ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The academic procession is led by the university marshall, who is the president of the Faculty Senate. The university marshall bears the original mace of The University of Texas of the Permian Basin.

The first group, which is also led by two faculty marshalls, is composed of the students who are candidates for degrees. The undergraduate students who will receive bachelor's degrees enter first, followed by the graduate students, who have already earned a bachelor's or higher degree and today are receiving their master's degree. The candidates are grouped by degrees and wear academic regalia appropriate to the degree that will be conferred upon them today.

Two other faculty marshalls lead the second group, which consists of members of the faculty. The faculty wear academic regalia signifying their highest earned academic degree. The vibrant colors signify both the degree earned and the granting university.

The third group is comprised of those individuals who will take part in the commencement ceremonies. They are dressed in appropriate academic regalia.

The final individual in the academic procession, bearing the second mace, is the chair of the Graduate Council.

THE UNIVERSITY MACES

The mace traces its roots to the medieval period when it was a weapon used by mounted knights. It has been a symbol of scholarship and integrity for universities since the 11th century. Today, maces are used to indicate the solemnity of the occasion and the confirmation of the academic process. The University of Texas of the Permian Basin uses two ceremonial maces in the academic procession.

The first mace is carried by the university marshall, who is the president of the Faculty Senate and who leads the procession. This mace was designed by The University's first president, Dr. B.H. Amstead, in 1973, the year it opened for classes. Brig. Gen. H. W. Hise, USMC (Ret.), former executive director of development, carved the first mace. The shaft of the mace is constructed primarily of koa wood from the slopes of the Hawaiian volcano Mauna Kea. The flame at the top of the mace was hand carved from West Texas mesquite.

Each of the four sides below the flame is carved. The lone star represents the State of Texas; the pump jack represents the oil industry that has made West Texas and the Permian Basin famous; the lamp symbolizes the quest for knowledge; and the letters UTPB are the logo of The University of Texas of the Permian Basin.

The four sides at the bottom of the mace have the following numbers carved: 1969 - the year the legislature of the State of Texas established The University of Texas of the Permian Basin; 1112 - the number of students enrolled for the first semester of classes in the fall of 1973; 1974 - the year of the first commencement exercises; and 40 - the number of degree candidates at the first graduation ceremony.

Originally, The University of Texas of the Permian Basin was established as an

upper level institution. The design of the original mace's shaft portion symbolizes the original upper level status. The lower two rings of the shaft represent the first two years of college required for admission. The mace's upper part is carved with three rings representing the junior and senior years of undergraduate study originally available at The University of Texas of the Permian Basin and graduate studies.

The second ceremonial mace was commissioned to recognize the addition of freshman and sophomore classes in 1991. Designed and crafted in 1994 by Dr. William A. Watts, former vice president for business affairs, professor of finance, and acting dean of the School of Business, this mace is fashioned of rugged mesquite wood, which typifies West Texas. The design is based upon the pentagon that is symbolic for the five student classes and the five points of the Texas star. The handle tapers up to the letters UTPB and supports the five classes: freshman; sophomore; junior; senior; and master. Above all is the lone star representing the State of Texas.

The bearer of the second mace is the chair of the graduate council and is the final person in the academic procession.

ACADEMIC COSTUME AND REGALIA

Academic robes are visible representations of a tradition that comes down to us from the first European universities of the Middle Ages. Because universities were founded and operated by the church, students were required to wear the prescribed clerical gowns at all times. Present American academic costumes were adapted directly from those of the oldest English universities, Oxford and Cambridge, with Cambridge predominating.

The usual color for American academic dress is black, although increasingly, robes in the school's predominant color may appear, particularly for holders of doctorates. The bachelor's robe is worn closed and has long, pointed sleeves. The master's robe is worn open, and the forearms protrude through slits in the elbows of the sleeves. The doctor's robe is worn open or closed and has three velvet bars on each sleeve.

The most colorful part of the costume is the elaborate hood, once a head covering. The doctor's hood is larger than the master's. Hoods are lined with the colors of the university or college from which the wearer received the degree. The trimming or collar of the hood is of a color that designates the discipline: blue for philosophy, brown for fine arts, orange for engineering, pink for music, white for liberal arts, buff for business, yellow for science, light blue for education, etc.

Caps are usually black and of "mortarboard" design, but modern usage permits the omission of the cap's stiff liner, giving it softer contours. Tassels for doctorates are gold, while those for other degrees are most often black. Switching the tassel from the right side to the left signifies that the undergraduate degree has been conferred.

The regalia seen in the academic procession today are a reminder that higher education has long and cherished traditions, of which today's graduates become a valued part. These successful degree holders of a young but growing institution have earned their opportunity to contribute to those traditions, and they remind us that in an enlightened citizenry rests the strength of a democratic nation.


