SCRIPTURE

The Scripture read in today's service is from Alexander Campbell's translation of the New Testament, which he called Living Oracles.

INTERPRETATION OF SERVICE

Through this service we seek to reenact the worship experience of our forefathers 100-150 years ago. The setting is enhanced by some in period dress, terminology of yesteryears (Brother and Sister), the absence of the organ, acapella singing, and a simple, informal order of service. In those days services began with a period of Christian Fellowship, a time for informal handshaking and greetings to one another. Thus we begin today.

Our forefathers of the faith stressed the priesthood of all believers. To symbolize this they placed the communion table on floor level with the worshippers. Lay leadership participated from the congregation rather than from the chancel as today. That was before the day of organized cnoirs, so today our choir is seated with the congregation.

To symbolize oneness in Christ our forefathers partook from one loaf and one cup during the communion service. Out of consideration for today's changing views of hygiene deacons will direct those communing to come to the communion table by rows via the center aisles. Each communicant will break bread from loaves of unleavened bread, drink from the cups, and return to their seats via the outer aisles for the conclusion of the service. (This would not have been done by our forefathers.)

May this service remind us of the rich heritage that is ours and the eternal presence of the living God.

HYMNS

The hymns used in the service today are hymns that were in Alexander Campbell's hymnbook, first published in 1823. Campbell laid great emphasis
