AN ORDINANCE Amending Section 419 of the Code of the City of Jacksonville, Florida, 1927, relating to Funeral Processions.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYON AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSOEVILLE:

SECTION 1. That Section 419 of the Gode of the City of Jacksonville, Florida, 1927, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"419. Funeral Processions. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle of any kind between automobiles or other carriers which constitute a part of a funeral procession or to break into such procession in any manner, provided that the vehicles constituting said procession shall display lighted parking or head lights. It shall be the duty of the person, firm or corporation directing all funeral processions to n tify those persons driving vehicles in such processions of the provisions of this ordinance."

SECTION 2. All persons, firms or corporations convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Twenty-five Dollars.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
