

#### TOO FRIAL TO COMPETE IN A RACE AS LONG AS 800M"

Women were only allowed to compete In athletics In 5 events:

- 100m
- 4x100m relay
- high jump
- discus
- 800m

German runner, Lina Radke, appeared to be too *fatigued* after winning gold In the 800m. They then declared women unfit to run for such a distance and banned the women's 800m from the Olympics for 32 years.

With the exception of 1984, women won the co-ed equestrian dressage event every year from 1974 until 2012.

Men made up the majority of those in the games this year, with 85.4% of them being men, compared to 14.6% of women athletes.


#### PERCENTAGE OF FEMALE ATHLETES




