



Business environment and socio-economic indicators

The Human Development Index (HDI) measures average achievement in key dimensions of human development. It is based on life expectancy at birth, average duration of education and GDP per capita. It ranges from 0 to 100. 'High human development countries' (UN) are in the range between 70 and 80. Values are for 2021.

The Corruption Perception Index measures perceived levels of public sector corruption worldwide. Scores range from 0 (highly corrupt) to 100 (very clean). EU Member States with the highest and lowest values are labelled for comparison. Values are for 2021.


The GINI index measures deviation from a perfectly equal distribution in the distribution of income among individuals or households within a country. It is a measure of inequality in income distribution. A value of 0 represenets absolute equality, a value of 100 absolute inequality. Data values are for 2019. There are no data for New Zealand.




