CLARK UNIVERSITY

Clark University was founded in 1887 as the first all-graduate institution in America; the undergraduate college was established in 1902. During the early years of the University, graduate degrees were awarded on an individual basis. Formal commencement exercises began at Clark in June 1905, when bachelor's degrees were awarded for the first time.

The robes worn by the 1992 doctoral candidates were designed last year to commemorate the one-hundredth anniversary of the awarding of the first Ph.D. at Clark in 1891. The robes are emerald green with gold University seals on the lapels. These complement the traditional doctoral hoods and reflect the University's official colors, white and emerald.

Today's Commencement also features the flags of 35 nations and the United Nations, lining the walkway of the processional. These flags represent the homelands of all degree recipients, including undergraduate, graduate, and honorary. With students from seventy countries in attendance at Clark last year and members of the faculty involved in research, training, and development in more than sixty nations, Clark's international character is evident and is honored today with this display.

Academic Dress

From the cap, gown, and hood it is possible to distinguish the institution from which the wearer was graduated, the field of learning in which his or her degree was earned, and the level of the degree: bachelor's, master's, or doctor's.

The distinguishing feature of the black mortarboard cap, standard at most colleges and universities in the United States, is the color of the tassel ≈ black for the holder of bachelor's or master's degrees, gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

The gown is normally black, although the chief officers of many universities wear colored gowns, and several institutions have authorized optional doctoral gowns that embody the institution's colors. The level of the degree is indicated by the gown's cut. The bachelor's gown, which is relatively simple, has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown is somewhat fuller, and its sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees, are square at the ends. The gown for the doctor's degree is cut rather fully, velvet panels reach down the front and around the neck, and the sleeves are bell-shaped and decorated with three horizontal velvet bars.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the academic attire in the United States. Originally used as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, the hood is now worn at the back, suspended from the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The length of the bachelor's hood is four feet long, and border is five inches wide. The hood is lined with the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, and the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree is earned.

Honorary Degree Recipients

MADELEINE MAY KUNIN, a noted environmentalist, is the first woman to have been elected governor of Vermont and the first woman in U.S. history to serve three terms as governor. A graduate of the University of Massachusetts with a master's degree from Columbia University School of Journalism, Kunin worked as a reporter with the Burlington Free Press. She served three terms in the state House of Representatives and two terms as Vermont's lieutenant governor before being elected governor in 1984. Kunin's terms as governor were characterized by increased support for education, firm adherence to Vermont's stringent environmental laws, support for child care and human services, and creation of an innovative rural enterprise zone. Under her leadership, Vermont was recognized as a national environmental leader in land use, preservation of water quality, and the proper disposal of solid and hazardous waste. Kunin is the founder of a nonprofit environmental organization, the Institute for Sustainable Communities, which provides environmental and political information to communities in Central and Eastern Europe. This past year, she has served as the first Radcliffe College Distinguished Public Policy Visitor and has been writing a book, Living a Political Life.

ANN McKENNY EARLY, a 1946 graduate of Clark, was a member of the first Clark undergraduate class to include women. Women undergraduates were admitted first to the University in 1942. Early, who received a master's degree from Harvard University, has been a lecturer in the Department of English at Southern Methodist University since 1966 and served as coordinator of its Women's Studies Program from 1980 until 1989. Besides serving as coordinator of the Women's Studies Council and Women's Symposium Planning Committee, Early has worked on the College Committee on Advising and Orientation and the School of Humanities and Sciences Scholarship Committee at Southern Methodist University. She twice has received awards from the graduating class for her outstanding teaching and has been recognized for extraordinary service to the university. Long dedicated to the advancement of young women, Early has been involved in a number of community activities including serving as chair of the Girls' Initiative of the Dallas Women's Foundation and as a member of the Y.W.C.A. Women's Resource Center. She also is a member of the National Women's Studies Association and the Modern Language Association of America.

MARCUS ALLEN McCORISON, president of the American Antiquarian Society, is credited with building the society into one of the nation's most prestigious independent research libraries for the study of Americana. During McCorison's 32-year tenure as librarian, director and, since 1989 as president, the society's collection has added about 150,000 volumes and now houses more than 675,000 volumes, as well as millions of newspapers, broadsides, and graphics. McCorison, a 1950 graduate of Ripon College, received an M.A. in American history from the University of Vermont and an M.S. in library science from Columbia University. Among the numerous articles and publications McCorison has edited or written are Vermont Imprints, 1778-1820; The History of Printing in America by Isaiah Thomas; and The 1764 Catalogue of the Redwood Library Company in Newport, R. I. He has served as president of the Bibliographical Society of America, founding chair of the Independent Research Libraries Association, member of International and North American Committees of the Eighteenth Century Short Title Catalogue, and chair of the Preservation and Governance Committees of Research Libraries Group.

Honorary Degree Recipients continued

LIBERTY MHLANGA, who came to Clark from Zimbabwe, received a bachelor's degree from the University in 1965 and a master of arts in education the following year. After earning a doctorate from Columbia Teacher's College, he joined the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment and helped draft the framework for the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP). When he returned to Africa, he became codirector of the Environmental Training Program, which conducted research and training on environment and development in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. For the past ten years, Mhlanga has been the general manager of Zimbabwe's Agriculture and Rural Development Authority (ARDA), Africa's largest food producing corporation. Mhlanga manages, at a profit, thirty large farms and more than 25,000 employees. He is also founder and chair of the board of Environment and Development Activities (ENDA) and chair of the board of the Zimbabwe Development Bank. One of the leading environmental practitioners in Africa, Mhlanga recently became assistant chair of the board of the National Trust of Zimbabwe, which is developing a territory the size of Rhode Island into an ecologically sound settlement, recreation area, and income-generating enterprise.
