As the leading international peer-reviewed journal dedicated to mountain regions, *Mountain Research and Development* (MRD) envisions sustainable, resilient, and fair futures for mountain societies and mountain environments worldwide, supported by highest-quality knowledge, innovative ideas, impactful dialogue between science, practice, and policy, and a strong community of dedicated people.



Measures towards open science



- 1. Giving full open access and keeping APCs low
- 2. Offering mentoring and editorial support
- 3. Including different knowledge systems
- 4. Bringing scientific knowledge into dialogue



Giving full open access and keeping APCs low

- Published since 1981, fully online and open access since 2009
- Readership spanning academics, development practitioners, and policymakers from over 200 countries.
- Relatively low APCs (USD 750) and possibility of granting waivers
- Next step: Go diamond open access (no APCs)?
- <u>Challenges:</u> Funding? What business model for a not-for-profit journal? (Fees from IMS members, sponsors, etc.)



Offering mentoring and editorial support

- Authors from the global South are strongly represented: about 40% of articles published in MRD are from the global South
- Support provided by the editorial team at preliminary review stage for promising papers
- Professional language editing offered for accepted papers
- Next step: Develop a training and mentoring program?
- Challenges: Human resources (cost, skills)



Including different knowledge systems

- Peer-reviewed sections focusing on different types of knowledge: systems knowledge (MountainResearch), transformation knowledge (MountainDevelopment), target knowledge (MountainAgenda)
- Focus issue 42.4 on "Weaving together knowledges": contributions by Indigenous and local knowledge holders assessed by a Peer Advisory Circle andpublished in the MountainViews section
- Next step: A new section for practitioners (MountainPractice)?
- <u>Challenges:</u> Reaching out beyond the academic community, adjusting the format to other types of knowledge, etc.



Bringing scientific knowledge into dialogue

- New format: MRD Talks are online debates between science, practice, the private sector, and policy based on recently published MRD articles; aim is to nurture innovative and effective development and policy efforts
- Excellent reception and participation; exchange among stakeholders triggers out-of-the box thinking
- Next step: Continue the MRD Talks series beyond its pilot phase?
- <u>Challenges:</u> Getting authors to distill their lessons and recommendations for policy and practice, and communicate in a new way
