HIGH AND COMMON SCHOOLS REPORT

We are now paying third and fourth year tuition for 17 pupils, who are attending as follows: Eight at Cony, 5 at Gardiner, 2 at Wiscasset academy, 1 at Coburn Classical Institute and 1 at Maine Wesleyan Seminary. The total cost at present tuition rates is \$1,525. We are very glad so many of our students are getting a high school education but we wish to call to your attention the increased cost of tuition so you will be liberal in appropriating money for this purpose. The salary of the high school principal, the janitor work and the wood used for high school costs us about \$950 per year. We have had from 18 to 23 pupils registered for first and second year work.

During the past two years we have had the ranks of many of the pupils who have had first and second year high school work in our home school. Have found nearly all are able to go on and do satisfactory work in the larger schools.

New books in algebra are needed for next year. Those in use are badly worn and we hope to get later books such as are being used in most schools.

The Lewis School pupils have been transported to the Keyes Corner School for the Fall and Winter terms. The schools together have only registered 13 pupils. It has been much better for the pupils to attend one school. Thanks are due the parents and others having pupils to send, who very generously gave us permission to close their school.

Last year you voted \$66 toward Health Work. For that you have received the following: 124 pupils were inspected for defective throats, breathing, teeth, hearing, vision and skin. 91 pupils had defects. 74 had defective teeth and 61 defective throats. Health talks were given and notices sent home. We hope that much good may come of this inspection and an appropriation may be made for a continuance of Health Work in town.

All of the schools are trying to get libraries of at least 25 books. We hope by doing this to increase the interest in good reading and also get credit from the State for a library in each school. Gifts of suitable books will be much appreciated.

The 8th and 9th grades have been supplied with Strayer-Upton arithmetics. This is considered to be one of the best of the recently published arithmetics. Teachers and pupils report they are finding the book interesting and practical. We hope to have all grades supplied by next Fall.

For several years the State has allowed us to defer building a sanitary toilet at the Plain's School. There are 17 pupils attending there and the outbuilding is in bad condition. The State expects us to build a toilet there during this next year.

As you probably know the last Legislature increased the school year from 30 to 32 weeks, so we are obliged to appropriate enough for 2 weeks more than usual. We have added \$300 to the amount voted last year as it costs us about \$150 per week.

This has been a pleasant and profitable year in our schools. We have received good cooperation from parents, citizens and teachers. This has helped us very much.

We are sorry to have to recommend more than usual but as we have explained to you in the foregoing paragraphs you will understand we are obliged to have these amounts or the deficit for next year will be very heavy.

## Town Warrant

---

To W. E. Cunningham, a constable of Whitefield, in the  
County of Lincoln.

Greeting:—

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the town house in said town, on the third day of March, 1930, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:—

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. To choose a clerk.

ART. 3. To hear and act on the report of the several town officers.

Art. 4. To elect selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To elect a treasurer.

Art. 6. To elect an auditor.

Art. 7. To elect one or more road commissioners.

Art. 8. To elect a collector of taxes.

Art. 9. To see what time the taxes of 1930 shall be paid in full.

Art. 10. To elect one or more members of the school committee.

Art. 11. To elect one or more fire wards.

Art. 12. To choose all other necessary town officers.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of common schools, for free high school, for repairs of school buildings, for text books and supplies, and for transportation of high school pupils for the ensuing year.

ART. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of improved highway during the ensuing year.

ART. 15. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money to entitle the town to state aid as provided in Sec. 19, Chap. 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

ART. 16. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 154 of the Public Laws of 1917, as amended by Chapter 157 of the Public Laws of 1919 for the construction of a state aid road beginning at the south end of Westport and extending in a westerly direction to Westport-Wiscasset ferry; then to Plumstead Four Corners; thence in a general northerly direction via Birch Point road to state highway "D" near the residence of Richard Grover; thence following state highway "D"

Wiscasset village; thence over the new Sheepscot road, so called to the Alna town line; thence over the state aid road and special resolve road via. Head Tide, so called, to the Whitefield town line; thence over state aid road No. 2 in the town of Whitefield to state highway route "P" and continuing in a straight line north of state highway "P" to the Jefferson town line.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of the state aid road as outlined in the report of the state highway commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the ways, highways and bridges under the provisions of Sec. 21, Chapter 25, R. S., amended Chap. 258, P. L. 1917.

ART. 18. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of the poor, for repairs of roads and bridges, for snow bills, for patrolman, for fire wards, for interest, for incidental expenses, and for salary of superintendent of schools for the ensuing year.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the town will raise to decorate the graves of soldiers buried in town.

ART. 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money should the same become necessary.

ART. 21. To see if the town will vote the wages of men and teams on the highway and the salaries of the several town officers.

ART. 22. To see if the town will raise \$56.00 toward the support of county public health nursing under the

state department of health to continue work with mothers and children.

ART. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the state of Maine.

ART. 24. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for maintaining the improved sections on third class highways.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of street lights in town.

ART. 26. To see if the town will grant and raise \$200.00 to be expended on the road between George Huntington's south line to the Alna town line.

ART. 27. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from A. B. McDonald's driveway to Harrison Crooker's driveway (the same Gilman place so called) if not to see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to fix the same.

ART. 28. To see if the town will grant and raise \$50.00 to be expended on the Wilson road.

ART. 29. To see if the town will grant and raise \$350.00 to gravel road between North Whitefield depot and South Jefferson line.

ART. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell the tax deeds in the hands of the treasurer.

The selectmen will be in session at the town house in said Whitefield, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town.

Hereof fail not and have you there and then this warrant with your doings thereon. Given under our hands in the Town of Whitefield, this tenth day of February, A.D. 1930.
