





The mission of the Elmar Oliveira International Violin Competition (EOIVC) is to provide talented violinists, ages 16-32, who are at the start of their careers, with networking, management, public relations, community engagement and concert opportunities in addition to a monetary prize. These long-term career development tools reach well beyond financial support, actively demonstrating the strong dedication of the EOIVC to cultivating and nurturing developing musicians as well as encouraging them to engage with the communities they serve.

Established in 2016 by celebrated violinist, Elmar Oliveira, in collaboration with the Lynn Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, Florida, the EOIVC takes place once every three years. To date, it is only the second international competition dedicated solely to the violin in the United States. Winners are chosen through a four-step process: online

submission, Quarter-Final, Semi-Final and Final Rounds. First Prize winners Sirena Huang (2017) and Julian Rhee (2020); Second Prize winners Alina Kobialka (2017) and Jung Min Choi (2020); Third Prize winners Hannah Tarley (2017) and Igor Khukhua (2020); and Honorable Mentions Quanshuai Li (2017) and Vikram Francesco Sedona (2020), are active EOIVC Laureates, each embodying the spirit of the Competition on both personal and artistic levels.

The inaugural competition, in 2017, garnered nearly 1.5 million views across multiple media platforms, and was the first violin competition to host its Finals via Facebook Live. In 2020, the EOIVC added a Community Engagement Round for its four finalists judged by an independent panel of community leaders, again, making it the first competition of its kind to do so, further solidifying the EOIVC's role as a standard-bearer in the industry.

Over the past six years, First Prize Laureates Sirena Huang and Julian Rhee have presented national and international performances spanning from recitals to chamber music performances to appearances as soloists with major symphony orchestras. Under the EOIVC banner and in line with its mission to engage with the community, they have given numerous masterclasses to elementary through college-aged students in the United States and South America with a focus on underserved groups, individuals and organizations. Recently, both Sirena and Julian won gold and silver medals, respectively, at the 11th Quadrennial International Violin Competition of Indianapolis.

The EOIVC's 2023 judging panel is Andrés Cárdenes (Chairman of the Jury), Ilya Kaler, Ida Kavafian, Irina Muresanu, Almita Vamos, Peter Zazofsky, and Scott Flavin. David Cerone, the former 2020 Chairman of the Jury, will serve as an alternate juror. The 2023 Preliminary Selection Committee is Ole Böhn, Olga Dubossarskaya Kaler, and Philip Setzer. New for 2023, the EOIVC has enlisted an official mathematician, Dr. Moshe Renert, to assist with scoring.

The EOIVC received 60 submissions for the 2023 competition. Ranging in ages 18-32, these remarkably talented young musicians represented 17 countries: Canada, Luxembourg, China, South Korea, France, Russia, Germany, Taiwan, Romania, Bulgaria, Venezuela, United Kingdom, Italy, Israel, Australia, United States, and Japan.

In addition to being a world-class violinist and a community advocate, Mr. Oliveira is also a champion of modern instrument and bow makers. To that end, several noted artisans and individuals have generously donated instruments and bows specifically designed for the EOIVC winners.

In addition to a \$30,000 cash prize provided by the David and Amy Fulton Foundation, the EOIVC 2023 First Prize winner will also receive a new violin designed by Christopher Germain, a Silver-mounted bow inspired by Elmar Oliveira's Dominique Peccatte designed by Rodney Mohr, a Musafia case donated by Christopher Reuning of Reuning & Son Violins, as well as more than 40 guaranteed national and international engagements with orchestras, music festivals and concert series over the next three years, including a New York recital sponsored by Tarisio Fine Instruments and Bows and a performance in Cremona, Italy sponsored by Amorim Fine Violins.



JULIA ANGELOV 22, UNITED STATES / BULGARIA

Violinist Julia Angelov has appeared with numerous American orchestras including the National Philharmonic at Strathmore, the U.S. Army Orchestra, the Arlington Philharmonic, along with orchestras throughout Russia and Europe. She has performed at venues such as Carnegie Hall

and Merkin Concert Hall, the Bolshoi Theater, and the Mariinsky Theater. Angelov is the winner of the Music Teachers National Association's National Strings Competition (USA). More recently, she was a semifinalist of the 2020 Young Concert Artists (YCA) International Auditions, and the 2021 Windsor International Strings Competition in England. In the spring of 2022, she made her recital debut at Weill Recital Hall of Carnegie Hall, and participated in the Sendai International Violin Competition. Angelov has spent her summers at the Kronberg Academy Violin Masterclasses and Heifetz International Music Institute, where she has been an artist on offseason tours and their Ensemble in Residence. She has also performed in Vladimir Spivakov's "Moscow Meets Friends Festival" in Russia, and the Pablo Casals Festival in France, where she was awarded the Milka Violin Prize. Angelov studied with Aaron Rosand and was mentored by Nurit Bar-Josef at the NSO Youth Fellowship Program of the John F. Kennedy Center where she was the Milka Violin Fellow by the Markow Totevy Foundation. She currently studies with Robert Lipsett at the Colburn Conservatory of Music.



