Curriculum revision

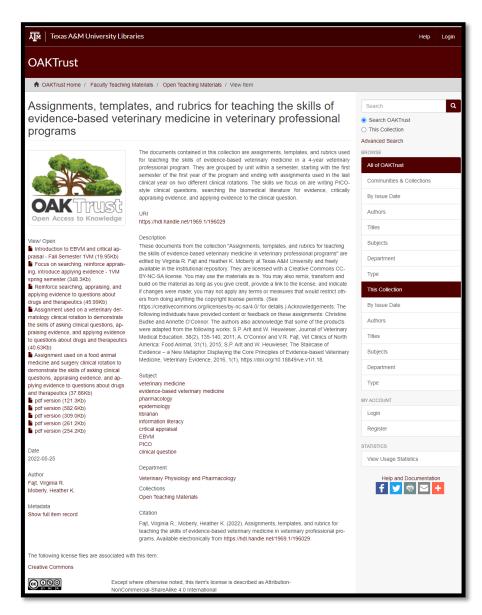
Introduction to EBVM and library sessions (EBVM Acquire step) move to 1VM Professional Clinical Skills class. They are included in the Critical Thinking Module.

With this, there are now 3 contiguous semesters of EBVM.

- Introduction is in 1VM fall.
- Library sessions are in 1VM spring.
- Ask and Appraisal sessions remain in 2VM fall pharmacology

Results / Evaluation

Strong collaboration with consistent faculty members and contiguous semesters allows us to

scaffold instruction

hold students accountable

work toward larger goals

Tangible example of this is the increased class time and graded assignments for librarian beginning Spring semester 2022



Future

Continue, annually, to use reflective questions to update class

Continue to upload class materials to the collection in OAKTrust (institutional repository) under Creative Commons license
