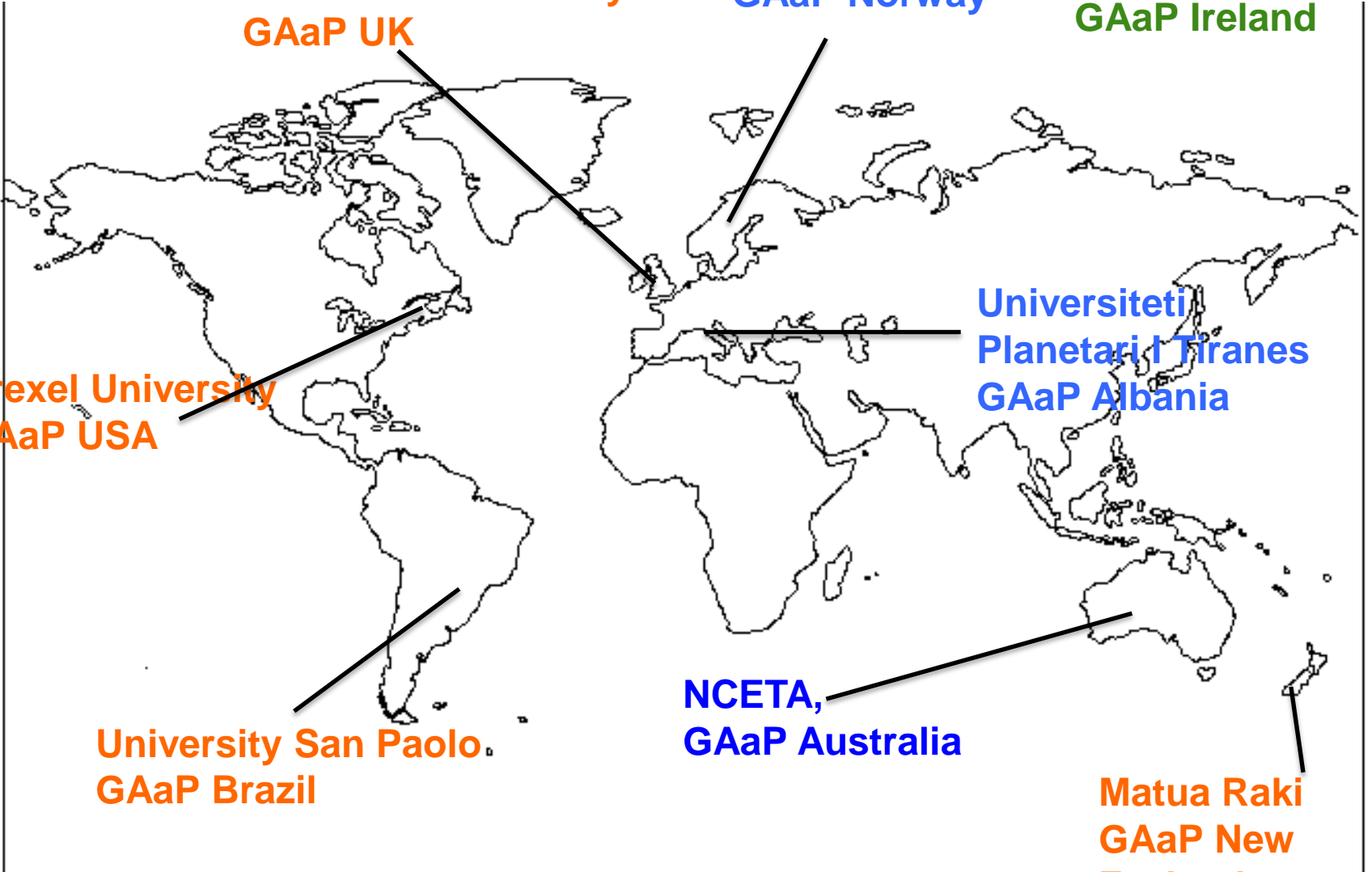

Our Vision for GAaP

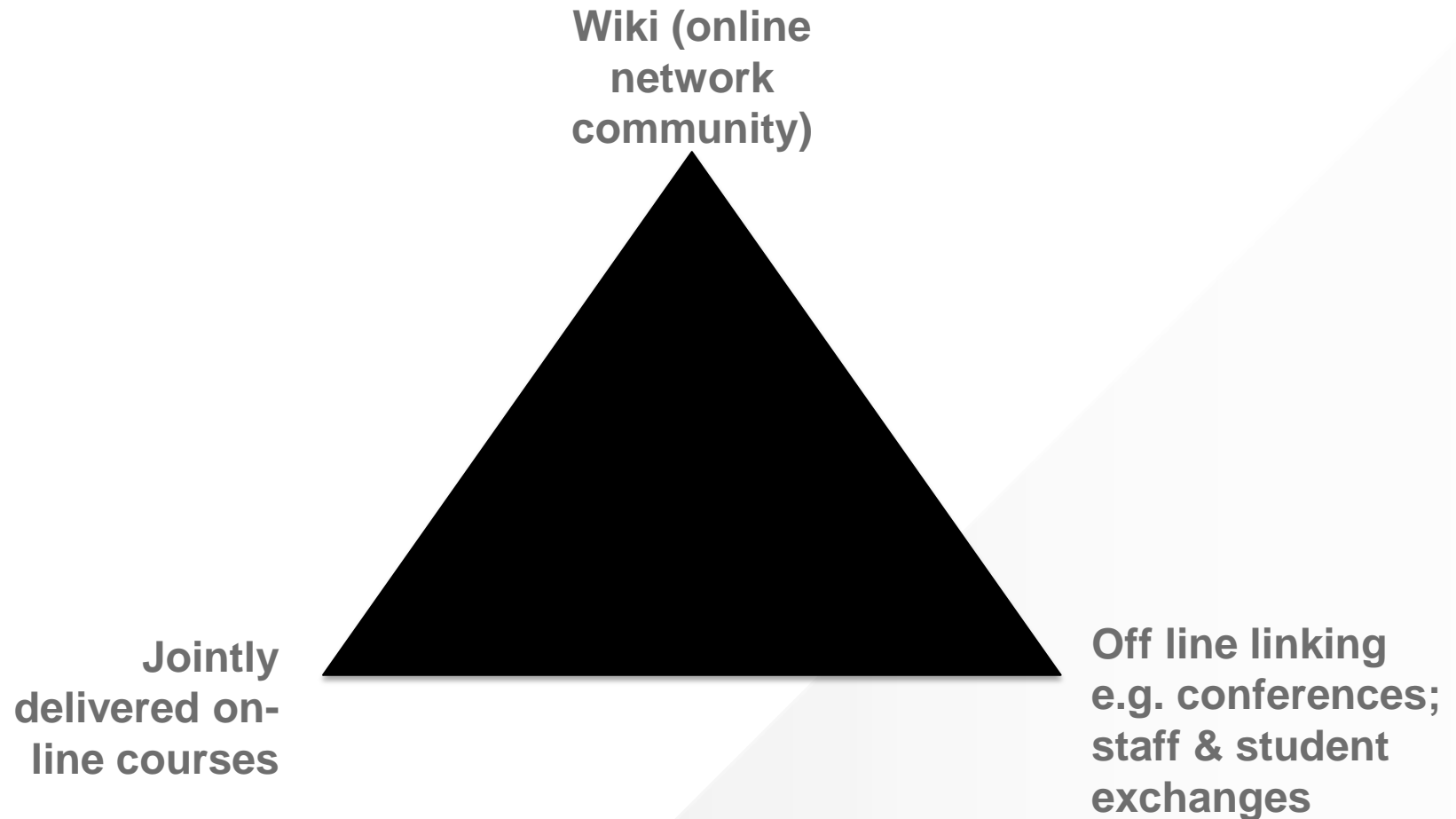
- Explore addiction issues across countries e.g. policies; service user lived experience; treatment – comparing differences and similarities

- Establish joint workforce guidelines – standardization of preparation for professionals working in the field of addiction - ‘Getting it into the Water Supply’
- Provide a virtual room for everyone to enter to discuss the issues as outlined above