ZACHARY BRANDON 24, UNITED STATES

Zachary Brandon, is a Masters of Music candidate at the Cleveland Institute of Music where he studies with Jaime Laredo and Steve Rose.

Zachary has collaborated with renowned concert pianist Jean Yves Thibaudet and

acclaimed oboist Ramòn Ortega. He has also soloed with the Symphony Orchestras of Lansing, Toledo, Kalamazoo, Fort Wayne, Birmingham- Bloomfield, Northbrook, Battle Creek, and the Kalamazoo Junior Symphony Orchestra among others.

Additionally, Zachary was a semi-finalist in the 2022 Sibelius International Violin Competition, 2019 Concours Musical International de Montréal and also in the Senior division of the 2021 and 2018 Menuhin International Violin Competition. He received top honors in the 2017 Cooper International Violin Competition and was honored as the Fourth Prize Laureate in the 2016 International Stradivarius Competition. 
Released in 2009 are recordings of concerti by Brahms, Mendelssohn, Beethoven, Barber and David Stock on the Artek and Albany labels. A recording of the complete works for violin by Leonardo Balada was released on Naxos in January 2011, with the complete Sonatinas and Fantasie by Schubert on Artek. This year

and next Mr. Cárdenes continues his project to record many standard and contemporary concerti. Released this year are the Chausson Concerto with the Vega Quartet and the Fauré Sonata on Artek Recordings and a harp and violin album with Gretchen Van Hoesen on CD Baby. Cárdenes' discography includes over three dozen recordings of concerti, sonatas, short works, orchestral and chamber music on the Ocean, Naxos, Sony, Arabesque, Albany, Delos, RCA, ProArte, Telarc, Artek, Melodya and Enharmonic labels.

Mr. Cárdenes has served as a jury member of the Tchaikovsky Competition, the Schoenfeld Competition, the Elmar Oliveira International Violin Competition and thriced served as President of the Jury of the Stradivarius International Violin Competition. Co-founded in 2018, he is the Artistic and Music Director of the Josef Gingold Chamber Music Festival of Miami.

Mr. Cárdenes is the father of two teenagers, Isabel, an accomplished young harpist studying at the Manhattan School of Music, and Tino, a math and computer whiz and talented classical and jazz pianist.

SCOTT FLAVIN (UNITED STATES)

Violinist Scott Flavin is a professor of violin, conducting, and chamber music at the University of Miami's Frost School of Music. In addition to his extensive teaching, he is a highly sought-after Concertmaster, serving from 2002 to 2019 as Concertmaster of Florida Grand Opera and currently serving in this position with the Symphony of the Americas. Additionally he has appeared in that role with such artists as Luciano Pavarotti, Lena Horne, and Itzhak Perlman.

Flavin is the first violinist of the internationally-acclaimed Bergonzi String Quartet, violinist of the Bergonzi Trio, and violinist of the PULSE Trio. He regularly performs as a soloist and recitalist in major venues internationally.

As a conductor, he is the Resident Conductor of The Henry Mancini Institute Orchestra and Associate Conductor for Eastern Music Festival. He has led the nationally broadcast "Jazz and the Philharmonic" for PBS.

Flavin is also an active arranger, composer, and writer. He has written four plays which have been produced nationally. He writes articles regularly for various publications, including Strings Magazine. His arrangements for string quartet are often performed on the radio (Performance Today) and around the country in concert and on recordings.

As a recording artist, Flavin's discography includes chamber music on the Naxos, M&W, and Centaur labels, and commercial recordings on Sony, EMI, and Warner Brothers. He has also performed on television numerous times for MTV Unplugged and the Video Music Awards. His solo recordings include Brahms: The Complete Violin Sonatas, and Great Violin Solos of the Opera and Ballet.



ILYA KALER (UNITED STATES)

Described by Gramophone as a "magician, bewitching our ears", Ilya Kaler is one of the most outstanding personalities of the violin today. He has many awards to his credit and is the only violinist to have won Gold Medals at the Tchaikovsky (1986), Sibelius (1985) and Paganini (1981) Competitions.

Mr. Kaler has earned rave reviews for solo appearances with distinguished orchestras throughout the world, which include the Leningrad, Moscow and Dresden Philharmonic Orchestras, the Danish and Berlin Radio Orchestras, the Symphonies of Montreal, Detroit, Baltimore, Seattle, the New Japan Philharmonic and Moscow and Zurich Chamber Orchestras, among others. His solo recitals have taken him throughout the former Soviet Union, United States, East Asia, Europe, Latin America, South Africa and Israel. An active chamber musician, Mr. Kaler has appeared at major music festival in the US and Europe.

Mr. Kaler's orchestral career includes guest Concertmaster appearances with San Francisco Symphony, Philadelphia Orchestra and Baltimore Symphony. He was Concertmaster of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra from 1996-2001.

Mr. Kaler's highly acclaimed recordings include Sonatas by Schumann and Brahms, concertos by Paganini, Shostakovich, Tchaikovsky, and Glazunov as well as the Taneev Suite, Bach sonatas and partitas among others.

