ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

OCTAVIO CÁRDENAS (*Director*) captivates audiences with his visionary, visceral, and physical style of stage-directing. Born in the city of Guadalajara, Mexico, he has been praised by *Opera News* for creating "an immersive theater experience" while the *Dallas Morning News* hailed him for bringing "every character and situation to life." Recent projects include *Lohengrin* by Salvatore Sciarrino as a pop-up digital opera installation: a site-specific opera for COVID times in collaboration with artist Lance McGoldrick and Opera Southwest; *Cruzar la cara de la Luna* with Opera Santa Barbara; and the world premiere of the children's opera *Frida Kahlo and the Bravest Girl in the World* for Fort Worth Opera. Upcoming projects include the world premiere of *Zorro* with Fort Worth Opera, and *The Barber of Seville* with Opera Delaware.

Mr. Cárdenas' recent productions of *Silent Night* for Fort Worth Opera and Lyric Opera of Kansas City were described as "a breathtaking realization" with "many brilliant touches." The *Kansas City Star* called the Lyric Opera's production "one of its finest performances in recent memory." Other recent productions include *La bohème* for Minnesota Opera to which the *Star Tribune* acclaimed, "what makes the production a success, is Octavio Cárdenas' staging." His production of *As One* for UrbanArias was acclaimed by *MD Theater Guide*, "Under the direction of Octavio Cárdenas, the two stars playfully make great use of both stage and energetic space—it seemed the theatre condensed and expanded with Hannah's journey."

As the former director of opera for Baylor University, Mr. Cárdenas directed productions of L'elisir d'amore, The Turn of the Screw, Dialogues of the Carmelites, Die Fledermaus, Man of La Mancha, La finta giardiniera, HMS Pinafore and Rita. He has served as the head of directing staff at Des Moines Metro Opera and has also been on the directing staff at Chautauqua Opera.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

Mr. Cárdenas is currently the director of opera at Chapman University and will be joining the opera faculty at The Eastman School of Music in the fall of 2022. He received his Master of Fine Arts in Theatre from UCLA, a Master of Music from the University of South Carolina, and a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Centenary College in Louisiana.

PAUL FLOYD (Conductor) is a pianist in great demand as both a collaborative artist and vocal coach throughout Southern California. He teaches on the adjunct faculty at Chapman University, where he works with both the opera and the keyboard collaborative arts programs. Additionally, he is a lecturer in the Vocal Department of the University of California, Los Angeles. For 16 years, Mr. Floyd served as an assistant conductor with the Los Angeles Opera, often collaborating with some of the opera world's greatest singers and conductors. He played in the opera orchestra and was regularly featured as a lecturer at pre-performance talks. Summer seasons, he has served in similar positions with the Santa Fe Opera, Aspen Music Festival, Hawaii Performing Arts Festival and the Astoria Festival in Oregon. On many occasions, Paul Floyd has been called upon as official accompanist for the Western Region Finals of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions.



JACQUELINE BOTZ (Florencia—Friday Performance) is a senior voice performance major from Houston, TX, and is currently studying voice under the instruction of Dr. Peter Atherton. Since attending Chapman University, Jacqueline has been very involved in Opera Chapman. Her most recent roles include Erste Dame in Mozart's Die Zauberflöte, and Florencia Grimaldi in Florencia en el Amazonas by Daniel Catán. Jacqueline has 14 years of dance training and has served as a choreographer for Opera Chapman and other classes throughout the Hall-Musco Conservatory of Music. She will be attending the Vienna Summer Music Festival and the Miami Frost Salzburg Program this summer where she will perform the role of Lady Caroline in Mondo Novo by Michael Polo and Contessa in Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro. Jacqueline is thrilled to continue her vocal studies at The Peabody Institute of the John Hopkins University for her graduate degree this fall.

MELISSA BRILLHART (*Paula*—Friday Performance) is a senior vocal performance and psychology double major from Pleasanton, CA. She is currently studying voice under the instruction of Patricia Gee. Melissa has previously been in three Opera Chapman productions: Opera en Fuego scenes, *Die Zauberflöte*, and Twenty Years of Opera Chapman: A Gala Farewell Celebration. Outside of Opera Chapman, she works as a research assistant at the Brain Institute, sings mezzo in Chapman Soundcheck, and is a member of the Provost Student Advisory Board.

JOVANNI FERRER (Capitán—Friday Performance) is an Armenian-Filipino vocalist, composer, arranger, and trumpet player from Glendale, CA. Ferrer is pursuing a B.M. in Vocal Performance and B.M. in Music Composition. He enjoys writing art songs and choral music. In addition to his studies at Chapman, Ferrer currently serves as the music director and arranger of Chapman Soundcheck, an a cappella group.

MAKAYLA FLOCKEN (*Florencia*—Sunday Performance) is an incoming transfer student from Riverside City College. She studies vocal performance with Rebecca Sherburn at Chapman University. *Florencia en el Amazonas* is her first full production in an opera. She has background in classical singing as well as musical theater. This summer she plans on attending the summer program Opera Seme in Arezzo, Italy, and will be playing the role of Arminda in Mozart's *La Finta Giardiniera*.

REECE HUFF (Capitán—Sunday Performance) is a senior Accounting and Business Administration major and has greatly enjoyed being a part of Opera Chapman for the last four years. He is very grateful for the opportunity to play Don Alfonso in Mozart's Così fan tutte, Sarastro in The Magic Flute, and participate in a variety of other scenes. Reece would like to thank his mom, his voice teacher Dr. Peter Atherton, and everyone else who has so graciously supported him along the way.

EVEN JOHNSON (*Paula*—Sunday Performance) is a 2017 graduate of the Classical Voice Conservatory at Orange County School of the Arts, where they participated in Opera Scenes and Chamber Choir. Even is currently pursuing a Bachelor of Music degree in vocal performance with a double minor in LGBTQ+ Studies and Creative and Cultural Industries at Chapman University. Honors include: performing with South Coast Symphony for Young Stars of the Future, being a Spotlight Awards semifinalist, first-place winner of the Center Stage Opera Vocal Competition, and three-time winner of the SCVA Vocal Competition.



Performances include: Prince Orlofsky in *Die Fledermaus*, Second Lady in *Die Zauberflöte*, and Nancy in *Albert Herring*.

JOEY KRUMBEIN (Arcadio—Friday Performance) is a senior at Chapman University from Santa Ana, California. There, he majors in Vocal Performance with a Music Technology minor, and studies voice with Patrick Goeser. Over the past four years, he has had the pleasure of taking part in seven Opera Chapman productions. In his time at Chapman, he has performed in scenes programs featuring music from West Side Story, Manon, Roméo et Juliette, Luisa Fernanda, and more. He was also set to play the role of Monastatos in Chapman's production of Die Zauberflöte in May of 2020. He is thrilled to be performing the role of Arcadio in Opera Chapman's production of Daniel Catán's Florencia en el Amazonas.

CALUM MACDERMID (*Riolobo*—Sunday Performance) is a sophomore at Chapman, focusing his studies on Creative Writing and Music Studies. This is his first opera at Chapman University. He has performed other roles, such as the Beast in *Beauty and the Beast* and Dr. Orin Scrivello in *Little Shop of Horrors*. 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