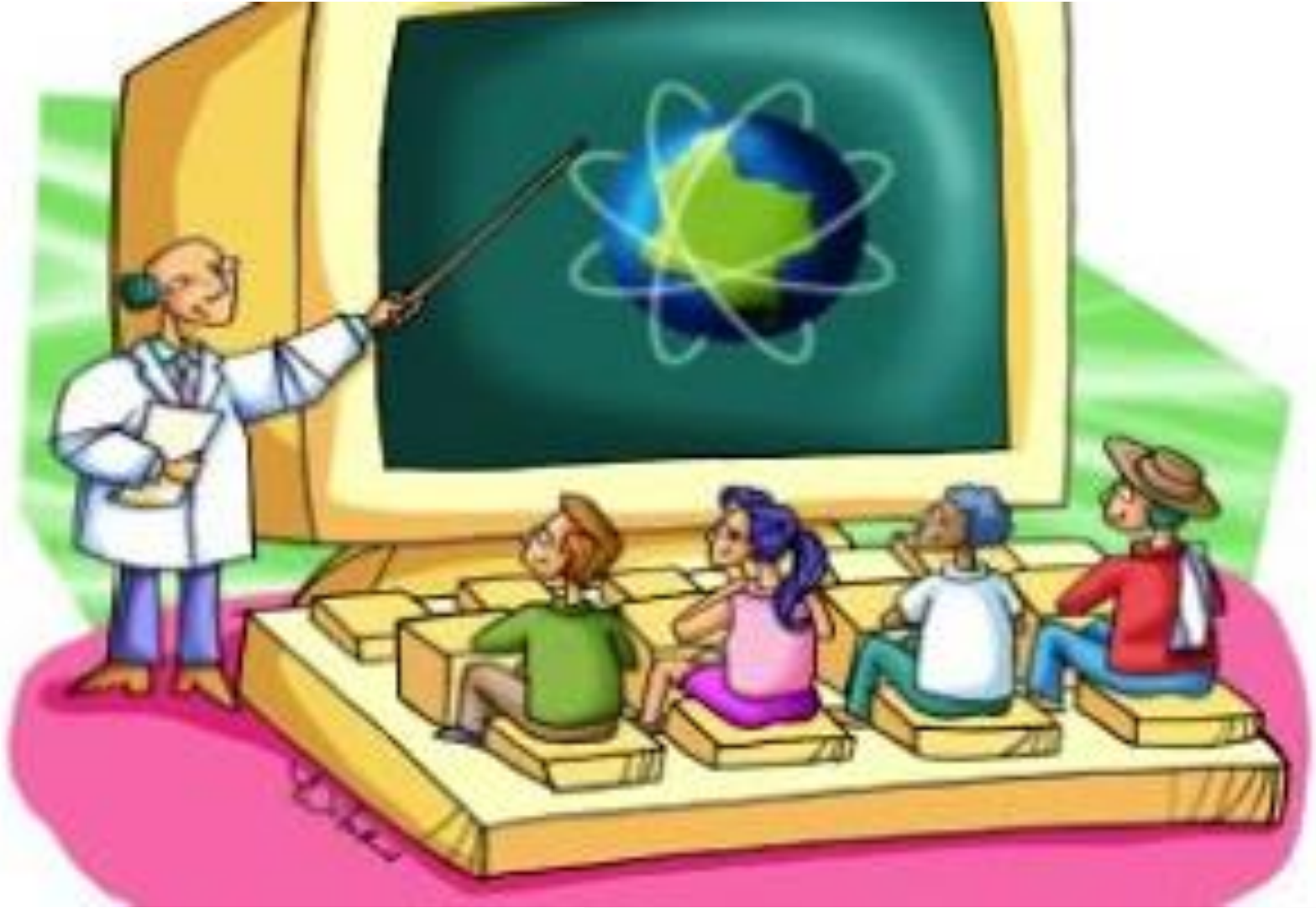

First Collaborative Project

Workforce Planning and Preparation

- There is clear evidence that the status of 'preparation' is variable in different countries, and dependent on many factors: social, political; economical etc.
- Collection of key information in the following areas
 1. Profile of current workforce e.g. which discipline is delivering services/care (try to be as specific as possible)
 2. What level of educational preparation is needed, if any? are these regulated, must workers be licensed to work in the area of addiction?
 3. What workforce policies are in place in your country in relation to addiction, if any?
 4. What initiatives are taking place in relation to workforce preparation, if any?
 5. Are there any published 'standards' or 'guidelines' on roles and responsibilities for workers in the SUD field?
 6. Overarching theme - is workforce preparation for addiction a concern in your respective country?