One of the most sought-after teachers in the world, Mr. Kaler currently serves as a violin professor of The Cleveland Institute of Music. He has also held professorships at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY, the Indiana University School of Music in Bloomington, IN, and at the DePaul University School of Music in Chicago, IL.



IDA KAVAFIAN (UNITED STATES)

2019 marked the versatile Ida Kavafian's 35th and final year as Artistic Director of the acclaimed festival, Music from Angel Fire in New Mexico. She has been a frequent artist of the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center for over forty vears and was former violinist of the renowned Beaux Arts Trio. She has toured and recorded with jazz greats Chick Corea and Wynton Marsalis as well as Fiddler/ Composer Mark O'Connor, and has had a solo feature on CBS Sunday Morning. She premiered and recorded the concerto "Fire and Blood" by Michael Daugherty with the Detroit Symphony. She has toured and recorded with the Guarneri Quartet and performed with the Orion, Shanghai, Harlem and American Quartets, all as a violist.

Founder and Artistic Director for ten years of the Bravo! Colorado festival in Vail, co-founder of the ground breaking group TASHI more than forty years ago, Ms. Kavafian also co-founded the groups OPUS ONE and Trio Valtorna. She holds the Nina von Maltzahn Chair in Violin Studies at the Curtis Institute, where she was awarded the Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching.

Born in Istanbul, Turkey of Armenian parentage, she began her studies with Ara Zerounian, continued with Mischa Mischakoff, then graduated from The Juilliard School as a student of Oscar Shumsky. She was presented in her debut by Young Concert Artists with pianist Peter Serkin. Married to violist Steven Tenenbom, Ms. Kavafian has found great success in another field, the breeding, training and showing of top prize-winning Hungarian Vizsla dogs.



IRINA MURESANU (ROMANIA / UNITED STATES)

Internationally renowned Romanian violinist Irina Muresanu continues to stretch the boundaries of classical music. A compelling soloist and chamber musician, she has appeared throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Asia, and South Africa.

A laureate and winner of top prizes in several prestigious international violin competitions including the Montreal International, Queen Elisabeth, and Washington International, Ms. Muresanu has appeared with the Boston Pops, Miami Symphony, Suisse Romande, Romanian Radio and Montreal Symphony among others.

Ms. Muresanu is an avid performer of new music. Recent recordings include the complete works of Romanian composer Dan Dediu (Métier label), complete violin sonatas of William Bolcom (Centaur Records), Thomas Oboe Lee's Violin Concerto (dedicated to Ms. Muresanu) on the BMOP label, and works by Elena Ruehr for the Avie Records CD "Lift," included on Keith Powers' 13 Best Classical Music Recordings of 2016. Her acclaimed multimedia project "Four Strings Around the World" celebrates the diversity of music cultures around the world through the unifying voice of the solo violin.


Ms. Muresanu is a strong proponent of music education. She is an associate professor at the University of Maryland and has taught at Boston Conservatory and in the Harvard and MIT Music Departments.

Muresanu holds an Artist Diploma degree and a Doctor in Musical Arts degree from the New England Conservatory. She plays an 1849 Giuseppe Rocca violin with an Etienne Pajeot bow.



ALMITA VAMOS (UNITED STATES)

Acclaimed violinist, Almita Vamos, is a graduate of The Juilliard School where she studied with Mischa Mischakoff and Louis Persinger. Ms. Vamos has won the Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching six times, as well as the ASTA Distinguished Teacher of the Year Award, and has been featured on "Sunday Morning" on CBS. Currently, she is a professor of violin at the Chicago College of Performing Arts and the Music Institute of Chicago. Mrs. Vamos' students have won top prizes in many national and international competitions. Her students play in most of the major orchestras across the United States and around the world. Additionally, Mrs. Vamos was a member of the Lydian Trio and the Antioch Quartet. She won the Concert Artist Guild Award, among many other prizes, and has performed recitals at the 92nd Street Y, Town Hall, and Carnegie Hall. She has soloed with the Juilliard Orchestra, the Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Walter Hendl, and orchestras across Europe and Asia. Mrs. Vamos continues to perform as a soloist and chamber musician in America and abroad, and regularly teaches masterclasses in Norway and Iceland.





PETER ZAZOFSKY (UNITED STATES)

Violinist Peter Zazofsky has enjoyed a richly varied career as soloist, chamber musician, and educator. He has given solo performances with many of the great orchestras in the US and Europe, including the Boston Symphony (Boston and Tanglewood), the Berlin Philharmonic, the Amsterdam Concertgebouw Orchestra, Philadelphia Orchestra, the Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra, the Baltimore Symphony and San Francisco Symphony, which also featured him on tour in the US, Hong Kong and Taiwan. He has collaborated with distinguished maestros-Tennstedt, Kurt Sanderling, Ozawa, Ormandy, Eschenbach, Dutoit and Zinman.

