I. Background

CGIAR West and Central African Food System Transformation Initiative work package 5: Technology, Innovation, Communication, Knowledge, and Stakeholder Management (TICKS) assists innovators in attracting more investment and increasing the impact of their innovative solutions. One key instrument of TICKS is the investment action planning process in which the selected innovator teams are provided systematic and continuous support to draft a winning investment action plan. This workshop is the first instance of the investment action process.

II. Description

The investment action planning workshop introduces the overall work plan of the TICKS work package and describes the process to the innovator teams. It also includes a reflective data collection process powered by digital forms and cloud databases.

VI. Results and Learning

Brief Overview

The event was successful in introducing the work of the TICKS team and the investment action planning process. It also led to the collection of a significant amount of information for the investment action plans.

Key Highlights or Takeaways

- The innovators felt comfortable about using the novel butter tool and found it very interactive and attractive
- 8 of the 12 innovator teams were present. It appears that the interest in the support provided by the investment action planning team is not complete at this stage
- Interactive workshop integrating data collection via forms can be an effective way to collect data

Event Most engaging session and key points

"Know your solution" was the most engaging session. It was the first exposure of the innovators to using forms to respond to thinking questions during a live online event. The facilitators have the participants walk through the questions and explain in detail.

Event networking and collaboration opportunities

It was the first time for many participants to meet, but they could not interact much as the workshop focused on innovative solutions. Networking should be prioritized in later in-person events.

Event issues or encountered obstacles

 Some participants could not log in using the link. A few browsers are not compatible with Butter.















Some participants could not find out how to allow Butter to access audio and video

Solutions implemented

- The facilitators sent an email including the link and the instructions.
- They also showed how to access the audio and video allowance set by sharing the screen

Participant feedback summary

The feedback on the workshop was positive to very positive. The participants enjoyed the colorful interface of the butter and the high interactivity of the workshop.

Some of the post-workshop feedback:

- "Great workshop"
- "Very good"
- "Very pleased that 9 showed up. I was hoping for 10, but those who came did a good job participating"
- "Effective approach for compiling preliminary information"

Participants' suggestions for improvement

The innovators suggested the following improvements:

- "Hope we can have opportunities to discuss and critique our responses."
- "The understanding of a question was fuzzy"
- "A few more slides defining concepts before starting on the second survey on knowing the context"
- "Participants should be taken through the survey questions before taking the survey"
- "Better directions on which browser to use to access the program up front"
- "Explain this tool in advance"
- "Come back deeply in the template"
- "Get more participants for next time"

Event lessons learned for future events

- Sending the instructions about the butter once was good but not sufficient. A second reminder an hour before the workshop can be good
- Some of the online form concepts might be new for the innovators. Adding a conceptual deck to the tool before sharing the surveys could be good















VII. The Way Forward

Key decisions

- 8 innovator teams agreed to participate in the investment action planning process and receive support
- Innovators agreed to check and complete the innovation and scaling course

Event follow-up actions

Designing an interactive dashboard to enable innovators to see their progress could be very helpful for decentralizing the investment efforts.
