Twenty trophies, each accompanied by a \$2500 scholarship, are handed out annually at the Academic Association of Community Colleges Convention, bringing national attention to students' academic success-

She is now recognized as a member of the First Team of the 12th Annual All-USA Community and Junior College Academic Teams. MY NEW FOCUS ON LIFE by Ashley Adams

I have never really been one of those people who watches the news or reads the paper everyday, except for the horoscope section. I never really paid much attention to what was going on in the world until now, that is! I woke up around eleven oclock a.m. on that horrifying September day, to watch my daily soap opera. When I turned on the television, though, there was some kind of news program on. So, as I usually would, I turned the television off. Not even five minutes had passed, and my mother called to tell me about the planes crashing into the World Trade Center, and the Pentagon. I turned the news back on, and froze as I watched the tragic events that had occurred.

It seemed so fictitious, so surreal, like a bad dream. Naturally I did not know a thing about either of the buildings that were destroyed, but I learned about them really fast.

My first cousin worked in the Pentagon building, and happened to be working on September 11. He was just typing away at his computer, when less than two hundred yards from him the wall started to collapse. I just cannot imagine the overwhelming shock and fear he had to sense from this experience! I would have been hysterical, had I been in his position. I would not wish that occurrence on even my

one's life.

Many dire things have happened in America such as shootings and bombings, but I suppose I have just tried to ignore them. I feel like I have been selfish, in a way, because how on earth would these victims' families be able to ignore what happened.?

I was really worried about my cousin, because we didn't hear anything from our family; we didn't know if he was okay, or even alive. We could not reach them by phone, because when we tried to call it said their phone line was temporarily disconnected. So, all we could do was sit and wait. There was a very good chance that my cousin Mark was one of those missing people from the results of the tragedy, but he also could have been just fine. Either way, we had no way of knowing what the case was. We continued to watch the television, and the more we watched, the more we worried! Really, the only hope we had was that there were many professionals out there taking charge, and taking care of the situation. I could tell that they were doing their best to ensure everyone's safety. Finally, my uncle called and told us that Mark was okay. He said that he and Mark were writing back and forth on the computer, and in the middle of a normal conversation Mark told him that something very bizarre suddenly happened. My uncle told him to try and stay on line for as long as possible, for he knew it was the only way they could continue to communicate. Eventually, Mark was unable to stay at his computer, from him until the next day. We still worried about him, but until something else happened, we were sure

he would be alright. In the past, I didn't pay enough attention to all of my family. I guess I sort of took them for granted, assuming that they would always be there. This even, however, has given me a serious reason to be more concerned for them, and their well being. You never can predict when something like this is going to happen, and when you are not prepared for it, it hits you ten times worse.

Even though we received word that my cousin and family were okay, I sadly kept watching the tele-

worst enemy. I am sure that it vision, as people spoke of losing would take a serious toll on some- their loved ones. My heart went out to those people, with great empathy. I realized it could have been one of my family members out there sharing their awful experience. Some were telling stories of how their moms or dads were killed. I could not help but cry, and want to reach out and hug them. I cannot believe how emotional I got from watching these people I didn't even know. I just could not hide my feelings. One woman who spoke, had lost her husband on one of the airplanes. He had called her on his cell phone to let her know that they would probably never see each other again. Through her tears, she said that her little girl kept wanting to talk to her daddy. I think that this is the most heartbreaking thing I have ever heard in my life. Can you imagine how hard it would be to answer that little girl's question when she asked "where is my daddy?" or "when is daddy coming home?" Though nothing could take away this woman's pain, I wished so badly that she could find some peace and comfort. I believe that everything happens for a reason, but I want to know why somebody would want to be responsible for destroying so many people's lives. All I could do was pray for answers, and hope that families would make it through this time of sorrow!

I actually stop sometimes at the news now, when I am flipping through the channels. It is strange how I have found myself taking more of an interest in my surroundings, but not just by watching the news. I read the newspaper a lot and nobody heard another word now, and never thought I would actually spend money on one, but I do. I have learned a lot from stories in the paper, though most of them are not too pleasant. I have also taken more of an interest in my family, since the September 11 nightmare. I want to be more involved with them. I want to show how much I appreciate them. I don't want to take them for granted though, because I believe that nothing short of God knows when they may leave this earth. This experience has caused me a lot of bitterness, yet in a way it has helped me to become a better person too. It has really influenced my focus; my focus on life and my focus on this world.



National Association of Letter Carriers **Will Promote Annual Collection for Charity**

National Association of Letter Carriers promote annual collection for charity

There are 31 million hungry people in this country. Eight million of those are children. The 10th Annual National Food Drive is the largest charity project of its kind in the United States and in 2001, the Postal Service's letter carriers picked up, sorted, and delivered 70.1 million pounds of food. On May 11th, 204,000 letter carriers nationwide, will be picking up the food that people place by their mailboxes.

Local contributions go to the Eastern Illinois Food Bank, local churches and other agencies such as the Salvation Army for distribution. The Champaign-Urbana area brought in 40,000 pounds of food last year. This year the National Association of Letter Carriers Local #671 hopes to collect 50,000 pounds.

State May Cut Scholarship Funds **Application Deadline May Change**

CHAMPAIGN - Proposed cuts to a scholarship program for Illinois students could force some to transfer or drop out of the state's costlier universities and colleges, officials said. Under the current budproposal by Senate Republicans, \$50 million would be cut from the Monetary Award Program to help fill the \$1.2 billion deficit in the state budget. About 140,000 students in Illinois currently receive a total of \$375 million in MAP grants.


amount of tuition and fees, whichever is cheaper. Because of tuition increases and the proposed cut to grant dollars, students attending more expensive universities would be faced with transferring to a cheaper school or borrowing more money, she said.

State Rep. Rick Winkel, R-Champaign, said he wasn't surprised the student grant money was cut during budget negotia-

"Obviously, any reduction in the Students who receive the grant MAP grant amount greatly concerns me," he said. "But this year most people will be pretty unhappy

with the budget across the board." If the \$50 million cut is approved, the Illinois Student Assistance Commission may have to impose an application deadline as soon as this summer. The deadline would affect community college and nontraditional students who typically apply late in the year, Thull said.

Also, students who fail to graduate in four years would have their funding cut. Currently, students can receive grants for two additional semesters if they are needed to complete a degree.