In addition to these concerts, Mr. Zazofsky tours and records as first violinist of the Muir String Quartet, in residence at the Boston University School of Music. He serves that institution as Professor of Violin and Chamber Music, and Director of the BUTI String Quartet Workshop. Additionally, he teaches at the NEC Preparatory School. Zazofsky studied with Joseph Silverstein before attending Juilliard Pre College with Dorothy Delay. He then studied at the Curtis Institute, under Ivan Galamian and Jaime Laredo, and spent five summers at Marlboro, where his mentors included Rudolf Serkin, Felix Galimir, and Sandor Vegh. He also did several Music From Marlboro tours.

Mr. Zazofsky has won numerous prizes and awards, including the 1977 Wieniawski Competition, the 1979 Montreal Competition, the 1980 Queen Elisabeth Contest in Brussels, and the 1985 Avery Fisher Career Grant. Since then, he has served as adjudicator for those events, and he has recently expanded his activities performing and teaching in Beijing, Shanghai, Shenyang, and Xi'an China.




DAVID CERONE* (UNITED STATES)

David Cerone, Mus.D, Violin, served as President of The Cleveland Institute of Music from 1985 to 2008. Born in Syracuse, New York, he went to Detroit at the age of eleven to study with Mischa Mischakoff, famed concertmaster of the NBC Symphony Orchestra. His studies were completed as a scholarship student at the Juilliard School of Music and the Curtis Institute of Music with the renowned pedagogue Ivan Galamian. He made his New York recital debut in Town Hall in 1967.

Dr. Cerone served on the faculty of the Oberlin College-Conservatory of Music for nine years, and for ten years as Chairman of the String Department at The Cleveland Institute of Music. In 1980, he moved to Philadelphia to accept the position of Chairman of the Violin Department at Curtis, succeeding the late Ivan Galamian. In 1985, Dr. Cerone, along with his wife, violinist Linda Sharon Cerone, founded the nationally acclaimed ENCORE School for Strings in Hudson, Ohio.

Dr. Cerone was violinist of the Canterbury Trio and made his Cleveland Orchestra solo debut in 1987 playing Chausson's Poème and Saint-Saëns' Introduction and Rondo Capriccioso with maestro Christoph von Dohnányi, conductor. In October 1987, he world-premiered Donald Erb's View of Space and Time for violin and chamber ensemble, commissioned for Dr. Cerone to celebrate the Michelson-Morley Centennial Celebration.

He was awarded the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music and Case Western Reserve University, in 2009. Dr. Cerone received the 2011 Cleveland Arts Prize, Lifetime Achievement Award in Music.

Gabriela Lena Frank, Thomas McKinley, Jessie Montgomery, and Christopher Theofanidis.*

GABRIELA LENA FRANK KHAZN'S RECITATIVE: ELU D'VORIM

SUITE MESTIZA (MOVEMENTS: 1, 2, OR 7)



Included in the Washington Post's list of the 35 most significant women composers in history (August 2017), identity has always been at the center of composer/ pianist Gabriela Lena Frank's music. Born in Berkeley, California (September 1972), to a mother of mixed Peruvian/Chinese ancestry and a father of Lithuanian/Jewish descent, Frank explores her multicultural heritage most ardently through her compositions. Inspired by the works of Bela Bartók and Alberto Ginastera, Frank is something of a musical anthropologist. She has traveled extensively throughout South America and her pieces often reflect and refract her studies of Latin American folklore, incorporating poetry, mythology, and native musical styles into a western classical framework that is uniquely her own.

THOMAS L. MCKINLEY
DIALOGUES (EOIVC 2017 COMMISSION)



Thomas L. McKinley is a Professor of Music Theory and Composition at Lynn University where he serves as Curriculum Coordinator, Undergraduate Academic Advisor and Head of Music Theory, History & Composition. His teaching experience spans over three decades and includes positions previously held at Tulane University, the College of the Holy Cross, Tufts University, and the New England Conservatory's Extension Division. He received Ph.D. (1987) and A.M. (1984) degrees from Harvard University and M.M. (1980) and B.M. (1978) degrees from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music where his composition teachers included Norman Dinerstein, Earl Kim, Leon Kirchner and Sir Peter Maxwell Davies.

Dr. McKinley's compositions have been performed throughout the United States, as well as internationally in Madrid, Spain, Rotterdam, and the Netherlands. He has received

numerous grants, awards, and commissions including: first prize at Symposium III for New Woodwind Quintet Music (University of Georgia, 1980); The Bohemians Prize (Harvard University, 1985); commissioned composer, 1988 Pappoutsakis Flute Competition; commissioned composer, Florida State Music Teachers Association 2014 annual conference; and commissioned composer, inaugural Elmar Oliveira International Violin Competition (2017). Dr. McKinley's Six Bagatelles for Wind Quintet have been recorded on CD by the Georgia Woodwind Quintet.

In addition to his work as a composer and teacher, Dr. McKinley has pursued research in music theory and analysis. His principal areas of interest are chromaticism in the Common-Practice Period, tonality in Twentieth-century Music, and the interdisciplinary study of the visual arts and music.

