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THE HOSPITAL OF SAINT RAPHAEL, in the City of New Haven,  
incorporated by an Act of the Legislature of Connecticut, March 14, 1907, is  
conducted by the Sisters of Charity of the Diocese of Newark.

#### THE HOSPITAL OF ST. RAPHAEL.

The report of the work accomplished by the Hospital of St. Raphael during the year 1917, is hereby submitted. The total number of cases treated was thirty-one hundred and twelve; the number of births, three hundred and seventy-five; fifteen hundred and eighty-six surgical operations were performed; four hundred and twenty-four pictures were taken and developed in the Roentgen-Ray laboratory and four hundred and twenty-five ambulance calls were responded to. Deaths on the medical side numbered ninety-one; surgical, ninety-five; totaling one hundred and eighty-six in all departments.

Sixty-two hundred and ninety-six weeks' treatment were given. Of this number, nine hundred and eighty were bestowed free. This giving of hospital care gratis, together with reduced rates in ward and special cases, entailed to the hospital, a deficit of \$32,696.00, which was met in part, from the income derived from private room service, State appropriations and contributions from benefactors.

The furnishing of a nursery with all that is newest and best has been completed and has greatly enhanced the service of the maternity department. The commodious ward set apart for this purpose is located on the third corridor, and therein each little new-comer has an individual bassinet of finest white enameled ware; the entire equipment of the nursery is of the same material and finish. The task of furnishing this department was begun two years ago by a band of devoted women who in their respective homes, held benefit entertainments for the worthy cause. As the funds materialized, the furnishings were purchased and those competent to judge, claim that our nursery is now second to none in all that pertains to the well being of its tiny occupants.

No special benefactions have been received during the past twelve months owing, no doubt, to the prevailing high rates of necessities, and to the many demands made upon our citizens for the relief of countries in war overseas.

Our plea for a new wing, a nurses' home and a chapel, while still unheeded, grows more insistent. Only those who minister to the ailing can appreciate the comfort nay, the necessity of a separate cottage for the housing of nurses and attendants, who spend hours on duty by day and by night, with the sick and dying. As in former years, the demand for ward space has been in excess of accommodations; not alone for patients recommended by outside physicians, but for staff members also; and our chapel with seating capacity for less than one-third who would attend divine service, is indeed a grave problem. Here then are opportunities for those endowed with a surplus of earth's treasures, to do practical good to their less fortunate brethren and to draw heaven's benediction on themselves and their posterity.

We record with keen regret the deaths of Dr. M. C. O'Connor and Dr. E. M. McCabe. Doctor O'Connor, "The beloved physician of New Haven," was a charter member of the staff and its senior consultant. Doctor McCabe held the office of specialist in eye, nose, ear and throat diseases from the founding of the hospital until his decease. In the passing of these pioneers, St. Raphael's has lost skillful and faithful attendants.

The gratitude of the hospital is due, and accorded in full measure, to the gentlemen of the Board of Directors and the Medical Staff; to resident physicians, the training school, the Ladies' Sewing Guild and to all who have by helpful deed and kindly word, assisted the administration in furthering the welfare of the patients and the efficiency of the institution.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

The ambulance is under control of the Superintendent, and application for its use should be made directly to the hospital.

An ambulance surgeon accompanies all calls for the conveyance of patients to the hospital.

### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS

Application for the admission of patients should be accompanied by a certificate from a reputable physician and should be addressed to the Sister in charge.

The charge per day for accommodation in the general wards is \$1.25, private wards, \$12.25, which includes medical and surgical attendance together with medicine, nursing and laundry.

It is recommended that medical cases unless urgent, be sent to the hospital not later than 5:00 P. M.

All cases of sudden injury are received day or night.

The private corridors are devoted to private rooms where persons who are taken ill in our city may enjoy the comforts of home and have the attendance of their own physician, if preferred.

Private room charges are from \$20.00 upwards to \$30.00 per week. The fees of visiting Surgeons and Physicians are independent of hospital charges and must be arranged in advance.

The hospital does not furnish meals or lodgings for the friends of patients.

The hospital does not launder personal clothing.

### REGULATIONS FOR PATIENTS

Patients who are well enough to be up, will rise in time for breakfast, after which they will vacate the wards, as far as possible, so that they may be aired and put in order.

Patients must be in their respective wards and places during the rounds of physicians.

