\$24 million apartment complex offered to PC students, community

A 35-building, 438-apartment complex will be available to Parkland students and the community. The 39-acre Melrose Apartment complex is scheduled to be completed the first week of August, according to Patrick McShane, project manager.

"Development is going good," said McShane.

Located off Interstate 74 on North Lincoln Avenue, the apartments will be a private, gated community where each resident has an individual bed-

room/bathroom suite with an individual lease, according to Jean Moyer, Intergroup Inc. corporate relations media consultant. There will be two, three, and four-bedroom furnished and unfurnished apartments.

According to Moyer, the complex will include a heated indoor 25-meter swimming pool, a modern health club, a large clubroom and recreation area with pool tables and cappuccino bar, and a computer lab equipped with PC's and CD-ROM'S as well as copiers, fax machines and reference materials.

Other services include free services such as garbage pick-up, snowplowing, and battery jump-starting with carport.

The \$24 million project is the fifth Melrose project on college campuses by Intergroup Inc. Other projects include sites at the University of Florida, Florida St. University, FAMU and Tallahassee Community College, University of North Carolina St., and the University of North Florida. A sixth complex is currently being built in Austin, Texas.

'It's been a heckuva year'

English professor speaks at Capitol

Wallace speaks at Smithsonian

When Sally Wallace, a Parkland English professor for 26 years, was chosen as one of the American Professors of the Year, she was required to lecture at the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C.

"I was praying that a meteor would hit D.C.," said Wallace, who travelled to the capitol in mid-May. "I was extremely nervous about going, but things went fine."

Wallace's lecture focused on the usage of weak verbs, needless repetition, wordiness, cliches, and euphemisms in everyday writing.

Her lecture entitled, "Last But Not Least, Resisting the Utilization of Free Gifts at This Point in Time at our Learning Stations," was a collaboration of the topics in which she discussed. For instance, "last but not least" is a cliché; the phrase "this point in

time" is wordy and could be shortened.

Wallace said she was asked to give one of her favorite class lectures, but since she doesn't prefer the lecture format, she combined some of her favorite topics.

"The crowd was very responsive," Wallace said. "They laughed a lot. I had a good time, and they did too." About 80 people, mostly editors of government publications and members of private public relations firms, attended the lecture.

Wallace's nervousness was somewhat reduced by talking with other lecturers that were also chosen American Professors of the Year and had given their lectures at the Smithsonian.

"I spoke with the three other people to get advice on what it was like. Their reply was don't sweat it," said Wallace with a smile.

Asked if this were one of the highlights of her career, Wallace said, "It's been a heckuva year."

She will be giving her lecture on Oct. 15 for Parkland's Continuing Education program. Everyone is invited.

Summer, Fall ID's being made

Parkland ID's now are being made in X 147 for students registered for the Summer and Fall semesters, according to Susan Pinnell, Student Services program assistant.

The students must have one photo ID such as a drivers license, state ID, another college ID, high school ID, passport, or resident alien card. A firearms or an ID that requires the

person to mail in his/her picture will not be accepted, Pinnell said.

"If the student has no photo ID, then we require a Social Security card and three small pieces of mail sent to the person's house," Pinnell said.

With proper identification the ID process takes about seven minutes, she said.

Students who were

enrolled in Spring, 1997 and/or enrolled in the Summer, 1997, can pick up a Verification of Student Status card to receive an MTD summer flash pass.

By presenting a Student Verification card and a Parkland ID to an MTD driver, a student can obtain an MTD flash pass for \$15 for the Summer semester, Pinnell said.

"The *Prospectus* was the first newspaper in the region that went on-line in its entirety," says Amar-

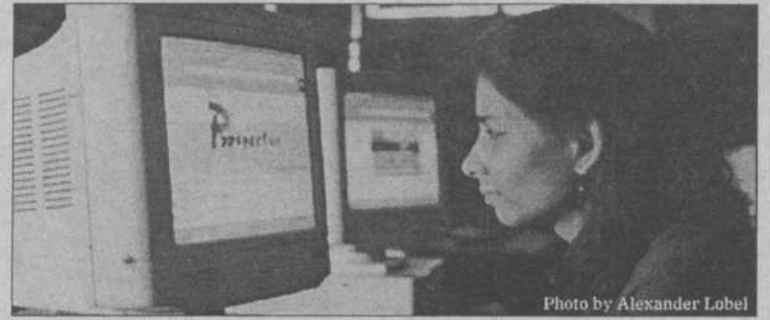

Watercolor art on display, PC Art Gallery holds reception

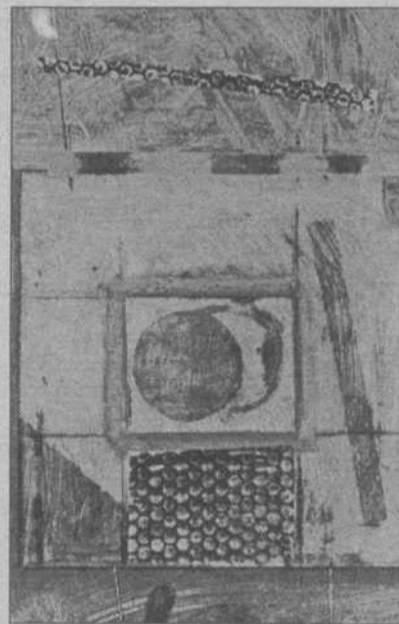

The Parkland Art Gallery will hold a reception on Thursday, June 19, from 6 to 8 p.m., in the Gallery Lounge to honor a solo exhibition of work by Robert Lee Mejer.

Mejer will be answering questions about his paintings in an informal setting. His work will be on display until July 3.

Mejer is currently Chairman and Full Professor of Art at Quincy University. A traditional watercolorist in the early 1960s, he says he felt the need to push the medium to another level.

His experiments with paper collage gave Mejer new points of departure for

oils and watercolors.

"As the monotype became the focus of my experimentation," Mejer says, "I continued to draw inspiration from the analogy with collage. Now I find what I have learned from the monotype experience haunts the images I capture in watercolor."

Mejer is a representational painter. However, he chooses to represent not the world of appearances, but emotional situations and psychic spaces, he said. "My paintings are not about a subject; they are the subject."

The gallery will be open Monday through Thursday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Tuesday through Thursday from 6 to 8 p.m.



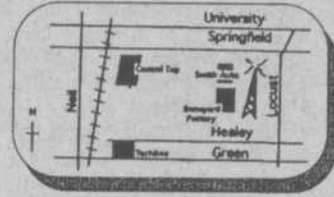

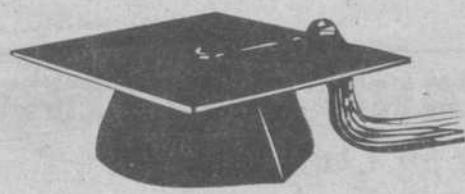

Kemphues placed sev-

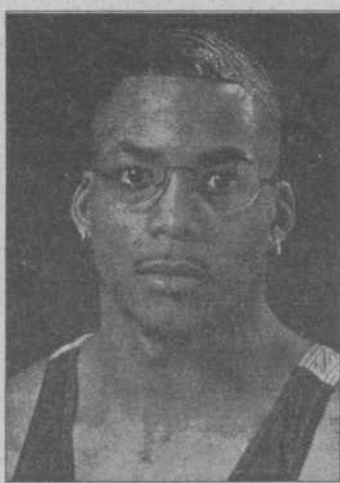
a distance of 17'1." She didn't make the finals, however.