JESSIE MONTGOMERY RHAPSODY NO. 2 FOR SOLO VIOLIN



Jessie Montgomery, Musical America's 2023 Composer of the Year, is an acclaimed composer, violinist, and educator whose music interweaves classical music with elements of vernacular music, improvisation, poetry, and social consciousness, making her an acute interpreter of twenty-first century American sound and experience. In July 2021, she began a three-year appointment as the Chicago Symphony Orchestra's Mead Composer-in-Residence. Her works have been hailed as turbulent, wildly colorful, and exploding with life, and are performed regularly by leading orchestras and ensembles around the world. Recent highlights include Five Freedom Songs (2021), a song cycle conceived with and written for soprano Julia Bullock; Shift, Change, Turn (2019), commissioned by the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra and the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra; and Coincident Dances (2018), written for

the Chicago Sinfonietta. Since 1999, Montgomery has been affiliated with the Sphinx Organization, which supports young African American and Latinx string players. She has also served as composerin-residence for the Sphinx Virtuosi, the organization's flagship professional touring ensemble. A founding member of PUBLIQuartet and a former member of the Catalyst Quartet, Montgomery holds degrees from the Juilliard School and New York University and is currently a doctoral candidate in music composition at Princeton University. She is the recipient of the Sphinx Medal of Excellence and the Leonard Bernstein Award from the ASCAP Foundation, and is currently an Artist in Residence at the Vanderbilt University Blair School of Music, Composer in Residence at Bard College, and Professor of Violin and Composition at The New School.

CHRISTOPHER THEOFANIDIS DISCIPLINE AND TRANSCENDENCE (EOIVC 2020 COMMISSION)




Christopher Theofanidis' music has been performed by many of the world's leading performing arts organizations, from the London Symphony, Philadelphia Orchestra, and New York Philharmonic to the San Francisco Opera, the Houston Grand Opera, and the American Ballet Theatre. He is a two-time Grammy nominee for best composition, and his Viola Concerto, recorded with David Alan Miller and the Albany Symphony with Richard O'Neill as soloist, won the 2021 Grammy for Best Instrumental Solo. Mr. Theofanidis' work, Rainbow Body, is one of the most performed works in recent decades, having been performed by over 150 orchestras worldwide. Mr. Theofanidis is currently on the faculties of Yale University and the Aspen Music Festival, and has taught at The Juilliard School and the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University.

OLE BÖHN (NORWAY / AUSTRALIA)

In 1990, Ole Böhn gave the world premiere of Elliott Carter's violin concerto with the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra. He has performed this concerto, which was written for and dedicated to him, with the leading orchestras in Europe and the US. In 1994 his recording of the concerto won a prestigious Grammy Award in the category "Best Contemporary Composition".

Ole Böhn has performed regularly with orchestras in Europe, the US and South America as well touring the People's Republic of China. He has collaborated with conductors such as Atzmon, Blomstedt, Conlon, Foss, Giehlen, Janowski, Welser-Möst, and Knussen.

Ole Böhn is professor of violin at the Sydney Conservatory of music. He held the position of Concertmaster of the Norwegian National Opera as well as with Copenhagen Symphony Orchestra, the Oslo Philharmonic Orchestra, Teatro del Fenice in Venice, Theatro Municipal in Rio de Janeiro, the Residentie Orchestra in Den Haag, and the Hamburg State Opera.

Ole Böhn has been artistic coordinator of the summer concerts at the Vigeland Museum in Oslo and as well as the Oslo Museum. He is a Commander of the Order of the Norwegian Artists' Association and Honorary Member of the Federation of Norwegian Musical Soloists and the Danish Soloist Organisation. In 2005 he was awarded by King Harald V the King's Order of Merit Medal in Gold.

Ole Böhn performs on a violin made by Giovanni Battista Guadagnini in 1766 which was acquired for his use by Nordea Bank of Norway.



OLGA DUBOSSARSKAYA KALER (UNITED STATES / UKRAINE)


Praised by critics for her "deep, soulful sound" and "powerful, enchanting renditions," Olga Dubossarskaya Kaler has toured three continents as a soloist, chamber musician, and artist-teacher, balancing her performing and teaching careers with equal success. Currently she is on the faculty of the Cleveland Institute of Music, and also serves as string department chair of the CIM preparatory division. Recently she served a 15-year tenure at DePaul University School of Music in Chicago.

Olga Dubossarskaya Kaler's original composition for solo violin, Recitativo and Toccata, was published in 2020 by the Soundwave Music Company, along with her edition of the Solo Violin Sonata by Boris Dubossarsky, her father, a celebrated Moldavian composer. Both works are included in her upcoming Centaur Records CD release, Seven Ways To Say Farewell.

Dr. Kaler's recently released scale system for violin and for viola, entitled Scale System for Reluctant Scale Enthusiasts, and her method book, An Effective Method for Teaching and Studying Violin Technique, met with enthusiastic reception from string players and pedagogues worldwide.

