Upon completion of the main meeting agenda, Dr. Boyd introduced the addendum item above and asked for a motion to consider the item as New Business for today's meeting.

Senator Hall made a motion to clarify whether votes on this item should be a simple or super majority. A second was made. No objections were raised to the request for clarification.
