The father of Mr Jno. G.
Glendenning who was a private in
the 10th Maine & afterwards of the
29th Maine volunteers, in which
he was wounded, dying at the
University Hospital New Orleans,
desires to obtain information of the
service of his son with a view to
obtaining a Pension on account of his
death. The death occurred in 1864.
Probably, - your letter of the 10th instant
states that Glendenning was discharged
from the 10th Regt in 1862. Can you
give me information of any of the officers
of the 29th Regt: from whom might now
be obtained information concerning

Glendening's service. in the 29th

Regt: If so I shall esteem it
a favor. I have no interest in
it except to aid the father, who
is a stranger in this country, old
sick & poor.