Kaler holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Northwestern University Bienen School of Music, and her previous degrees are from the New England Conservatory, the Moscow State Conservatory, and the Stolyarsky Special Music School for Gifted Children in Odessa, Ukraine. Among her violin competition awards are Special Prize at the Rodolfo Lipizer International Violin Competition, 1st Prize at the Northwestern Competition, as well as the 1st Prize at Thaviu-Isaak Competition. PHILIP SETZER (UNITED STATES)

Violinist Philip Setzer, a founding member of the Emerson String Quartet, began studying violin at the age of five with his parents. He continued his studies with Josef Gingold and Rafael Druian, and later at The Juilliard School with Oscar Shumsky. Mr. Setzer won second prize at the Mariorie Merriweather Post Competition and a Bronze Medal at the Queen Elisabeth International Competition. He has appeared with the National Symphony, Aspen Chamber Symphony, Memphis Symphony, New Mexico and Puerto Rico Symphonies, Omaha and Anchorage Symphonies, and the Cleveland Orchestra.

Currently serving as the Distinguished Professor of Violin and Chamber Music at SUNY Stony Brook and Visiting Faculty of the Cleveland Institute of Music, Mr. Setzer has given masterclasses at schools around the world, including The Curtis Institute, London's Royal Academy of Music, The San Francisco Conservatory, among others. Mr. Setzer is also the Director of the Shouse Institute. He has also been a regular faculty member of the Isaac Stern Chamber Music Workshops at Carnegie Hall and the Jerusalem Music Center.

An innovative and versatile musician, Mr. Setzer is the mastermind behind the Emerson's two highly praised collaborative theater productions: The Noise of Time, a multi-media production directed by Simon McBurney and a collaboration with writer-director James Glossman, Shostakovich and the Black Monk: A Russian Fantasy. Mr. Setzer has also been touring and recording the piano trio repertoire with David Finckel and Wu Han.





LINDSAY GARRITSON

Dr. Lindsay Garritson has performed throughout the United States and abroad since the age of four. She has appeared on stages such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Place des Arts (Montreal), and has been featured as soloist with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra, Charleston Symphony Orchestra, Eastern Connecticut Symphony Orchestra, Las Colinas Symphony Orchestra (Texas), Orchestre Métropolitain (Montreal), among others.

An award-winning performer, Lindsay has received top prizes at the Montreal International Piano Competition, USASU Bösendorfer International Piano Competition, and the Mozarteum International Chopin Competition (Salzburg). She was invited as one of thirty participants internationally to compete in the 2013 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition.

An avid chamber musician, Lindsay has performed with artists such as Ani Kavafian, Elmar Oliveira, and Carter Brey. She is currently a member of the Bergonzi Piano Trio with violinist Scott Flavin and cellist Ross Harbaugh. Since 2018, she has been a collaborative pianist for the prestigious Steans Institute at the Ravinia Festival.

Lindsay is a passionate advocate for new music, and her Carnegie Hall solo recital debut in November 2019 featured the world premiere of Carl Vine's Piano Sonata No. 4, a work written for her. Additionally, her second solo album titled "Aphorisms: Piano Music of Carl Vine" was recently released.

Lindsay holds degrees from Principia College (B.A. in Music), Yale School of Music (M.M. and Artist Diploma), and the University of Miami (D.M.A.). Her piano teachers include Santiago Rodriguez, Boris Berman, and Luiz de Moura Castro.

Beilin Han was born in Shanghai, China and began studying piano at the age of three. She attended the Shanghai Conservatory of Music for Primary and Middle School and also attended the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts in Singapore on a full scholarship. Immediately after graduating from Academy in Singapore, Ms. Han was accepted into the University of Kansas for her Masters Degree under the renowned Portuguese pianist Sequeira Costa.

Ms. Han was invited to perform at the 7th Annual World Piano Pedagogy Conference in Las Vegas in 2002 and was honored as a Young Artist in 2003. In 2004, Ms. Han became a prize winner of the Vianna da Motta International Piano Competition in Portugal. Ms. Han has toured internationally as a concert pianist performing throughout China, Portugal, Spain, and the US. She has also appeared on radio programs in Singapore and the US, as well as a television program in China.

In 2008, Ms. Han graduated from the Chicago College of Performing Arts at Roosevelt University, where she earned her Artistic Diploma with Solomon Mikowsky and Meng-Chieh Liu.

In addition to Ms. Han's successful solo career, she also enjoys chamber music and collaborating with such artists as world-famous violinists Shmuel Ashkenasi, Ilya Kaler, and Kyoko Takezawa; flautists Stefán Ragnar Höskuldsson, Jean Ferrandis, and Mark Sparks; Clarinetist Stephen Williamson and other members of Chicago Symphony Orchestra. She has also played for world-famous conductors such as Riccardo Muti and Christoph Eschenbach.

Currently, Ms. Han is the coordinator of piano faculty of Heifetz International Music Institute and Artist Collaborator of The Shepherd School of Music in Rice University.



BEIYAO JI

A native of Sichuan, China, Beiyao Ji has won several awards, including the top prizes of the Hong Kong – Asia Open Piano Competition, the Torrance Symphony Orchestra and the Brentwood- Westwood Symphony Orchestra concerto competitions. He was also the recipient of the AMRON Sutherland Fund Scholarship in 2016, and the 2021 Bridge Funding Fellowship from the University of Miami.