Patients must not sit on beds, talk loud, or make any unnecessary noise in wards. Silence should be observed during the visits of the physicians.

Patients must not enter the laundry, kitchen or other private apartment unless by permission.

No patient is to leave the premises without the permission of the Sister in charge of his ward.

Patients must leave in the office for safe keeping, any money or other valuables they may have; in case of failure to do so, the hospital will not be responsible for any loss which may occur.

No smoking allowed in wards or corridors.

Lights must be lowered at 9:00 P. M.

All complaints should be made to the Superintendent

### RULES FOR VISITORS

The friends of the sick are allowed to visit them on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, from 3:00 to 4:00 and from 7:00 to 8:00 P. M.

Sunday and Legal Holiday hours are from 2:00 to 4:00 and from 7:00 to 8:00 P. M. Not at other times without special permission.

Not more than two visitors will be admitted at once to see any patient. No children allowed.

No article of food or drink may be carried into the wards; all such must be left with the nurse in charge, and if approved by the physician, will be given to the patient named.

Visitors must observe perfect order and propriety while in the hospital; must confine their visits to their immediate friends, and must leave the building promptly at the expiration of visiting hours.

Visiting hours to private rooms are from 10:00 A. M. to 8:00 P. M. Visitors will be admitted during these hours with proper discretion.

**REPORT OF THE SCHOOL FOR NURSING**

The sixth annual report of the St. Raphael School for Nursing is herewith presented.

During the year there have been sixty-eight applications for admission; sixteen probationers have entered; eleven have been received as pupil nurses; there have been four dismissals, and one resignation. The school now numbers eleven seniors, twelve intermediates, ten juniors and six probationers.

The health of the pupils has been uniformly good and their progress in theory and practice most satisfactory. All have the passing of the State Board Examination in view which proves a great stimulus to their application.

On the evening of June fourth, the Class of Nineteen-seventeen was graduated. Honors were conferred by the Rt. Rev. John J. Nilan, D. D. His Lordship delivered a stirring address on "The Call of the Hour," and spoke feelingly of our country at war; reminding the nurses that theirs is a militia of mercy, and that like good soldiers, their duty was to obey orders and to be ready to make personal sacrifices for God and country.

The need of a separate dwelling for nurses continues to be felt but prevailing conditions prevent the management from adding to the heavy burden of debt carried by the hospital. The gift of a Nurses' Home would be a veritable monument of mercy to St. Raphael's.

It is especially gratifying to the authorities of the school to have assurance that the graduates are doing excellent work as private nurses and in institutional positions. A list of the graduates is on file in the office of the hospital, and attention to calls for service will be cheerfully rendered.

It affords much pleasure to acknowledge obligations to the members of the Medical Staff for their lectures and other courtesies given to the school; likewise to the Board of Education for the privilege accorded to the seniors, of attending the class in dietetics and invalid cookery in the Boardman High School. We also thank other friends who have in any way contributed to the welfare of the school.

### COURSE OF TRAINING

1. The hospital is prepared to give a three years' course of training to young women desirous of becoming professional nurses.
2. Application to obtain this course should be made to the Superintendent of the hospital. Candidates between twenty and thirty years of age are preferred.
3. Unblemished character, sound health, unimpaired faculties, a good education and readiness to conform to the rules of discipline are required.
4. At the close of the preliminary term of three months probationers, if deemed fit for the work, are admitted to membership in the school. An allowance for the necessary expenses incidental to training is given, but this is in no way regarded as remuneration for services rendered; as the profession acquired is deemed an ample equivalent.
5. Pupils will reside in the hospital and serve as assistants in the various departments and are expected to perform any duty assigned by the Superintendent.
6. The right is reserved to terminate the connection of any pupil with the school, for reasons which may be deemed sufficient by the Committee on Training.
7. A vacation of two weeks will be allowed each year. All pupils are cared for gratuitously when ill, and receive the professional services of the physician of the school. Time lost through illness or for any other cause, must be made up.
8. When the full term of three years is completed, students, who have passed the examinations and whose deportment has been satisfactory, will receive the diploma and pin of the school. The diploma and pin of any graduate of the school may be revoked for cause by the Committee of the School for Nursing.

A gift of two hundred and fifty dollars shall entitle the donor to nominate a patient to a free bed for one year, for such a number of weeks as the income from the endowment will provide for.
