## Mark Jones, M.S., M.B.A.

Mark Jones is principal investigator for one of sixteen national federally funded projects by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality awarded in 2005 to build model electronic patient health information networks. Prior to taking his current post Mr. Jones served in several capacities for 29 years with the Oklahoma State Health Department. Mr. Jones received a M.S. in clinical Psychology from Indiana State University and an M.B.A. from Northeastern State University. Mr. Jones also serves as a consultant to the Rural Health Institute through Northeastern State University which develops internet based statistical systems to support rural health initiatives.

After a three year effort involving over sixty professionals the publicly run network, named SMRTNET, has begun operations in northeast Oklahoma covering approximately 300,000 patients and will expand to another 400,000 lives the Oklahoma City area in September of 2008. The network is inclusive of all types of providers including the federally qualified health centers, hospitals, universities, physician offices, public health, Native American tribes.