Beiyao has given solo recitals in Germany, Poland, Spain, Italy, Hungary, Japan, the US, Canada, and China. He has also appeared as a soloist with orchestras such as the Colburn Orchestra conducted by Miguel Harth-Bedoya, the Brentwood-Westwood Symphony Orchestra, and the Torrance Symphony Orchestra.

Aside from playing solo recitals, Beiyao enjoys collaborating with other musicians. His piano trio NOA, which he formed during his studies at the Cleveland Institute of Music, was invited by the Detroit Chamber Music Society to perform numerous concerts and give lectures in the Detroit area. GUILLERMO FIGUEROA

One of the most versatile and respected musical artists of his generation - renowned as conductor, violinist, violist, and concertmaster - Guillermo Figueroa is the Principal Conductor of the Santa Fe Symphony Orchestra. He is also the Artistic Director of the Music in the Mountains Festival in Colorado and Music Director of the Lynn Philharmonia in Florida. Additionally, he was the Music Director of both the New Mexico Symphony and the Puerto Rico Symphony.

International appearances, among others, include the Toronto Symphony, Iceland Symphony, Orquesta Sinfonica de Chile and the National Symphony of Mexico. In the US he has appeared with the orchestras of Buffalo, Detroit, New Jersey, Memphis, Phoenix, Tucson and the New York City Ballet.

As a violinist, his recording of Ernesto Cordero's violin concertos for the Naxos label received a Latin Grammy nomination in 2012. Figueroa was Concertmaster of the New York City Ballet, and a Founding Member and Concertmaster of the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, making over fifty recordings for Deutsche Grammophon. Also accomplished on the viola, Figueroa performs frequently as guest of the Emerson, Fine Arts, American, and Orion string quartets.

Figueroa has given the world premieres of four violin concertos written for him: the *Concertino* by Mario Davidovsky, at Carnegie Hall with Orpheus; the *Double Concerto* by Harold Farberman, with the American Symphony at Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center; the *Violin Concerto* by Miguel del Aguila, commissioned by Figueroa and the NMSO and *Insula*, by Ernesto Cordero with the Solisti di Zagreb in Zagreb.



Saying EOIVC 2020 First Prize winner Julian Rhee is *just* a violinist is the understatement of the century. He is the complete package. A fiery soloist, masterful recitalist, inspiring chamber player, and a passionate community engagement advocate. He is *everything* and more.

The EOIVC could not be more proud of this incredibly talented violinist and well-rounded human being. Julian embodies and represents all that the EOIVC stands for.

"Seeing Julian in action is so exciting," said Elmar Oliveira, Artistic Director and Founder of the Elevar Foundation. "His energy can be felt across everything that he does. He is a magnetic performer that really draws you in, whether it is on the concert stage or in a classroom full of students at a community center. He really gives it his all and it shows."

It is no secret that the pandemic has challenged us all. Shortly after the $2020\ EOIVC$, the world shut down. Everything came to

a halt. Performances were cancelled. Debuts delayed. We all had to pivot at the speed of light. And pivot is just what the EOIVC and Julian Rhee did.

Digital masterclasses and community outreach activities took place. Recitals and concerts swiftly shifted to online-only presentations. Zoom became a lifeline, allowing the EOIVC to continue to reach and even deepen connections with communities that were suddenly more isolated by the pandemic. Through it all, Julian Rhee was at the forefront of these activities.

Julian's creativity was unstoppable. He teamed up with EOIVC 2017 First Prize winner, Sirena Huang, to produce and star in an amazing and inventive short video. These two artistic powerhouses collaborated on the soundtrack for the Super Mario Bros.™ video game and the outcome was extraordinary. Nearly 8,000 YouTube views and hundreds of shares later, this seemingly little pivot had a big impact.



"Throughout this pandemic, the artist I saw effortlessly win the 2020 EOIVC Community Engagement Award did not disappoint," said Jill Arbetter, Executive Director, Elevar Foundation. "In fact, he solidified why he won. He was able to seamlessly switch from in-person activities to online engagement at the flip of a switch. It was so amazing to watch."

As things started opening up again, Julian's star continued to rise. He made his debuts with the Brevard Symphony under the direction of Christopher Confessore and Jackson Symphony led by Peter Shannon. He appeared with the Bach, Beethoven, & Brahms Society with Steven Lipsitt and collaborated with Vadim Gluzman and ProMusica Chamber Orchestra. He premiered Ukrainian composer Dmytro Kyryliv's *The Ghost of Kyi*v at the North Shore Chamber Music Festival and he partnered with his sister, Tabby Rhee, an accomplished violist whose star is also on the rise, for Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante with the Wisconsin Philharmonic. As he rounds out his time with the EOIVC, he will be making his debut with the Fresno Philharmonic under the direction of Rei Hotoda. And these are just some of the many highlights.

One of the biggest highlights, however, came this September. Julian did it again. His talents were on full display as he was awarded the silver medal at the 11th Quadrennial International Violin Competition of Indianapolis. Watching his performances throughout the competition were breathtaking, and reminded us just how amazingly talented this young violinist is.

