The program will be financed by fund raising events organized and conducted by participating students.





ATM's might be used for bond

County corrections a 'stressful job'

"You're locked up with people that don't want to be there," said Lt. Randy Castor, Champaign County Corrections. "It's a stressful job."

Inmates and officers are constantly coming and going from the facility with court appearances, legal appointments and visits, and Castor.

Life in the County Jail starts at 6 a.m. with breakfast. Everyone is locked in at 10:30 p.m.

"It's like a city within a building," said Castor during a press conference with Parkland Newswriting II students.

The jail has alcoholics and narcotics counseling, religious services and GED classes, which are provided by Parkland.

"We have a hospital, a kitchen and do laundry here also," said Castor.

He said food is now transported form the new 139-cell satellite in Southeast Urbana.

"We'll see less overcrowding with the new facility," said Castor. "All jails will see overcrowding in the future though."

Inmates receive two half-hour visits per week. Visits are through a glass

booth via telephone.

Inmates do get one phone call per day, but they must pay the bill.

"We're not like T.V. shows," he said.

Males and females are segregated at the 18-yearold building. Two Illinois prisons are co-ed out of the 15-20.

Last year the facility arrested 8,514 and transported 8,498.

"We were required to transport all out of county arrests last year," said Castor. "We traveled a lot."

There is a wide age range at the facility, 17-year-olds being the youngest. Castor said he has seen people in the 80's.

Different divisions have different amounts of attention at the jail: minimum, medium and maximum. Work release is also an option

A lot of our work releasees are traffic offenders," said Castor. "Think about it. If you're here 60 days, you could lose your income, your job and your life."

Local criminals soon may be able to use their pin number to get out of jail by posting bond via ATM.

"We're looking into it," said Castor. "We're trying to incorporate new technol-

ogy, but we need to train our officers with that technology."

The County Jail has already incorporated a computerized fingerprinting system called Index, which puts background information from the county computer onto the top of fingerprint cards.

"This has saved our records department much needed time," said Castor.

That department is still full of manila folders holding records of past and current criminals.

"We hold those records a couple of years before they go onto microfiche," said Castor.

He said training the offi-

cers with new technology takes time. "We have field training instructors that are sent to specialized schools."

He said 68 people need to be trained.

Some officers are sent to Index school for training with the fingerprinting system.

Castor said bail used to be posted with bail bondsman who received 10 percent of the inmates bail.

"Today they get it form their savings accounts," said Castor. The 10 percent now goes to the circuit clerk.






