Message from Father Russo

My Dear People,

In the last article, we wrote about **SALVATION** and how important it is for each one of us. Another question that the people often ask us is about what happens to a person at the time of death and afterwards. This is one of the deepest and most serious questions in all of theology.

In Matthew 25:31-46 Our Lord Jesus teaches us about the final judgment, the end of this world when the sheep will be separated from the goats, the good from the evil, His disciples from those who reject His kingdom.

There is death and then the judgment (**Hebrews 9:27**). Each person who is judged will have everlasting joy in heaven or everlasting anguish in hell (see **Matthew 25:46**). Those people who need to be cleansed from the remains of selfishness and sin (**Revelation 21:27**) experience a cleansing or purification (see **1 Corinthians 3:15**) in purgatory. And so, from one perspective, our entire life can be thought of as our preparation for our awesome meeting with Almighty God. What a strong reason this is for living our life in the way that Our Lord Jesus wants us to live it.

St. Katharine Drexel, please pray for all of us so that we will obtain the graces necessary for our eternal salvation.

Message from Sr. Kathleen

Dear Friends,

Since our last Newsletter I have had the wonderful opportunity to go to **Rome** for the Canonization Ceremony of **Saint Katharine Drexel**. I am sure you have already seen TV, newspaper and magazine coverage of this special event. Being there in person was thrilling to me.

Denise Logan and I, interpreted the <u>Canonization</u>, <u>Mass of Thanksgiving</u> and the <u>Pilgrimage Audience</u> with the <u>Pope</u>. The Deaf/HH participants were **Kathy** and **Richard Kush** from Chicago, **Joan Bates** from Virginia, and **Sharon Fisher** from New Jersey.

The most thrilling part of this experience was interpreting the words of <u>Pope John Paul II</u>. He celebrated the Mass and the words of canonization (proclaiming someone a saint) in Latin. I understand some Latin but had all the translations for the Latin before time. The Pope preached in Spanish, Italian and then English. It was so inspiring to sign his English message to the group of Deaf/HH pilgrims.

The Pope urged us all to follow the wonderful example of **Saint Katharine Drexel**, a saint from Philadelphia. He spoke of her love of Jesus, in the Eucharist and her life of service to bring justice to African Americans and Native Americans during her life.

Saint Katharine Drexel left a four-fold dynamic gift to all those who desire to continue her work today. Read these goals carefully as they have a special message for people who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing:

- her love for the Eucharist, her spirit of prayer, and her Eucharistic perspective on the unity of all people;
- her undaunted spirit of courageous initiative in addressing iniquities among minorities-one hundred years before such concern aroused public interest in the United States;
- her belief in the importance of quality education for all, and her efforts to achieve it;

When Mother Katharine Drexel was a young adult before she became a sister, she went to Rome to ask Pope Leo XIII to send priest to the Indian missions. She was surprised at his response that she go become a missionary and give not only her money but herself to serve those in need. We know that Saint Katharine did just that. A person is canonized publicly so that all the world can view that person's life and follow their example. May we be inspired in our day to day life to live out the qualities we see in Saint Katharine Drexel's life. First, she recognized her need for Jesus, in the Eucharist. This love urged her to go out and serve those most in need with her resources and her own gifts and talents. We can do the same.

I hope to see more and more of our Deaf Catholics attending the Signed and Interpreted Masses. May an increased love of the Eucharist bring us to fuller unity and enable us to follow St. Katharine's life of love and service.

things at Archbishop Ryan School as the 2000-2001 school year began last month. Our children's classes are now in different places. Some children even had to obtain new uniforms! We welcomed new staff members, we opened new positions and many children are having new experiences! The beginning days were very busy but just about now, we are moving in a regular routine and feeling good about all our new

beginnings!

Our Oral School moved to the Saint George Site. Some of these children are now included in the regular classroom learning communities of Saint George Parish School. Mrs. Eileen Conlow moves between three of these classrooms supporting teachers, assisting students, teaching lessons and answering the needs in whatever way she can. Eileen moves between the first grades and the Kindergarten each day making sure that our four young students are learning all that they can while continuing to develop appropriate language. Miss Kelly Perillo serves as the resource teacher for one of our older students included in the sixth grade all day. The other seven children move in and out of the mainstream studying some lessons with their hearing peers and others in the Ryan School classrooms upstairs.

