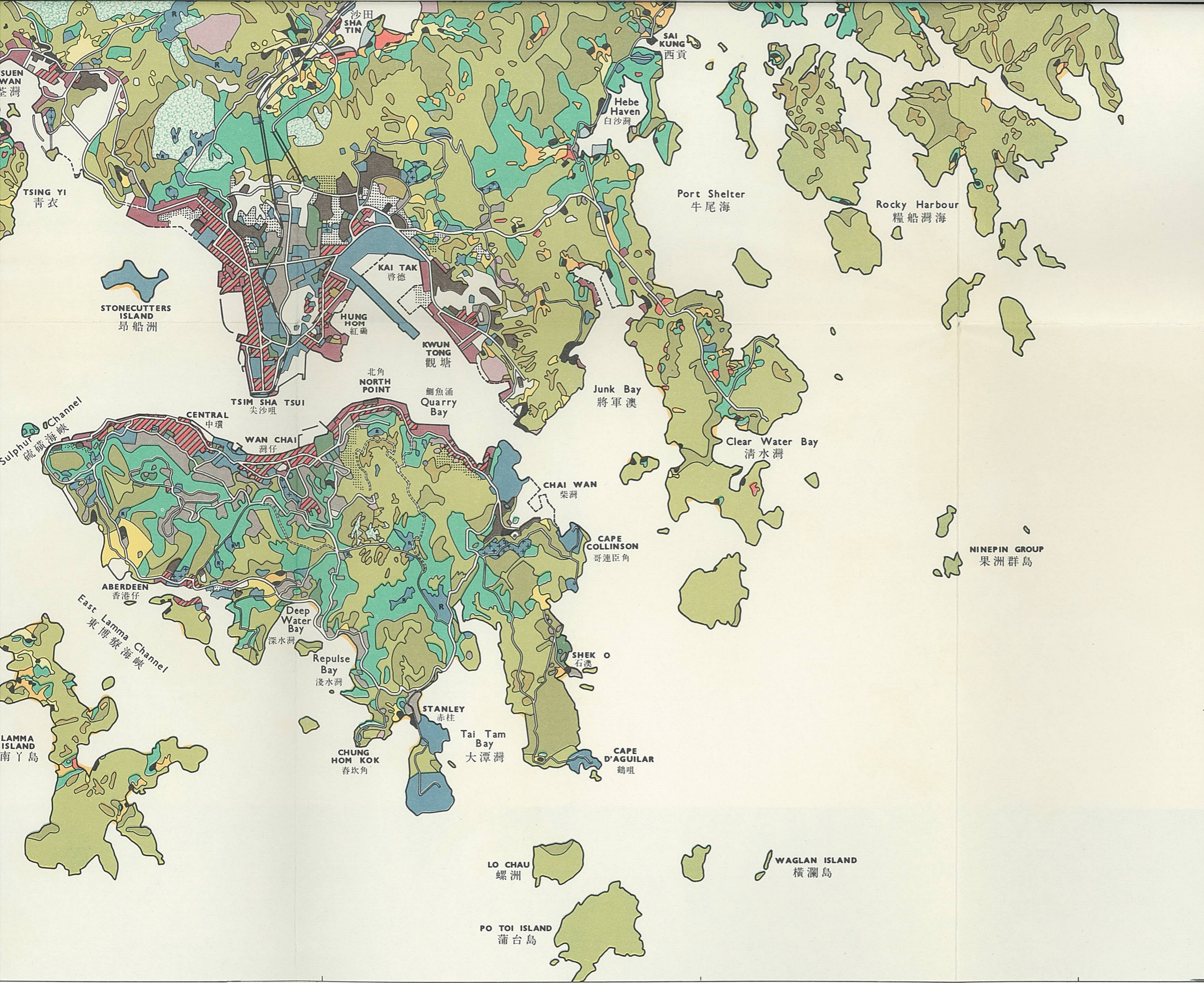