Reaching Beyond the Competition:

ELMAR LAUNCHES THE ELEVAR FOUNDATION

Sitting in her home office, Jill Arbetter is surrounded by mountains of sticky notes, brochures and, of course, dogs. As the Executive Director of the Elevar Foundation, home to the Elmar Oliveira International Violin Competition, Jill is always in a state of perpetual motion. With a phone to her ear and her fingers on the keyboard, she is a relentless and loving advocate for all things Elmar Oliveira.

"There is so much to do and we can always be doing more," said Jill Arbetter. "That is Elmar's motto. I'm here, and so are a village of others, to willingly and happily make that happen."

Just after the 2020 Competition, the world turned upside down. Faced with a global pandemic, everything was in flux. The words 'unprecedented', 'pivot' and 'adapt' became routine, and tiresome, vocabulary.

"We saw everything come to an abrupt stop," commented Jill. "Performances were cancelled left and right. It got so I didn't even want to answer the phone or check my email. However, I always had Elmar's voice in my head, telling me we must find a way to keep reaching people. To keep everyone together."

That's exactly what Jill and Elmar did. They not only found a way, but found a way that would create a lasting impact. In November 2021, the Elevar Foundation was launched to broaden the reach of the EOIVC.

The proven track record of the transformative power of music and music education is what drives the Elevar Foundation. The goal of the Foundation is to make music accessible to underserved communities through partnerships and offering free or low-cost opportunities such as masterclasses, lessons, performances, instruments, supplies, and workshops.

There have been countless articles written and positive real-word data published on the indisputable power of arts education. The National Endowment for the Arts has shared data that confirms that participation in arts classes improves students' attendance and graduation rates, boosts their empathy and tolerance, and sharpens their critical thinking skills. Studies have also found potential correlations between participation in arts education and academic performance.

"Music has the power to change the trajectory of someone's life," commented Elevar Foundation's Founder and Artistic Director, Elmar Oliveira. "Today, more than ever, music is seen as a great connector; it is so much more than just an emotive outlet. We, at the Elevar Foundation, are committed to working in partnership with underserved communities, by actively listening and providing the support they've identified, to ensure that their constituents have access to every opportunity possible."

The outgrowth of the Elevar Foundation from the EOIVC was a natural progression. One of the foundational tenets of the Competition is to ensure that community engagement is part of every performance that takes place under the its banner. In fact, in 2020, the EOIVC became the first international violin competition to have a special Community Engagement Round as part of its overall competitive process.

Judged by a separate panel of community leaders, the EOIVC Community Engagement Round featured each of the four finalist in a 45-minute performance and talkback to young students of a local Title 1 School. Each finalist brought their own unique perspective, and the kids loved it.

While the scoring of the Community Engagement Round did not impact the overall ranking of the finalists, Julian Rhee won both the Community Engagement Award and took home First Prize.

"It really was a joy to watch," said Laura Sinclair, violist and EOIVC 2020 Community Engagement panelist. "He physically got down on their level. The kids were having fun. He was having fun. Julian made himself relatable not only in his content and storytelling, but in his signature red converse sneakers! The engagement was so high you could tell it was a two-way street. I know he had a lasting impact on our students because he allowed them to imagine themselves in his shoes."

The Elevar Foundation provides underserved communities access to high-quality music experiences and musicians. It works in partnership with public schools, community centers, hospitals and other organizations to connect these institutions and groups with artists free of charge.

"The Elevar Foundation, through the EOIVC, makes valuable contributions to Palm Beach County's cultural sector," says Bama Lutes Deal, Ph.D., a 2020 Community Engagement

Panelist and Cultural Concierge Program Manager with the Cultural Council for Palm Beach County. "The Foundation's programs model creativity and passion for the arts, which helps build to a lifelong love of music. Ultimately, they bring new opportunities to local students and their families, enhancing the efforts of our teachers and schools, residential communities, universities, and cultural institutions."

Being able to access a network of music professionals who are deeply committed to the care and wellbeing of young people is invaluable. The Elevar Foundation pulls from its vast resources to connect youth and organizations to artists who believe in the Elevar Foundation's mission.

EOIVC Laureates, Sirena Huang (EOIVC winner 2017) and Julian Rhee (EOIVC winner 2020), are a prime example of this. Both artists have given numerous in-person and online masterclasses, talkbacks and performances at community centers and Title 1 schools. Watching them in action and seeing the visceral impact they have on these


communities is a testament to the importance of this work.

The Elevar Foundation has connections to a wide array of artisans and luthiers to provide free string instruments and supplies to eligible students and organizations, specifically focusing on underserved communities.

One of the first recipients of this program was the Volta Music Foundation. This wonderful organization's vison and mission surrounds supporting the Latin American community in the United States with music supplies, instruments, free masterclasses, and performance opportunities. Basically, the association between Volta and Elevar was a match made in heaven.

"When the Volta Music Foundation came to us, and we started to talk, it was so obvious—we were meant to work together," said Jill Arbetter. "It was clear that Elevar's connection with violin and bowmakers from around the globe would greatly benefit those reached by Volta. We are so pleased with this partnership."