Our Total Communication Students moved to the Saint Gabriel Site. They are very excited because they are also moving into some regular education classes at Saint Gabriel School with the assistance of our new interpreter, Mrs. Mary Kay Roberts. Mary is kept quite busy all day taking students to Math, Social Studies and sometimes to Religion and Art classes. It has become a normal sight to see students packing their things and moving back and forth from our neighboring school. Everyone seems to be enjoying the new challenges. One of our students, Matthew Dundon recently walked down the hall

very excited about doing well in his Math test. He was so excited because he knew he did well but also because it was a surprise test and he knew just how to solve all the problems! Excitement about learning certainly abounds as our students meet many new challenges. Our students with Central Auditory Processing Disorder are also grouped in a new way. They are learning in a program that has been tailored to meet their specific learning needs. They too are excited about what they are learning because they see that they are beginning to put different pieces of information together and their new knowledge is making sense. Developing good study skills and learning to focus their attention are important skills in their program. Indeed we are grateful for the dedication and the good work of our faculty. Although we face many challenges each day, we are well aware of the presence of our God and the strength God gives us as we strive to make education meaningful to our students and to proclaim the gospel to these young people of God. We continue to ask for your prayerful

Editor's Remarks

When I read the last newsletter, I noticed that some people wrote about

Sister Mary Immaculate and I felt bad that I did not participate by writing about her at that time. I know that it is never too late to write about Sister Mary Immaculate.

Who was Sister Mary Immaculate? My first impression of Sister Mary Immaculate when she came to The Pennsylvania School for the Deaf to teach religion class was that she had lovely brown eyes showing her beautiful soul and that she was a hard of hearing nun. When she started teaching, I was fascinated and through her religion class I learned a lot! This continued until I felt that through her and Father Anthony Russo God was calling me to become a deaf nun. When it became a reality in process, I suddenly felt that I was not ready to attend Lansdale Catholic High School. I was fifteen years old then and it was the most difficult decision I ever made although with Sister Mary Immaculate's help I felt comfortable in making my decision not to become a nun. We became friends and I relied on her support.

When **Jim** and I started making our wedding plans, Sister Mary Immaculate came to my mind so I asked her to do us the honor of participating in the whole liturgy of our wedding. She graciously accepted and was there at our Lady of Mount Carmel Church on **Saturday**,

March 4, 1989, when Fr. Anthony Russo married us. She even took time to take a lot of pictures of us with her little black camera which amazed us. She also gave us a lovely figurine of Mother Mary. She encouraged us to rear children which at that time I thought I was too old to be a mother. How wrong I was! I felt Sister Mary Immaculate knew that we would have three girls somehow. Was she working under God's hands with me and my family? Yes, she certainly was!

One Saturday after the play at St. Charles Seminary, my family with a group of deaf people had seen her (when she had her retreat there) in the beautiful little chapel in the crypt. To my amazement, Sister Mary Immaculate who had a motor difficulty at that time walked up to the altar with two canes showing her dignity and courage. She told all her children (who are now adults) and their families that we must never forget to kneel before the altar and to make the sign of the cross showing our respect to God. I had tears in my eyes looking at her kneeling down with two canes I felt that she had an angel to help her.

One day Sister Mary Immaculate called me asking me if I could pick her up to go to a friend's birthday party which my family also was invited. Without a second thought, I said OK and we drove all the way to pick her up. Indeed it was out of the way but I was happy to help her. We had a great time at the party, by the way!

Lastly, my most recent visit with her was nice and I knew it would be the last time I saw her. Her faith nourished me to build my own faith during those years! As I look back I see myself as a young uncertain teenager who changed her mind not to be a nun; however, Sister Mary Immaculate taught me how to keep my faith strong. Now, I am Jim's wife, a mother of three lovely daughters, a teacher of religion class for both hearing and deaf children at our parish and St. Stanislaus; and I am still involved in the Deaf Catholic Community and DeSales Society. "Sister Mary Immacu-


