Introduction

The University of Dayton sponsored and hosted the 1978 Ohio Shakespeare Conference the weekend of March 10th and 11th, 1978. Participants at the 1977 Ohio Shakespeare Conference—chaired by Professor Robert Fleissner, Central State University (Wilberforce)—selected the University of Dayton for the 1978 meeting. A steering committee quickly decided to build on one of the Central State meeting's finest features, the opportunity to see and discuss Grigori Kozintsev's film, King Lear. Thus the title of the 1978 meeting: "Shakespeare in Performance: Focus on Macbeth."

This issue of the *University of Dayton Review* now makes available to the larger academic community the proceedings and papers of the 1978 Ohio Shakespeare Conference so that the fruits of the conference can be shared among people who could not be present. The contents of this issue follow the order of the program. Only one conference contribution is missing, for Professor Joan Larsen Klein's paper, "Lady Macbeth: 'Infirm of Purpose,'" had already been promised for publication in *The Woman's Part: Feminist Criticism of Shakespeare*, ed. Carolyn Lenz, Carol Neely, and Gayle Greene, to be published by the University of Illinois Press.

While all of the papers here relate to Macbeth, only a few do not touch, in one way or another, on film versions of Shakespeare's play, chiefly the three shown during the conference: Roman Polanski's Macbeth (1971), Orson Welles' Macbeth (1948), and Akira Kurosawa's Throne of Blood (1957). Two of the papers were originally speeches delivered at the conference by the two distinguished Shakespeare scholars who were the featured guests of the conference: Professors Jack J. Jorgens and Robert Ornstein. Their speeches were taped and transcribed, and each graciously agreed to edit and revise those transcriptions for publication here.

The success of the conference (in part manifested in the success of its heirs, a 1979 meeting at the University of Toledo chaired by Professor Michael Manheim and a 1980 meeting at the University of Akron chaired by Professor Robert P. Merrix) is attributable in large measure to the diligent work, financial assistance, and other generous support of many people, including, notably, the University of Dayton English department and its chairman, Professor Michael Means; U.D.'s Associate Dean for Humanities, Dr. Rocco Donatelli; U.D.'s Dean of Graduate Studies, Dr. George Noland; and U.D.'s Vice-President for Academic Affairs and Provost, Brother Joseph Stander, S.M. Professor Robert Conard (Languages), the editor of the *University of Dayton Review*, has provided steady help seeing this issue through publication, continuing the work of his predecessor, Professor Lawrence Ruff (English). The individual contributors have consistently demonstrated more patience and cooperation than they should have been asked to supply. To all of these people, as well as the conference steering committee, much gratitude is due.
