Last week, Dr. Stefano Tijerina presented his paper "Removing Blinders through Business History: Teaching Students to see the World from the Lens of their Economic Bloc" at the Business History Conference in Detroit, MI. Click here to view the abstract.

Publications

Dr. Manuel Wörsdörfer's paper "Louis Brandeis - Founding Father of Modern-Day Antitrust" has been accepted for publication in the *History of Economic Thought and Policy* journal. The paper takes a closer look at the life and work of Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis and analyzes his socio-economic and legal philosophy from a history of economic thought perspective. The paper also addresses the question of which



lessons can be drawn from his work and how it could inspire today's political discourses in general and the big tech and antitrust debate in particular.

Dr. <u>Billy Obenauer</u> had his paper "More on why Lakisha and Jamal didn't get interviews: Extending previous findings through a reproducibility study" accepted for publication in the *Journal of Management Scientific Reports*. Through a reanalysis of data from Bertrand and Mullainathan's seminal research study, Dr. Obenauer demonstrates that discriminatory effects were stronger in conditions in which a job



posting's experience requirements were ambiguous and that applicants with first names of Arabic origin experienced higher levels of discrimination than applicants with other non-White-sounding names. The paper offers important insights for HR managers while also providing guidance for developing
