

Introduction

I enclose certified photostatic copy of the will of J.J. Hurd, dated November 29th, 1916, and by reading same you will gather that Johnnie Bell Lattimor (nee Johnson) and Lizzie Mays were bequeathed jointly certain property on Ave. G., Miami, this land being Lot 37, and the north half of Lot 44 (37% feet) in 36N, Miami.

On August 2nd, 1919, W.B. Sawyer, one of the beneficiaries under the will, to whom had been bequeathed Lot 45, and the south one-half of Lot 44 in Block 36N, Miami (immediately adjoining the Latimore and Mays property) brought an action in Chancery in the Dade County Courts

- The historical data that we are using in the grant focuses on a collection of papers that belonged to Dana A. Dorsey. Dorsey was regarded as Miami's first Black millionaire, who was known to have amassed wealth through real estate. He moved to Miami in the late 1890's and lived there until his passing in 1940.
- The collection consists of 291 documents which include warranty deeds, mortgages, legal documents, and correspondence, detailing the properties and locations of what were the newly created Miami sub-divisions from around 1900 through 1940.








To W. B. Sawyer, M.D. One half of my property on Avenue "G", beginning at the corner of 4th St and Ave "G" city of Miami, Dade Co., Fla.


To Lizzie May and Johnny Bell Lattimer the other half of my property on avenue "G" beginning where the pond bequeathed to doctor W. B. Sawyer ends. Also I give to my grandchildren Lizzie Mae and Johnny Ball Latimer all of my property situated in the part of Miami known as Baldwin's addition.

Likewise I make, constitute an appoint Alan Stokes and John R Scott junior to be executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the 29th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

The above partly written and printed instrument was subscribed by the said J. J. Hurd in our presence and acknowledged by him to each of us; and he at the same time declared the above instrument so subscribed to be his last Will and Testament; and we at his request, have signed our names as witness hereto in his presence and in the presence of each other, and written opposite our names our respective places of residence.

Data Extraction

- 130 transcripts have been created from the Dorsey papers, out of 291 total records and over 620 pages
- Tabular data has been derived from 93 of the 291 records
- 295 individuals and 98 business entities have been identified

• These network graphs allow us to view the data in a different way--uncovering patterns and relationships we may not have noticed in the documents or tabular data.

• These exploratory visualizations serve as both an example of how this data could be used in research, as well as helping to formulate questions that could be explored further through other means of research

What can be done with this data?
